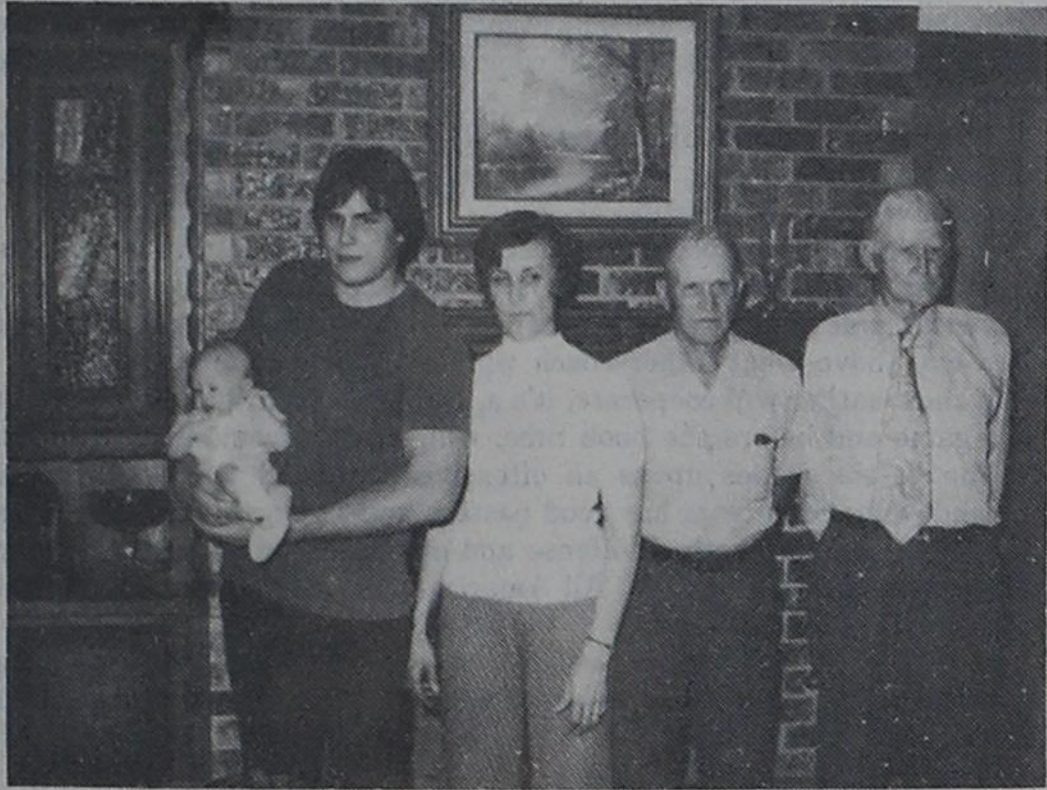


Family Reunion Staged

Ruth Kulm Appointed Coordinator for Bicentennial Youth Debates

The Bicentennial Youth Debates has announced the appointment of Ruth E. Kulm as District Coordinator for eight Texas schools, according to John Crain, Regional Director.

The Bicentennial Youth Debates (BYD) is a federally funded Bicentennial project administered by the Speech Communication Association through a grant from the National Endowment for Humanities.

The purpose for BYD is to involve every young person in a celebration of the Bicentennial of the American Revolution. The vehicle for this celebration will be Lincoln-Douglas debate, extem-



poraneous speaking, and persuasive speaking.

Each participant will be involved in an examination of the history and values that have combined to form the unique American heritage.

As District Coordinator for the BYD, Kulm will be in a position to improve the local Bicentennial Commemoration and the emphasis the community places on debate and on history. She will have responsibilities ranging from soliciting participation from the schools in her District which includes Shallowater, Wellman, Smyer, Sundown, Plains, Ropes, Pep, and Morton High Schools to administering the District Tournament which will take place in November and December.

Kulm, who is head of the English Department at Shallowater High School, received her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Alaska in 1942 and furthered her education with graduate study at Texas Tech University. She is presently a member of the National Education Association and the Texas State Teachers Association.

Recently Kulm affirmed the values of debate and the BYD program: "Communication is a vital part of our society; debate is a part of communication. It is a form of communicating that develops one's skills in the use of reasoning and logic, and it enables one to see that every issue has more than one side."

"The Bicentennial Youth Debates will give the participants a better understanding and appreciation of our great country, its government, its leaders, and its people. In addition, all those who work with them and all those who in their audiences will benefit."

