In 1956 when Autry retired from show business, Buttram took stock of his career and entered the wide open circuit of after dinner speakers. He was great and is always busy hosting such things as the Friars, Masquers and Lambs Clubs when they meet to "Roast" one of their members. He has a delightful way of combining a sophisticated, pointed sense of humor with a genuine country boy charm.

At a dinner for Milton Berle, Pat poked fun by pointing out that "Berle had recently switched from comedy to drama. Unfortunately it happened while he was still doing comedy."

Of Hollywood, "I am proud to say that Hollywood has a heart. In Hollywood, if you need sympathy, love, affection, money or friendship, all you have to do is look in the Yellow Pages, under pool halls."

Pat Buttram lives with his wife and daughter on a small ranch in Southern California. He is a hobbyist and collects among other things, button hooks. He is said to have one of the largest collections in the world.

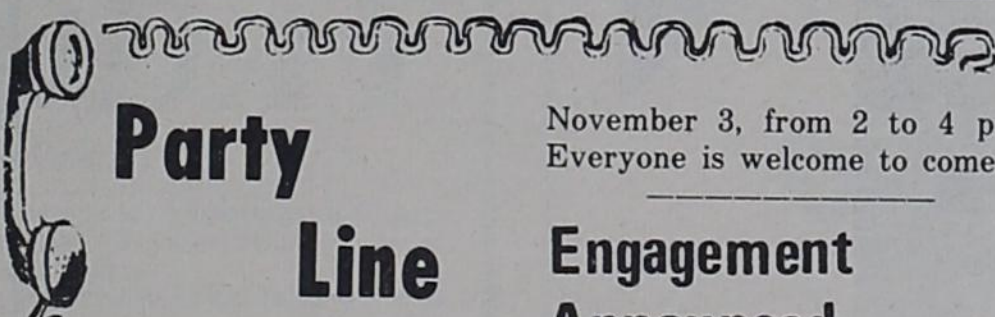

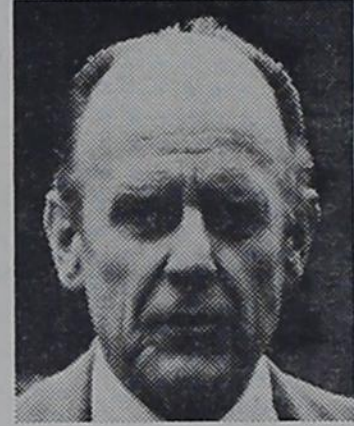

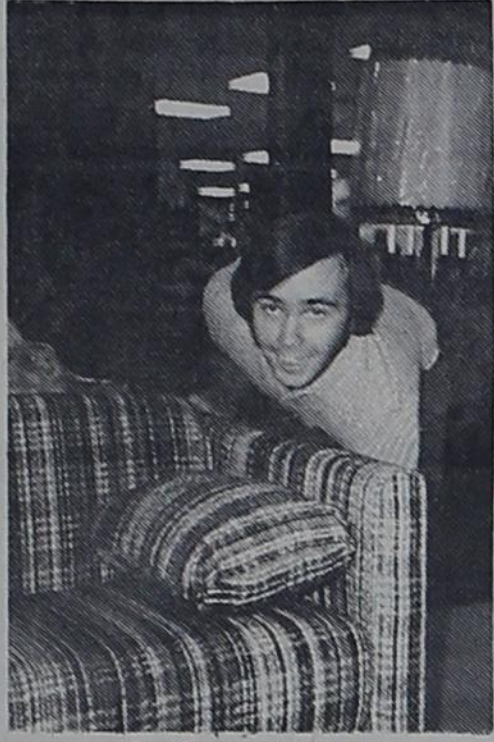

#### Taking Your Picture

... Jesus, perceiving the thought of their heart. . . Luke 9:47

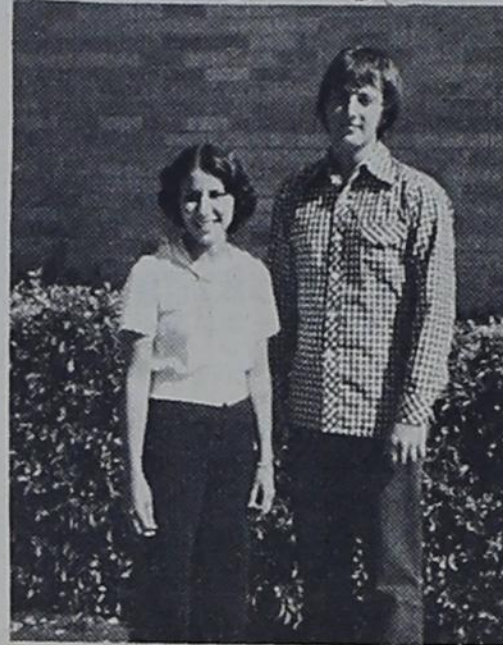
For those of you who like to eat a good hot meal before a football game, here's your chance. Friday, November 1, you can get a hot meal plus you can help support our local FHA Chapter.

