





## Shirttail Sermon

The text is found in St. Luke 16:19-31 and tells the story of two men, one of whom went to heaven and one to hell.

Many modern men, both laymen and clergymen, profess to disbelieve in hell. They give as the reason the fact that the Bible teaches that God is a loving Father and a loving Father would never condemn one of His children to such a fate.

These people are overlooking two things. First, God is a just God. If there is to be justice either in this world or the world to come there must be punishment for wrongdoing and reward for righteousness. Even the most loving earthly father must, at times, see to the discipline of his children. It often hurts deeply to mete out

punishment, but it must be done and the loving earthly father does it. The wise father tries to reason with his erring child in hopes of avoiding the necessity for punishment but this sometimes is to no avail. When he does have to punish the child, it is painful to the father as well as the child.

The second thing that is overlooked is the belief of Jesus in a literal hell. The parable used as text today points up that belief. It is at least implied in Jesus' warning of late priests that the publicans and harlots will enter heaven before they.

When the day comes for man to be judged, there will be three beings present: God, Satan, and Man. God and Satan will both be

desiring man's soul. Man himself will cast the deciding vote. He will have done this by his words and acts on earth. God will condemn no man. Man will condemn himself or be worthy of reward.