Weather Watch Awareness Program Held Monday Night

Hey! The temperature says 95 and it feels it, too. In the mountains, you say? My, that is hot. It would be, too, but as much as I hate to admit it, this column is being written before I go to Washington and Saranac Lake.

With the conference activities and all, there won't be time to write from the Nation's Capitol. Instead, this will fill up space. But the next scribbblings will be from the mountains.

Two days until the All America game and I'd bet that this was one of the best games, if not the best. There's a great lineup of talent, with strong quarterbacks on both teams.

Much of the talent isn't too well known in the Southwest Conference area, but the credentials are impressive. So is the fact that so many were picked high by the pros. When it comes to choosing talent, the pros are paid to be right.

The fact that Steve Sloan and Grant Teaff are the opposing coaches doesn't hurt the game, either. Both are young. Both are personable. Both have been successful.

It won't be a preview of future Tech-Baylor games, despite what some hope and think. Primarily this will be true because the coaches don't have the same freedoms as they do in the regular season. And the talent is a cut above what either coach will have during the season.

If the weather will cooperate, it's a lead pipe cinch that fans, both at the game and before the boob tube, will enjoy it from start to finish.

The battle shapes up as an offensive clash and fans like to see touchdowns. Each team has good passers and strong runners. Each has big, agile linemen, both on offense and defense. And while there is an absence of the "big" names, All America game fans have learned that they really aren't missed.

If the past holds true, this will have been a big week for the visiting players and AFCA coaches. Lubbock and West Texas have opened their doors, homes and hearts. There's been a lot of entertainment, along with the hard work on the field.

The dividends for Texas Tech and Lubbock are immense. The publicity couldn't be bought. Little by little, people no longer are asking, Lubbock? Where's that? It's a great tribute to this area that the game continues to be played here.

The other day, during the throes of our first 100 degree weather, I stopped off for a visit with Jim Reed. The former Tech basketball star—probably the greatest Raider cager of them all—is alive, well and doing great Brownfield.

We talked of many things, but much of it was basketball and Tech, Polk Robison, memorable games, players and a look at the future.

Jim agreed that probably the best Tech team was the 1953-1954 unit that went to Corvallis for the NCAA playoffs. Jim played in that loss to Santa Clara, a loss that should have been a win.

"We had a lead and they went into that zone," Jim said. "We had seen it before, but we hadn't worked on it in practice that week. We just didn't adjust."

That was the team that Polk said was so talented that he'd call a time out, diagram a play, and the Raiders would execute it like they had been practicing it for days.

And, when talking about personnel, Jim said that the most underrated player was Esten Blackmon. "He gave great leadership and he was double smart, too," he declared.

As for memorable games, one never to be forgotten was the NCAA playoff against SMU at Wichita, Kansas, when the Raiders were stripped of Reed and others. And SMU was led by the great Jim Krebbs.

But Harry Scaling, playing until he almost dropped of exhaustion, Ick Carpenter and the rest fought the Mustangs down to the wire before losing by one point.

"Yeah", Jim cracked, "that was a great team that SMU had, and if we'd been playing, we'd probably have lost by 40 points!"

Brother Browning and the Records and Historical Committee alerted the church that 1973 would be the First United Methodist Church's 50th anniversary. It took a year of hard work on the part of everyone to make this celebration a success in August, 1973.

In the Vacation Church School of 1972, the women discussed the need of repainting, and redecorating the interior of the church. This was very successfully accomplished under the leadership of Mrs. Hank Woodruff and Mrs. Wayne Oliver.

Other accomplishments Pastor Browning instituted and encouraged, was a come and go communion service on Christmas Eve each year, with most coming as a family group. The church hosted a prayer and Bible conference in the spring of 1973; a missionary conference each April starting in 1972 with many very inspiring foreign as well as home missionaries on program; the Holy Spirit Conference with Rev. David du Plessis (one of the most respected Pentecostal leaders of our day and recognized as one of the twelve outstanding religious leaders of the world), Rev. Ted Dotts, and Rev. Ed Robb; and annual revivals each year.

The Brownings expressed a need for more room in the parsonage. A building and study committee was appointed and after much research and work, the church was able to buy the A.E. Preston residence on 8th Street to be used as a parsonage.

Rev. Max Browning has been very active on the Volunteer Fire Department, Lions Club, has announced at the Little League games and at the Shallowater football games, and kept scores for the Little Dribblers.

