Why Denver Will Keep the Capital.

1. Denver is nearer a geographical center of the State than Pueblo, and is more practical and deserving than any other town or city in Colorado. Denver is the railroad, commercial, mining and money center of the West. It has been the head of the state, and the seat of government since Colorado was first a territory. The removal of the seat to any other point would be detrimental to every quarter of the state, and would be a direct loss of over \$300,000.
2. If the capital could possibly be located at Pueblo, even we of the "far-off San Juan" would hide our heads for shame, and humbly, yet earnestly pray that this section of Colorado be annexed to Utah, and when that backward step would be taken, we would grant that the Utes might return to the heart of Colorado and make it their home, for their permanent stay with us would be of less injury than the permanent location of Colorado's capital at Pueblo. Who would not then be ashamed of this great and growing state? If there is one spot in the state so unfit for the capital as Pueblo, it is only South Pueblo.
3. Over \$300,000 worth of property belonging to the state, which was donated for capital purposes several years ago, would revert to its original owners, who donated tracts of land to the state, provided the seat of government should remain at Denver. These possessions, belonging to Colorado, in which every true citizen should feel an interest, can now be sold for over \$300,000, and suitable grounds can be bought for less money, giving a large sum for the improvement and erection of state buildings upon the grounds. If the seat be removed this large sum of money will be lost by the state and the people who constitute its government, for the people would be compelled to refund and make up a greater amount to pay the expenses of removal and the purchase of grounds and cost of erecting buildings.
4. Pueblo's greed would cost the state many thousands of dollars more than Denver, and Pueblo would forever be a sore to the people, a howling distress, and our neighbor, Kansas, would form an "alliance offensive and defensive," and offer us the privilege of locating our capital at a more practical point upon Kansas domain.
The people of the San Juan will not be duped by Pueblo's howling pretense of friendship.
Rico is situated in the heart of the Dolores mining camp, in the new county of Dolores. This mining town and camp is a part of what is known as the Great San Juan Mining Region. Rico is distant from various points, viz:

MINING MENTION.

The coking ovens up the river, which are coking coal for the smelter have been put into new hands.
The contractors who have been burning charcoal for the Grand View company, delivered the last of the coal this week and it is safely housed.
Hesse Musgrave is still working the Evergreen, and outsiders say that the mine is looking well. He has worked on this mine incessantly for many months and deserves success.
Trew Hayes is the fortunate owner of one of the best coal banks in this vicinity. It is located about 8 1/2 miles up the Dolores and shows 30 inches of good, clean coal, free from dirt or slate. Its appearance is that of coal which will burn well.
The Caledonia, in Horse gulch, is being worked by Messrs. Riley and Letts, who are running a drift for the owners of the mine, who are B. F. Klee and others. So soon as they finish their present contract they have a contract to sink 40 feet on the Rico.
A strike of free gold is reported in the Hoosier Girl, on Expectation mountain, about 450 feet above the Puzzle. This mine is on the same vein as the Colorado Boy, in which free gold in small quantities was found over a year ago. Assays of \$500 per ton were had this week from some of the mineral in the Hoosier Girl.
By the Democratic county convention of Dolores county, be it
Resolved, That the increase of population and the location of mining and other claims upon the public domain of the United States—the great majority of which claims will in time be patented by the government—in the San Juan country of Colorado, require that a land office should at once be located at some point of Southwestern Colorado, more convenient to the various mining camps, and the whole southwestern portion of the State than Lake City.
Resolved, That as a large per cent of the mining claims in and around Rico—and in fact every other camp in the San Juan—is owned by non-residents of Colorado, foreign companies, etc., and for this and other reasons, all controversies over said claims are liable to be transferred to the United States court, thus entailing endless expense and costs upon litigants of limited means from procuring the attendance of necessary witnesses, therefore,
Resolved, That in the name of justice and fairness and of economy of time and money, Congress should at once, at its next session in December next, make provision for holding a term of the United States court at some point convenient to the whole San Juan country.
Resolved, That we earnestly request neighboring camps and counties to give some similar expression of their views on these important subjects, and that our honorable Senators and Representatives in Congress be requested to consider these matters and to use their official votes and influence in order that early justice may be done to the people of Southwestern Colorado.
Resolved, That unless some other better point can be named we would suggest the city of Durango, in La Plata county, as the place most suitable and convenient for said Land Office for the district of San Juan, Dolores, La Plata, and the whole or a part of Conejo counties.
Resolved, That these resolutions be printed in the DOLORES NEWS in the minutes of said convention, and copies of the same forwarded to Mr. Lafe Pence, at Washington.
