Clyde Catholic Church Builds New Educational Building

CLYDE — St. Joachim Catholic Church has almost completed their new \$12,000 education building, just north of the present church. After completion, the building will provide space for recreation, church meetings, and religious training. The Catholic church in Clyde dates back to 1884 when a group of Portuguese emigrants settled in Callahan County. There was no church building at that time so church services were held in private homes. St. Bergman Catholic church was built in 1889 and was the first church to be built in Clyde. St. Bergman church was destroyed by a tornado in 1895. The church was rebuilt in the same year on the site of the destroyed church, and was renamed St. Joachim Catholic church. This building stood until 1962

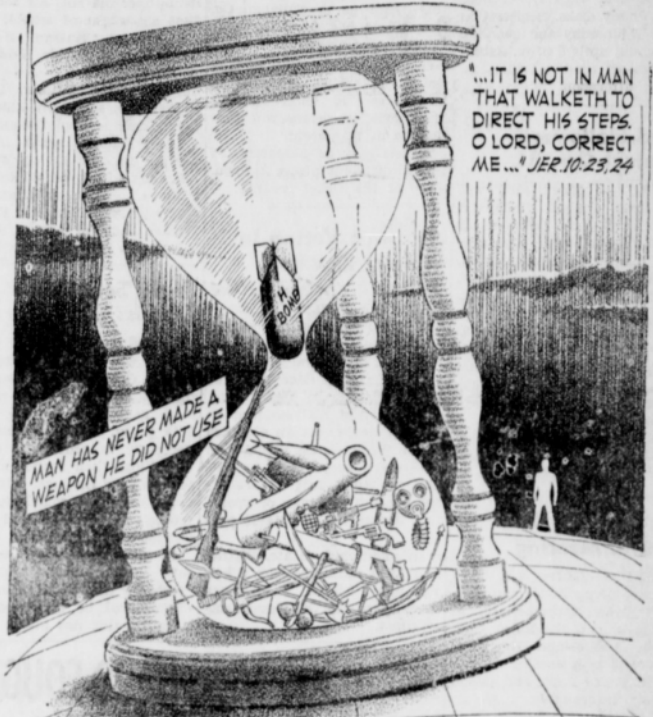

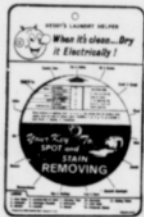
