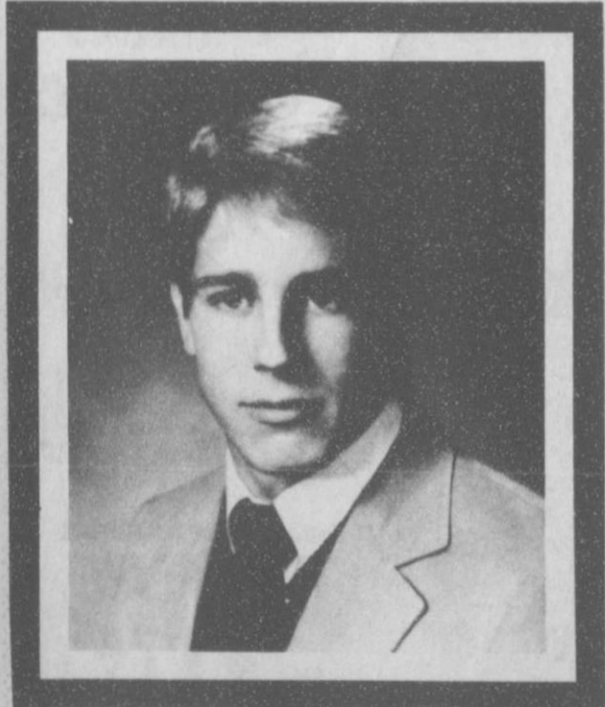
### Track Team Heads for Austin Thur.

### City May Fine Property Owner \$1,000 Per Day

At the regular City Commission meeting held last Thursday, the City Commission agreed that an effort must be made to clean-up the City. The period of May 19 until May 31 has been designated as a City Wide Cleanup.

Citizens are strongly urged to cleanup their properties in town. It is hoped that all citizens will get the weeds mowed on their property and rid their property of junk and junked vehicles.

After June 1, the City will begin enforcing the City Code as it applies to objectionable accumulations and

high weeds. Letters will be sent to those owners of property who are in violation of the City Code. A reasonable time will be given to cleanup the property. If the property is still not cleaned up the property owners will be brought to Municipal Court of answer to the charges where they can be fined up to \$1,000.00 per day for each violation.

This strong action comes after several citizens have met with the City Commission to discuss the problem with them.

