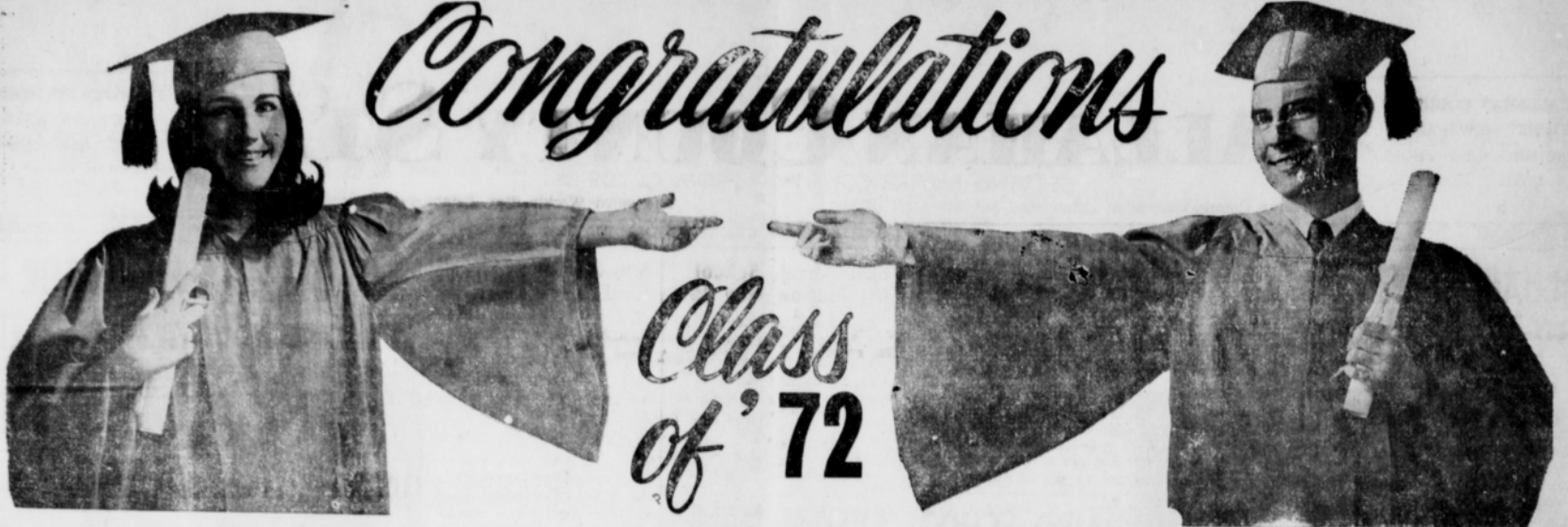

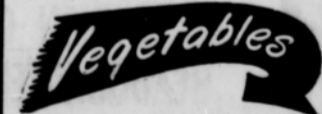

Decker Named Bond Committee of 12 FLB's

COLEMAN — Leslie Bryant, Manager of the Federal Land Bank Association of Coleman, received word recently that Herbert H. Decker, President of the Federal Land Bank of Houston, has been named Chairman of the Bond Committee of the 12 Federal Land Banks. This Committee is responsible for marketing the bonds which fund the lending operations of this nationwide farm credit system.

Last year the 12 banks loaned a total of 1.6 billion dollars and on Dec. 31, 1971 had over 400,000 loans outstanding for 7.9 billion dollars.

Federal Land Banks make mortgage loans on rural properties to farmers and ranchers, rural residents and persons furnishing to farmers and ranchers services directly related to their on-farm operating needs. The Houston Bank makes loans throughout Texas and currently has over 35,000 loans for more than 593 million dollars outstanding. Bryant stated that the local association makes and services loans in Callahan and Coleman counties, and at the present time has 765 loans outstanding for approximately \$8,000,000.00.

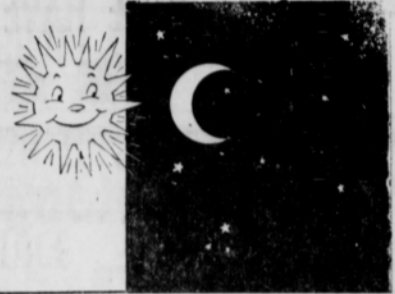