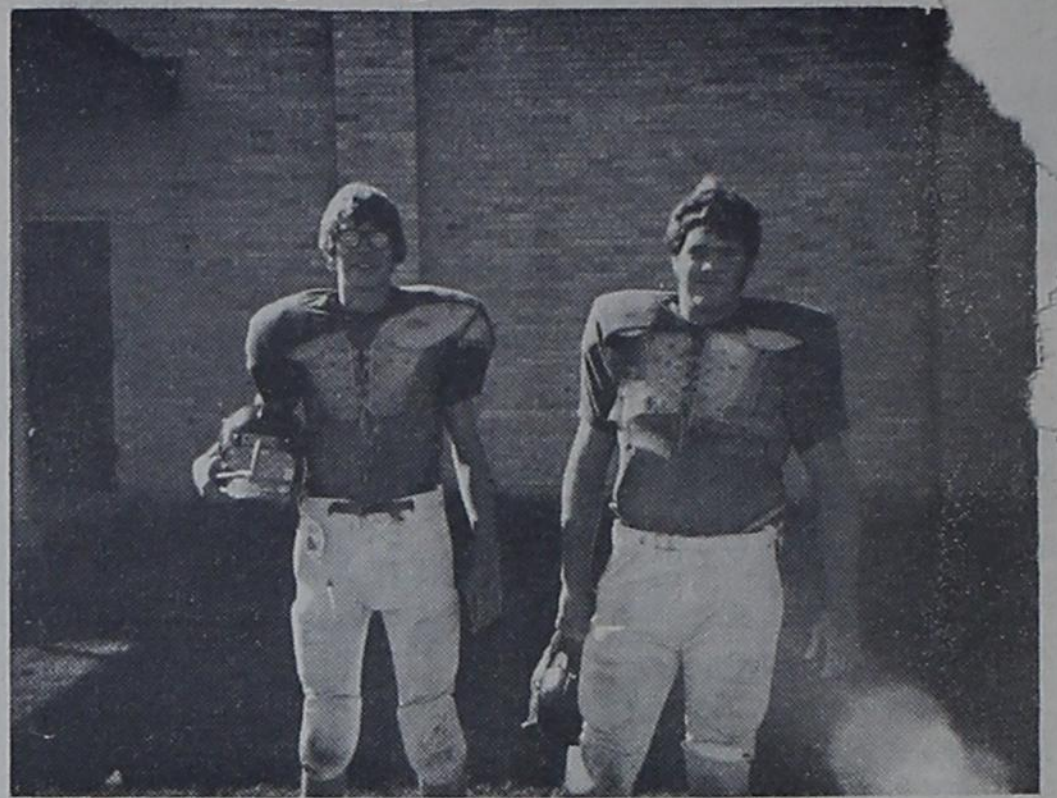

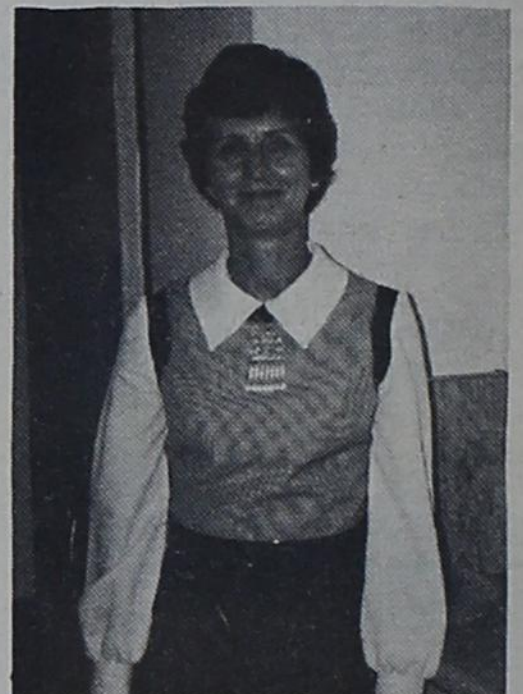