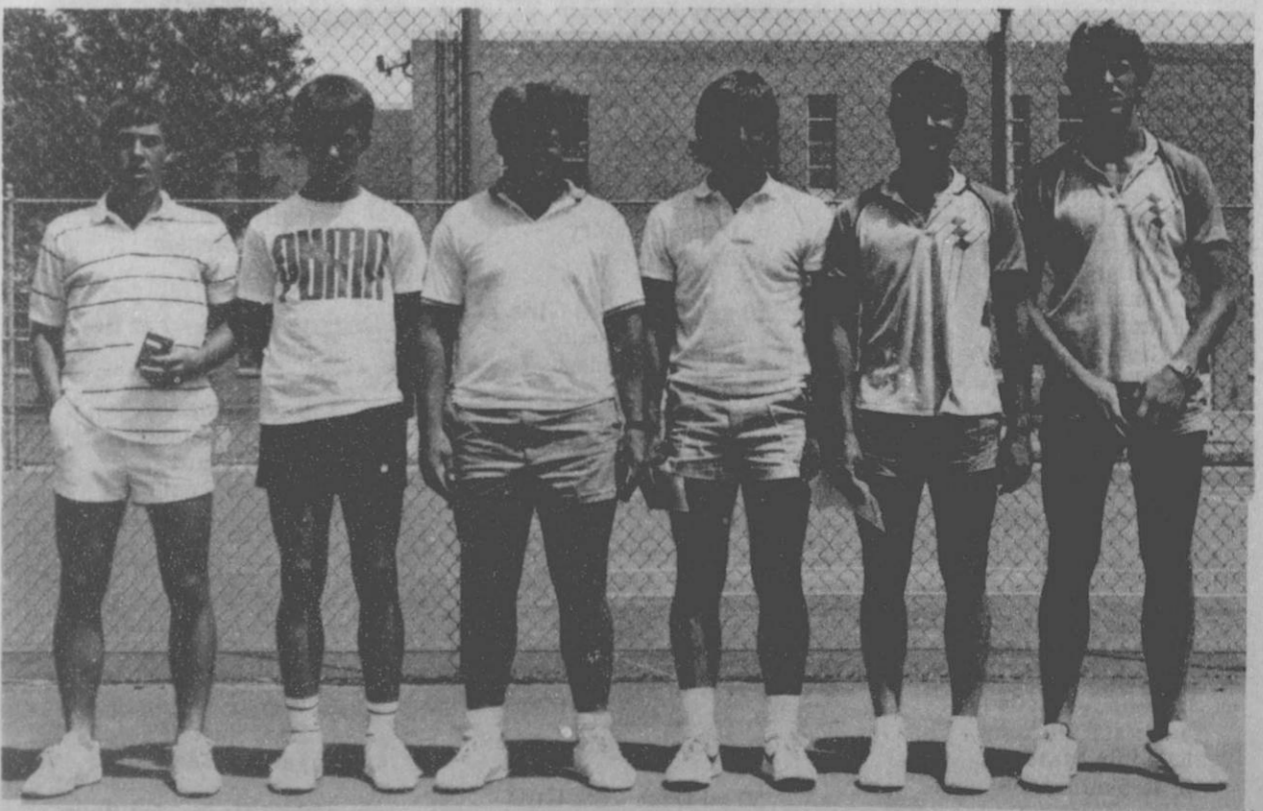



## Ranch life traded

At first, the half-finished two-story house on a dirt road west of Canyon appears an unlikely place for an artist. Cinder blocks lead to the ornate front door.

Western artist Roger Ayres, however, wouldn't be happy living any place but in the country. His wife, Beth - a native of Spearman - points out to first-time visitors that she can see the sun rise and set from opposite windows of her kitchen.

Ayres paints from his upstairs studio, framed by an expansive window that looks north over rolling pasture. Growing up on a farm/ranch near Gruver, the view is a comfortable one for him.

Three years ago Ayres gave up working the land and cattle "to get serious about my art."

Years of ranching in Texas, coupled with years working as a hired cowboy on a 20,000-acre ranch in Nebraska, have provided Ayres the impetus for his Western art.

"I have light years of paintings in me and I just can't get them out fast enough," said the tall, soft-spoken young man. "I usually have several paintings going at one time."

Ayres also is known for his custom-made bits and spurs, a skill he honed in Nebraska. "I made mine because it was cheaper and then other people wanted me to make them," he said. He makes the custom cowboy items "one piece at a time."

While the artist enjoys this sideline, his devotion lies with his painting.

"Most people push you away from art," he

...while some artists are renderers of 'disposable' art, I want to be known as a fine artist. I'm really not interested in being an artist just for the money."



said frankly. "But even if I had never sold a painting, I would still have to paint."

The 28-year-old artist is gradually using his brush to carve his niche in the art world, however, gaining recognition in New Mexico and Texas.

Last year Ayres was chosen from numerous applicants from throughout the country to be among 18 artists accepted to a workshop at Kerrville conducted by artist Joe Beeler of Sedona, Ariz. The Canyon artist applied to a second workshop by Gary Carter of West Yellowstone, Mont., and was accepted to that gathering also.

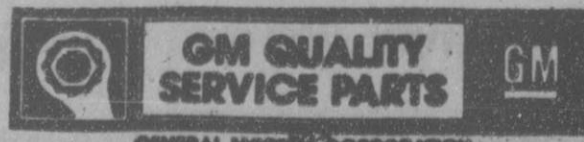