Juanita always found her place in church, working with youth one year, taught Sunday School classes, and being an excellent cook, there was always delicious food brought to church dinners, and when there had been a death. It was always a guess as to who cooked it, as Max was a good cook too, and did the cooking for these dinners when she had to work extra long hours at White's Store. Juanita coached a Little Dribblers team.

We saw the girls grown from two pre-schoolers to one now a teenager. As the Brownings left this week, many in the church and also many outside the Methodist Church, expressed how they loved this family and how they would miss them.

We would like to say to this family, as Paul said to his many Christian friends, "Now the Lord of Peace himself give you peace always by all means. The Lord be with you all." II Thess. 3:16.

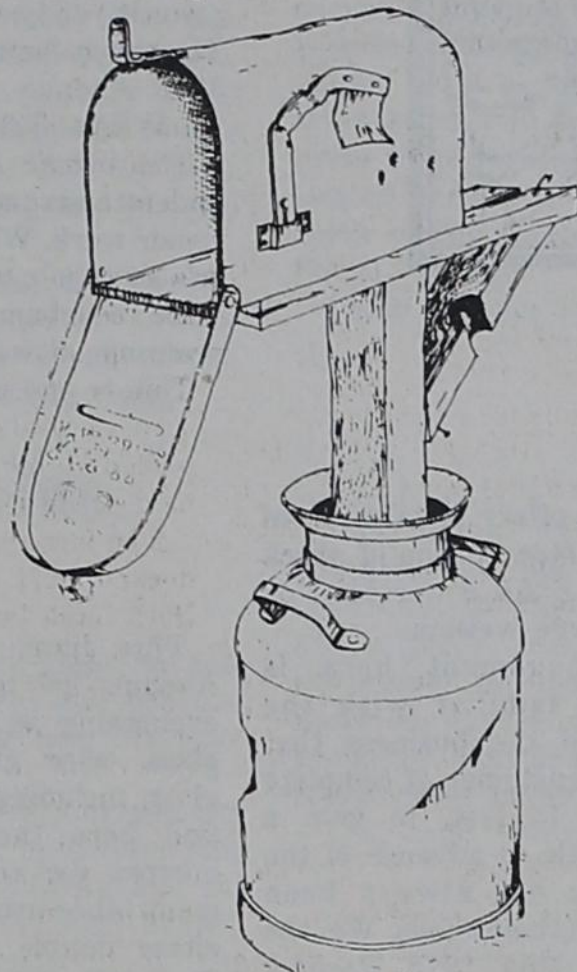

THE RURAL MAILBOX
Rural mailboxes then and now all looked pretty much alike. They were made of metal, had a round top and a door (if it hadn't been torn off) and a flag you raised if you wanted the postman to pick up your mail. The owner's name was usually

lettered, not too neatly, on the side of the box. Similarity of mailboxes stopped, however, with the stands on which they were placed. Each owner had his special idea about what looked good or was best for a mailbox stand. The cream can stand like the one shown was fairly common. Other things were used, such as a log chain with its links welded together, part of a porch post from the old torn-down homestead, trunks of trees growing in the right-of-way. Sometimes an outdated farm implement, such as a walking hand plow or an old buggy wheel would be used for the stand. People were proud of their mailboxes.

The rural mailbox was much more than just a place for the postman to deposit mail. It was a symbol signifying Rural Free Delivery — the privilege of receiving your mail on a regular basis near your home no matter where you lived. To someone living in a remote section of the country it was a vital link with other human beings, loved ones far away, acquaintances and kin.

Our mailbox was several hundred yards from the

house where our dusty lane met the main road. You could see it from the house, could tell if the postman stopped to deliver mail or not. You could see the cloud of dust a good while before his car actually came into view but you knew it was the postman because of the time of day. You could just about set your clock by his schedule. Often you would time your walk to the mailbox to get there just as the postman did. This way you could chat with him briefly to catch up on the news from town. If he went by without stopping, there was a mildly sad feeling inside that was sorta like being lonesome, like you had been forgotten. But each new day brought new hope, new anticipation.

What would he bring today? We haven't heard from Floy in quite a spell, could be a card from her. Maybe Ginny has written saying she'll bring the kids for a visit. Hope so. The new mail order catalog should be commin' any day now. Happiness and joy were sometimes left in the mailbox, sometimes sadness. A friend had passed away. Paula is expecting her first.

