NEW COUNTY-WIDE TAX BOARD TO BE ELECTED

Hall County Commissioners have voted to join with other taxing entities in the county in implementing the new state Property Tax Code, County Judge Lester Campbell has reported. The new tax code was made into law through Senate Bill 621, passed at the last session of the Texas Legislature.

Under the new law, Campbell explained, all taxing bodies in each county, except the county itself, were mandated to join together. A county had the option to remain out for two years, and then would be required to join the other entities. Local commissioners felt that the county should proceed with the other units of government now, and thereby be able to participate in the organization of the new taxing system.

The new law requires each county to have a district board of directors, made up of five members, the judge explained. This board of directors is to be elected by the governing boards of the taxing units involved. In Hall County those boards will be the commissioners court, the Memphis Independent School District board, the Estelline Independent School District board, the Lakeview Independent School District board, the Valley Independent School District board, the Memphis City Council, the Estelline City Council, the Lakeview City Council and the Turkey City Council.

Under the new Property Tax Code, these nine boards each nominate up to five candidates for the District Board of Directors. These candidates are then placed on a ballot by the Hall County Clerk. The ballot is submitted to the nine units and five directors are elected to the District Board of Directors by a formula set up in the Property Tax Code.

Governing bodies must submit their nominees, if they choose to nominate any, to the Hall County Clerk before October 15; the governing bodies then have until November 15 to cast their votes for the five directors.

Campbell stated that the five directors elected will serve two-year terms, and no director will receive pay for his services; they are entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, however.

The board of directors, it was explained, will then be in charge of the appraisal of property within the county. The board may contract with a professional appraiser, if desired, to handle these duties. In Hall County, property has not been totally re-appraised for many years. Since the new law calls for agricultural land to be appraised on productivity, instead of market value, it is believed that the re-appraisal will constitute a major task.

The board is charged with the approval of any appraisals. The board also appoints an "appraisal review board" of three members. This three-member team also have two-year

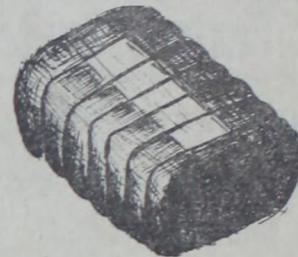

Parallel lines always converge at the same point on the horizon. If we stand in the center of a highway, and look straight ahead, we discover that the lanes seem to disappear at one central point. The artist must deal with this curious fact when he paints a canvas. We call it perspective. It is the way our eyes see the picture. If we stand at a different position, the scene changes, and the vanishing point is moved to a new place on the horizon. By changing our position we change our perspective.

This is true of life. How we look at our afflictions and our troubles is very largely determined by our inner attitude. In a very real way our ideas about God will determine our perspective.

The Church can help you to place all areas of life in balance. Many people today are confused and disturbed because they see things in the wrong perspective. Visit your church this Sunday and see if the world doesn't look better next week!

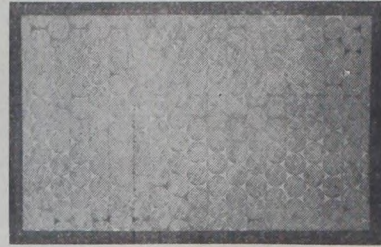

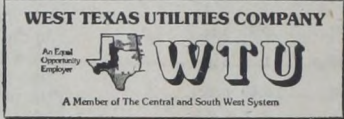
