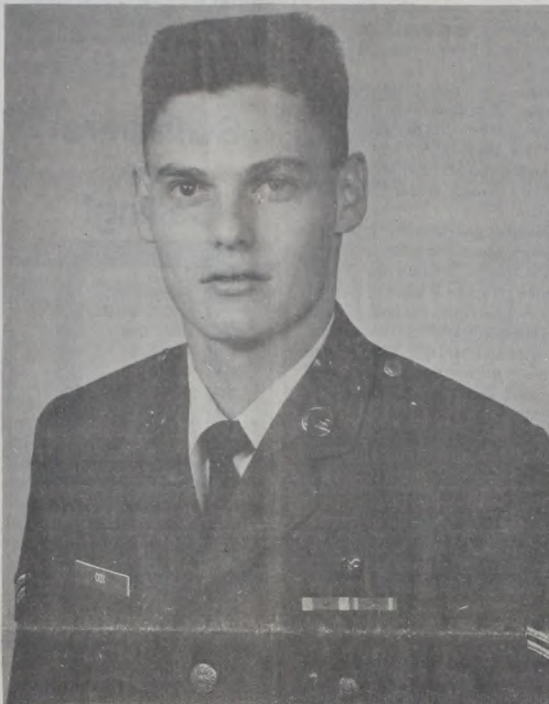

Airman Cox, a native of Quitaque, Texas, is a medical specialist assigned to Goodfellow Technical Training Center Clinic. He has been at Goodfellow since September 1989.

"Airman Cox commands a wealth of career knowledge and stands out as a talented professional," said Maj. John Kenney, chief of nursing services. "He projects an outstanding Air Force image--definitely recruiting poster material."

"In one of the comments, he was singled out as 'super friendly and shows a lot of caring and support for the patients,'" said Sgt. Luree Henderson, his supervisor. Many patients ask for him by name when they need a problem solved. He does all duties beyond any expectations, she said.

When Col. James Hooper, clinic commander, Colonel Maxwell and Chief Worth came up to congratulate him, he was overwhelmed. "I was shocked," he said. He felt he did pretty well in front of the board, but didn't expect he would win the title. "I felt I did it to the best of my ability."

"He was right in the middle of screening patients for their appointments when they all walked in. He got a real-scared look and turned pale. When they congratulated him, he was relieved. He breathed a lot easier after that.

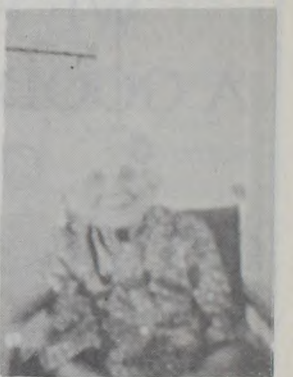