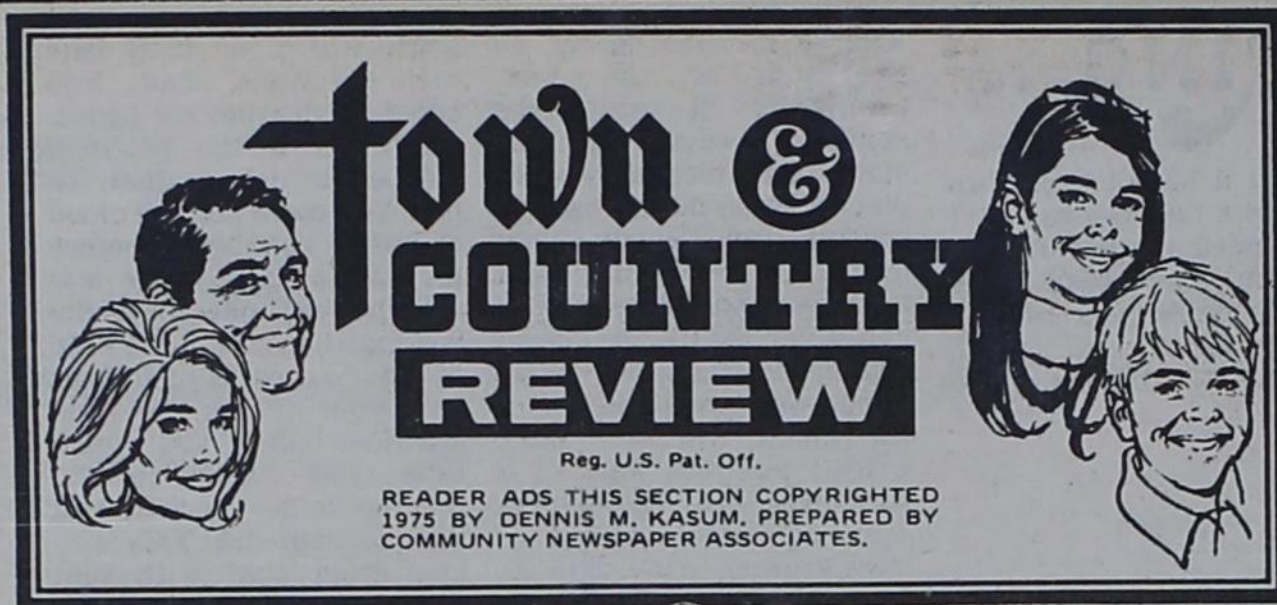

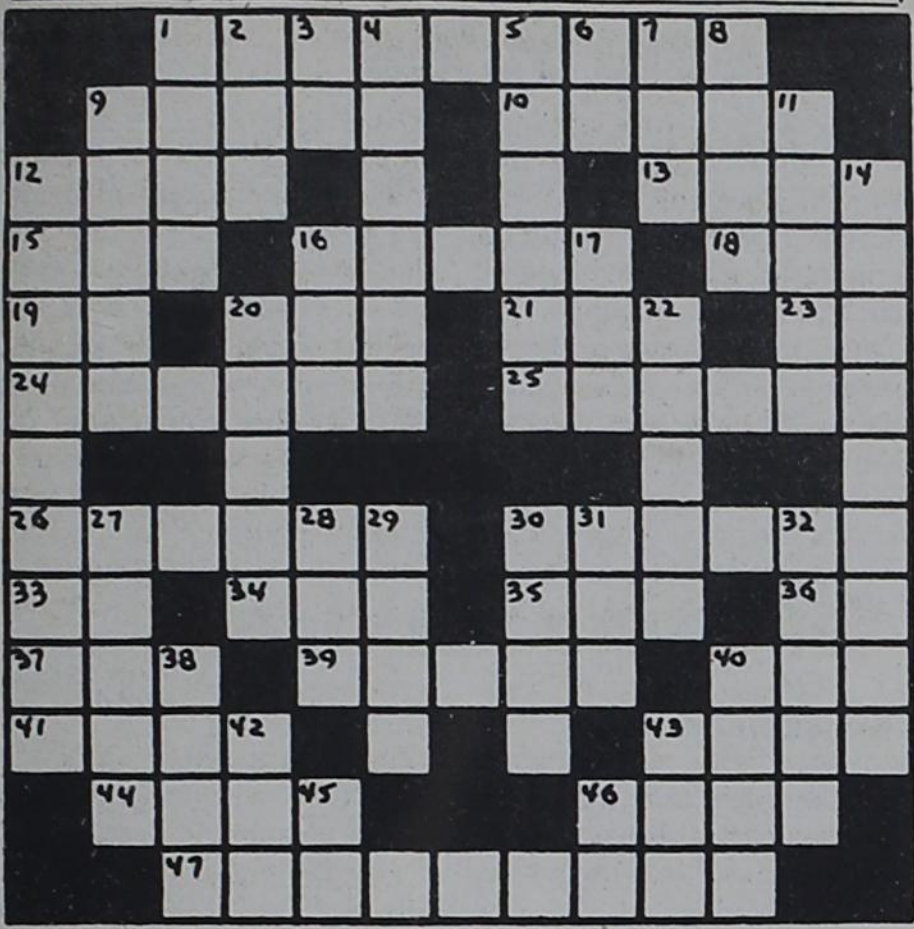

inches, and only when the grass shows symptoms of drouth stress. Mowing heights might also be raised one-half inch to improve drouth tolerance in mid-summer.

"Lack of nitrogen or iron often creates a lawn problem. Grass with a nitrogen deficiency may have a pale color and be heavily infested with weeds," explains the Texas A&M University System specialist. "Abundant seedheads are another symptom of nitrogen deficiency. A light application of a soluble nitrogen fertilizer will improve the lawn's appearance."

Grass leaves that have yellow and green stripes parallel to the leaf margins may be deficient in iron. An application of iron sulfate or iron chelate at six ounces per 1,000 square feet will usually solve this problem, says Duble.

If a St. Augustine lawn has symptoms similar to nitrogen or iron deficiency but does not respond to applications of either material, St. Augustine Decline (S.A.D.) should be suspected. Close examination of turf infected with S.A.D. shows green and yellow blotches on the leaves. Good maintenance practices should be continued where S.A.D. is a problem. Also, Floratam, a new St. Augustine grass variety which is resistant to S.A.D., may be sprigged into the infected area.

"Chinch bugs and white grubs are two insects that cause lawn problems," points out the specialist. "The symptoms are similar to that of drouth stress and insects should be identified prior to initiating chemical treatment."

Adult chinch bugs are about one-sixth inch long with black bodies and white wings folded over the back. To find chinch bugs, sink a can with both ends open into the ground and fill the can with water. The bugs will float to the surface in three to five minutes.

White grubs are the larval stage of the May or June beetle and are about one inch long with white bodies and dark heads. They are usually found in a curled or half-moon position several inches below the ground. White grubs can destroy the entire root system of lawn grasses so that the turf can be rolled like a carpet.

Chinch bugs can be controlled with applications of diazinon, Trithion, Ethion or Aspon and white grubs with chlordane or diazinon.

