Kelton, 24-2 for the season, was paced by Teresa Moore with 12 points and Michele Keelin with 10 points. The Victory moved Kelton into the area round of the playoffs.

Gruver, which ended its season at 18-7 was led by Anne Potts with 16 points, and Sharon Reynolds with 12 points.

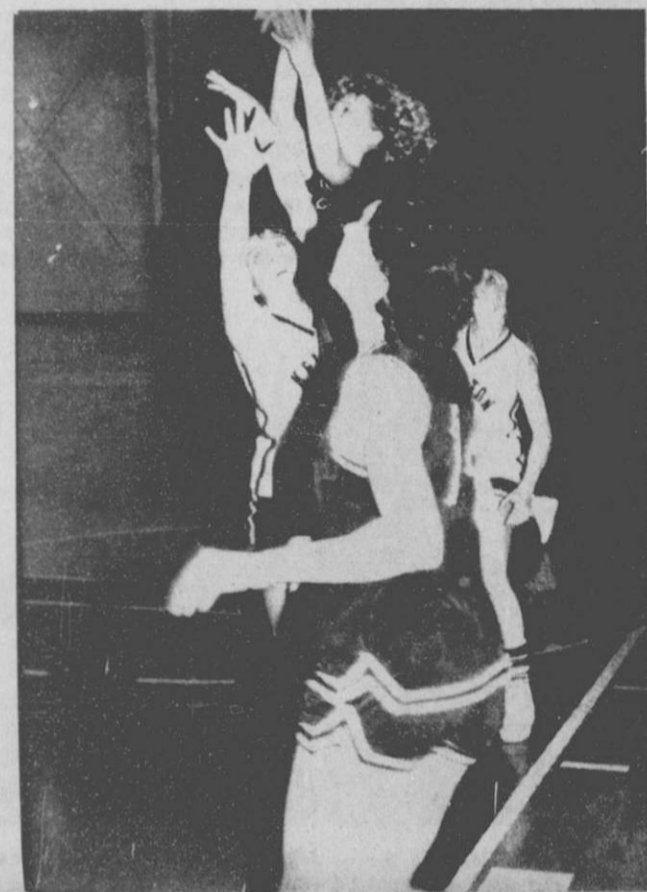

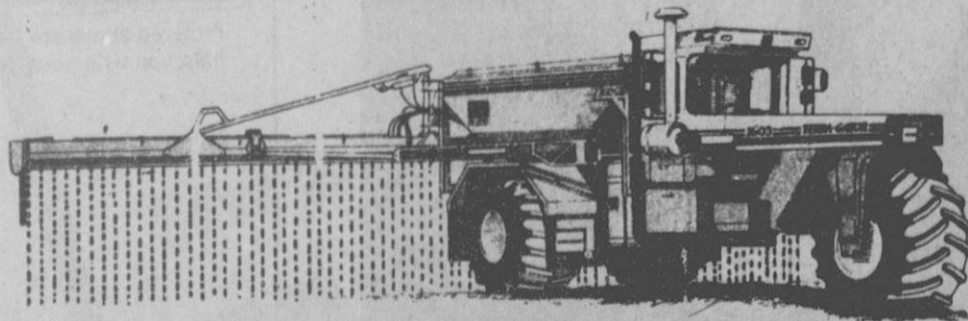

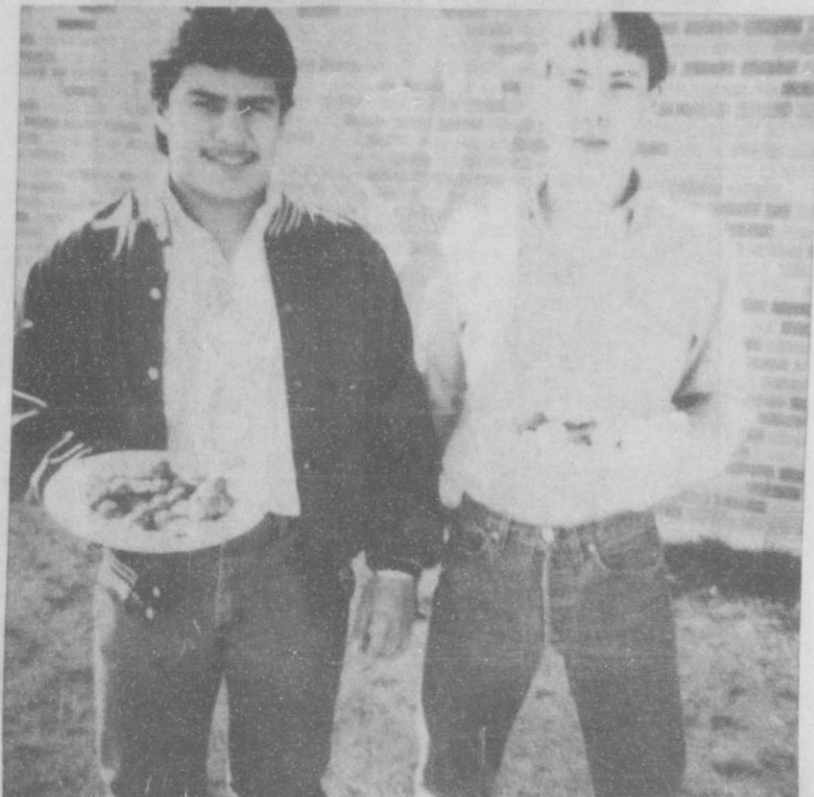

# Student teachers in four state area

Panhandle State University will place forty-nine student teachers in elementary and high schools in the four state area. Their assignments will begin on February 17. This directed observation in student teaching is designed to give each prospective teacher practical experience in actual classroom instruction on the appropriate level under the guidance of a skilled supervising teacher.

In addition to actual teaching experience, conferences are conducted each week for those students doing practice teaching in the area elementary and secondary schools. Practical problems arising in the student teaching situation are discussed at the conferences as well as the general problems relating to the teaching profession.

The practice teachers, their teaching assignment, and their subject are: Dawn Bridges, business education; Lisa Chadwick and Vicki Cleland, HPER; Diane Phillips, LaDona Powers, and Yvonne Sims, elementary, in Goodwell.

Those PSU student teachers doing their practice teaching in Guymon include: Alicia Austin and Holly Hansen, HPER; Diann Huddleston, natural science; and Steve Land, industrial arts. Also assigned to schools in Guymon are: Mark Makeever and Ruth Ann Ogden, HPER; Kimberlie Parker, social studies; and Ron Smith, industrial arts.

