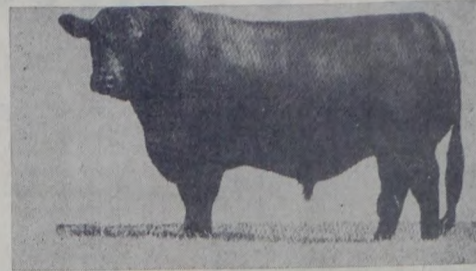

## Home Notes

Consumers, confronted with more than 20 choices of margarines in a supermarket, are wrestling with the question: are higher-priced margarines better than those selling for half their price? There is no simple yes or no, answers Gwendolyn Clyatt, Extension consumer marketing specialist at Texas A & M University. The more than 20 kinds of margarine fall into six types: regular, whipped, soft, premium, unsalted and low-calorie. Each contains 80 percent fat blended with milk or cream. Each is fortified with vitamin A and some with vitamin D. Other ingredients, such as salt, may be added to improve the product. The most common type is regular margarine. Generally it is made from soybean and cottonseed oil and costs less than the other types. Prices range from 30 cents a pound for national brands to 18 cents a pound for the store's private label brand. Regular margarines are all - pur-

### TREE TRIMMING

The prettiest Christmas tree looks its best only if it is properly trimmed. The number of lights used — whether too few or too many — affects the appearance of even the most perfect tree. Here's a formula used by professional lighting experts: Height of tree (in feet) x width of tree at base (in feet) x 3. It's not as complicated as it sounds. For example, if your tree is 6 feet high and 4 1/2 feet wide at the base; 3 x 4 1/2 x 3 equals 81 lights for a good lighting effect.

pose — may be used in cooking, baking, frying, and as a seasoning and for tablespread.

Inert gas is injected into whipped margarine to increase its volume. Six sticks are packed in the one - pound package. Pound for pound, whipped margarine has the same number of calories as nonwhipped margarine. On a volume basis—say stick for stick—whipped margarine has about 1/3 less calories.

Soft margarine's consistency is due to its high liquid oil content. Because of its softness it is packaged in 1/2-pound tubs. Higher liquid oil content of soft margarine alters the fat composition, giving it a higher proportion of polyunsaturated fat than regular margarine.

Premium margarines generally

are made from more expensive oils and cost more than regular margarines. They always must be refrigerated to protect their delicate flavor; this adds to their distribution costs. Premium margarines have the same all - purpose uses, but many people feel they have a plus in flavor.

Unsalted margarines are made without salt for people on special restricted diets and for those who

prefer an unsalted tablespread.

Low-calorie or diet spreads are labeled imitation margarine because they contain about half the 80 percent fat content of regular margarine. Therefore, imitation margarine has fewer calories than regular margarine. The ingredient listed first, and therefore present in the largest amount, is water. Imitation margarines are not recommended for baking or frying.

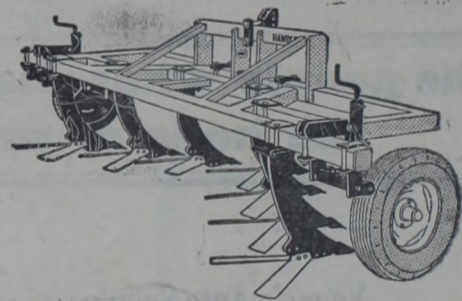

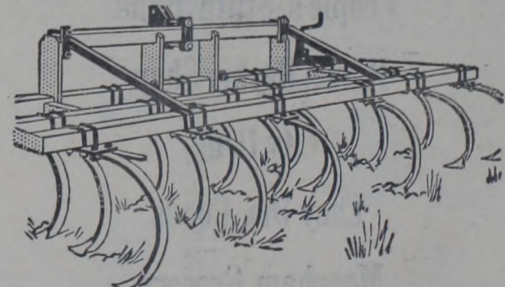

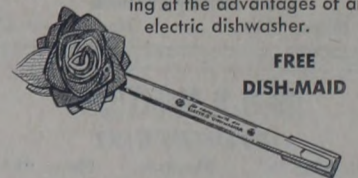