Brown patch disease is another problem with St. Augustine grass, adds Duble. The disease is caused by a fungus that attacks St. Augustine lawns each fall. Brown patch can be distinguished from drouth and chinch bug damage by the emergence of new growth in

the center of the diseased circle which gives the diseased area a doughnut shaped appearance. Brown patch should be treated with a fungicide when it first appears; several applications at 10-day intervals may be needed.

"The best way to keep a healthy, attractive lawn," advises Duble, "is through proper mowing, watering and fertilization. These regular maintenance practices allow you to keep a check on lawn conditions so that you'll be able to detect a problem early should one develop."

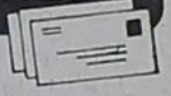

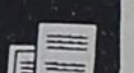

The weight of current evidence slightly favors a "gradual improvement" in cotton markets over the near-term, according to Donald Johnson, Executive Vice-President of Lubbock-based Plains Cotton Growers, Inc., and a number of factors point to substantially better markets over the next few years.

These were conclusions drawn by the High Plains cotton producer organization executive in a talk before the Board of Directors of the Texas Cotton Ginners Association at a meeting May 29 at Lubbock's South Park Inn.

"Based on the information we have been able to gather over the past week," Johnson said, "it is improbable that U.S. cotton plantings in 1975 will reach the 9.9 million acres indicated by USDA's March 1 planting intentions survey." Acreage is more likely to be around 9 million or a little above, Johnson stated.

Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas, plagued by excess rainfall during the planting season, are three of the states where cotton acreage may fall well below earlier expectations. In Mississippi, for example, where USDA on March 1 projected 1.2 million acres, informed sources now report that the total will be no more than 900,000 and could be somewhat less. Should Mississippi's cotton fall below 900,000 acres, it would be the smallest acreage in that state since 1866.

