George W. Miller, recently appointed 110th Judicial District Attorney, announced his candidacy for that office for the unexpired term in the forthcoming May Democratic Primary, stating:

They have two children, Karen, sixteen, and Pat, eleven, and are members of the First United Methodist Church. He is vice-president of the Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Rotary Club. He has been actively engaged in the law practice since 1955, except for two years while serving in the U. S. Navy.

## District Warfare Has Begun This Week

The Flomot Longhorns shot down defending champion Quitaque 50-10 at Flomot Tuesday and took dead aim at the district title for 1970.

The Quitaque Pantherettes, also defending district champions, got off to a successful start in defense of their crown by taking a 56-32 win over the Longhornettes.

The Pantherettes were in command in their contest all the way, leading Flomot 18-7 at the first stop, 34-13 at the half, and 46-24 at the end of three periods.

Flomot's Susie Gilbert won scoring honors for the night with 30 points. Janine Pigg added two points to the total.

For the Pantherettes, Jackie Cheatham hit for 27 for scoring honors for Quitaque. Glenna Ramsey canned a total of 17 points for runnerup honors; Wanda Ramsey scored 10 points; and Neva Dale Morrison, who switched from her guard position for awhile, dropped in one field goal for 2 points.

The boys game was close for one quarter, in fact the Panthers lead 12-11 at the end of the first period of play. The Longhorns, however, found the range in the second quarter and moved to a 27-20 half-time lead.

The Quitaque crew rallied in the early minutes of the third period and pulled to within two points, 27-29, but with the count at 27-30 the Longhorns went on to score 10 more points to the visitors none to lead 40-27 at the end of three periods. The Longhorns led by 18 points early in the fourth quarter but the Pantherettes managed to narrow the margin to the final 10 points.

Billy Green hit for 24 to spark the Longhorns' offense and to top all scoring in the boys contest and Alvia Calvert was next with 11 points and David Hunter hit for 6 points.

Perry Brunson with 13 points was high for Quitaque, with Stanley Price and Gary Chandler sharing runnerup honors with 10 points each. Scotty Stark hit for 5 points and Jerry Merrill scored 2 points.

Quitaque goes against tough Turkey Friday at Turkey. The Turkettes took a 13-point win over the Pantherettes in the Clarendon tournament. They have a strong team this season, with good height. The Panthers and Turks have not met this season, but they are getting better all the time. That one should be a good game too.

The Turkey teams have not

played a conference game yet.

Turkey played Silverton at Silverton Tuesday, with the Turks winning 44-33 and the Turkettes being edged by the Owlettes, 43-39 in a very close one. The Turkettes won over the Owlettes in their first meeting.

The girls game was a ding-dong battle all the way. Silverton led 10-7 at the end of the first quarter; 22-19 at half-time; and 32-30 at the end of three periods.

Sally Case scored 18 points for the Turkettes to lead in that department. Wood was high for Silverton with 21.

The Owls jumped into a 10-7 first quarter lead and the score was tied at 16-16 at intermission. The Turks took a 31-21 third period lead and were never headed from that point.

Mike King led the scoring for the Turks with 12.

## Highway Building Will Be Topic Of Discussion By State Commission

According to Judge M. G. Moreland, Briscoe County highway projects are due to be discussed in a hearing before the State Highway Commission on January 29.

The construction of a new highway from State Highway 70 south of Brice, up the Palo Duro Canyon to a point south of Claude, then into Palo Duro State Park will be discussed.

"I have my doubts as to whether this project will be approved at this time," Judge Moreland said.

The Judge said he has reason to believe that State Highway 86 from Silverton to the Caprock rim will be the next scene of highway improvement in the county. "This is on the work schedule, and we feel sure it will be done next summer," he added.

"We are always seeking more farm-to-market roads," Judge Moreland said, "and we have reason to believe that we will get about four additional miles this year." He concluded the announcement by adding that each of the highway projects mentioned would be of great value to the residents of Briscoe County.