Student teachers assigned in the elementary grades in Guymon include: Karen Bergner, Marva Burnham, Cathy Evans, and Glenna Faulkner. Also practice teaching in elementary areas are: Nadine Gift, Judy Land, Pepper Mason, and Karla Stone.

Four students will be doing practice teaching in the Hooker school system. Manuel Acosta will be in the area of HPER; Stewart Hendrickson, industrial arts; Melinda Holder, Ridenour, HPER.

Adam Potter has been assigned to Hardesty and Gary Kirk will be in Tyrone. Both will be teaching HPER.

Students doing their practice teaching in Beaver County are: Terry Harland, vocational agriculture in Balko, and Mary Hardesty, mathematics, in Beaver.

John Powers will practice teach in natural science in Boise City and Alice Overman will practice teach mathematics in Keyes.

Also teaching in Oklahoma are Brent McDonald who will go to Laverne and G.R. Maixner to Okseene. Both will teach vocational agriculture.

Students doing practice teaching in Southwestern Kansas include Sue Omo, Hugoton, and Anna Dobie, Moscow, both in elementary; and Amy Mosburg, Liberal, vocational home economics.

Eleven students have been assigned to schools in the Texas Panhandle. Patsy Hout will teach elementary in Booker; Tana Brown will teach elementary in Dalhart; and Jim Burks will teach HPER in Dimmitt.

Hayley Hatton, Linda Lamle, and James Hamrick will be going to Gruver where Hatton will teach elementary; Lamle, vocational home economics; and Hamrick, HPER.

Practice teachers in Perryton include: Joyce Durham, computer science; Wendy Gore, music; Patricia Neel, elementary; and Carolyn Taylor, Vocal music.