Along with low acreage Johnson cited generally late crops and far from ideal weather conditions to date as further indications that U.S. cotton production in 1975 may fall a million bales or more below an expected domestic and export combined offtake of around 10 million bales.

The projected 6 million bale carryover on August 1 of this year and currently slack demand would rule against a strong or sudden upsurge in prices this fall or early 1976, he continued, "but more unfavorable weather and/or a pickup in textile demand could change that picture very quickly."

On demand for textile products, Johnson said there are indications of an upturn, "but these are not yet firm enough nor convincing enough to put mills into any sustained buying mood."

For his long-range bullishness on Texas cotton, Johnson leans heavily on the movement of textile producing capacity to Texas and the Southwest.

"We are now at the point of significant industry development, particularly in the area of open-end spinning," he said, "and this will strengthen the position of Texas cotton both here and in the rest of the world."

Also on the plus side for cotton markets of the future, he cited the new cotton products coming on stream from research efforts of Cotton Incorporated and the feedstock price and supply problems of the manmade fiber industry.

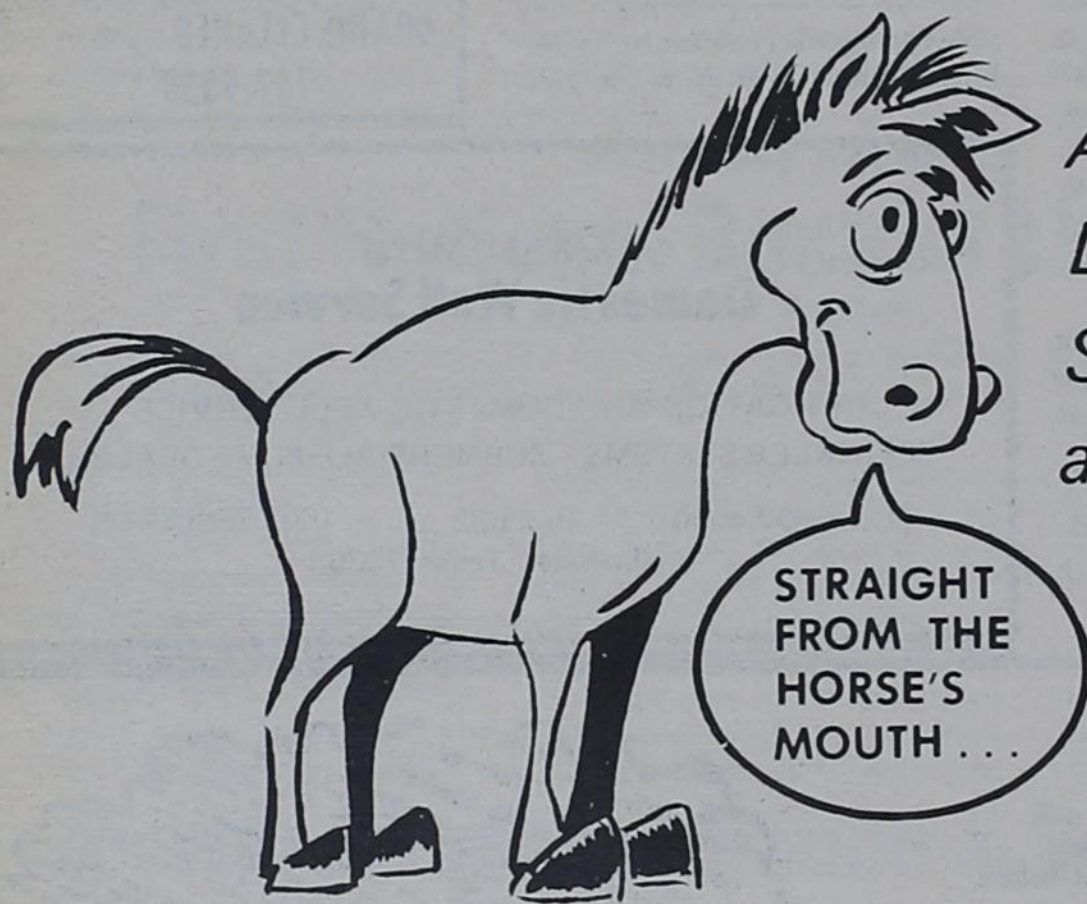