Also practice teaching in the Texas Panhandle will be Barbara Haile who will teach English in Stratford. Dinah Navarette will go to Hoehne, Colorado to do her practice teaching in the area of HPER.

In early April, the forty-nine practice teachers will attend a one day seminar on the PSU campus then return to their teaching assignments until May 9. A final seminar will be held at PSU on May 12.

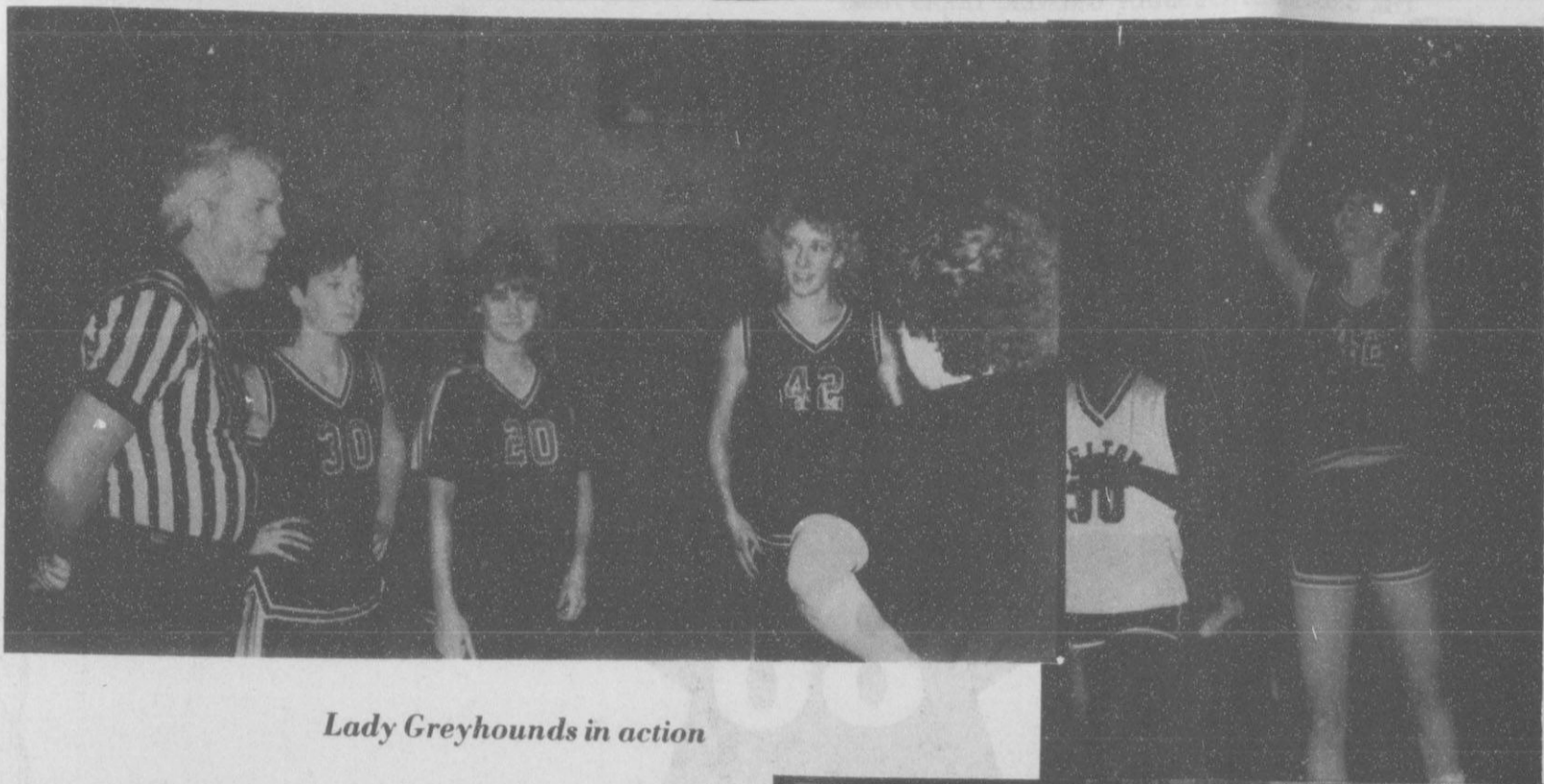

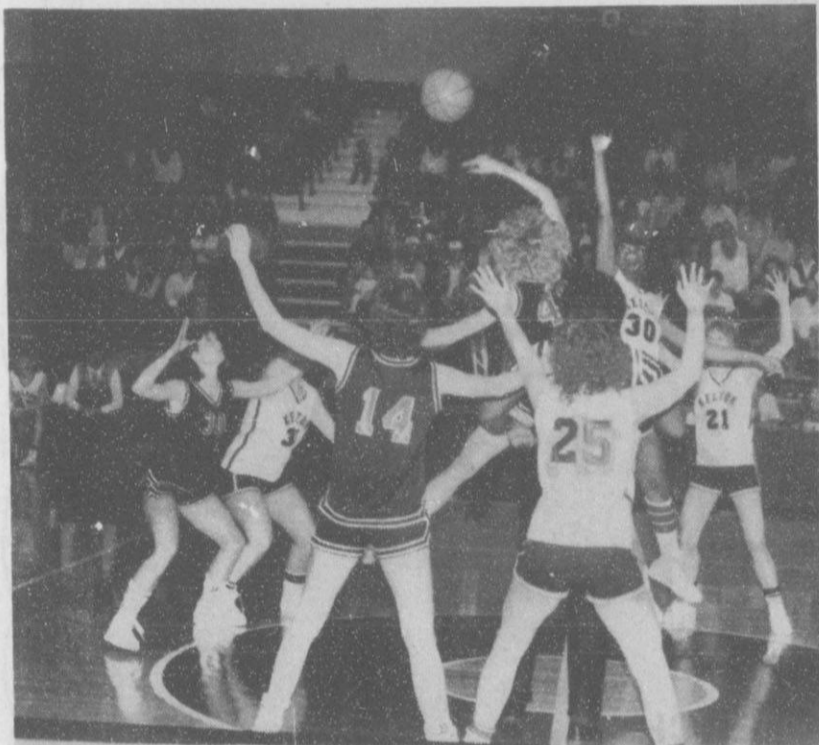

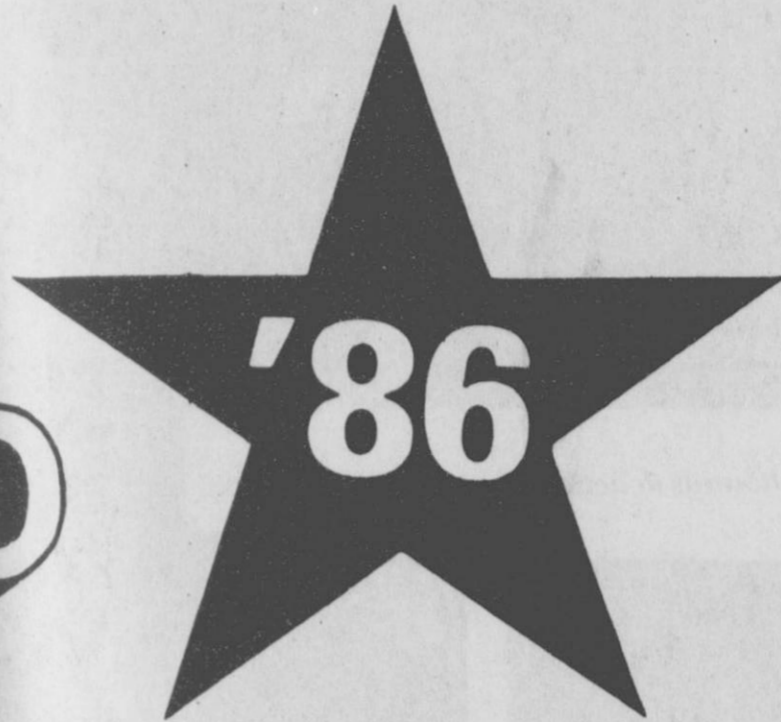
