## Downtown Baird Businesses Burglarized Sunday Morning

Four downtown businesses were burglarized sometime Sunday morning between 12:00 p.m. and 4:30 a.m. The businesses victimized were The Prescription Shop, The Callahan County Star, G G's Gift Shop, and Eddie Konzack's. The only business suffering loss in the burglary was the Prescription Shop, where approximately \$2500 worth of class 2 (narcotics) drugs, about 11 electric wrist watches, and 12 zippo lighters.

The roofs of the Callahan County Star and Eddie Konzack's were damaged but entrance was not made. G G's Gift Shop was entered along with the Prescription Shop but nothing was taken. Both buildings were entered through the skylight.

Sheriff Skinner said that the burglars were definitely not beginners, they knew what they were looking for. Skinner estimates that there were at least two burglars if not more and that it appears that they used a wrecking bar or tire bar to

make their entrance. The Sheriff's Dept. has no leads as of yet, but they have requested that if any one sees or knows of any information leading to the arrest or retainment of merchandise, to please contact the Sheriff's Dept. immediately.

In other police business, a male subject Wendell Lee Salee, of Rt., Albany, Tx., was arrested and charged with felony burglary of a residence in Cottonwood. Salee was caught with the merchandise in his possession. He was charged then released on 5,000 bond.

Sunday morning, around 3-3:30 a.m., a 19 yr. old youth, David Wayne Hyer, of Rt. 1, Clyde was shot in the Eula Community by an unknown gunman. Hyer was shot with a 22 caliber rifle. The bullet penetrated 6 inches above the ankle then exited, hitting no bone. He was treated at Hendrick Hospital in Abilene then released. No charges have been filed in that shooting.

## Elementary-Jr. High School Pre-Registration Aug. 11 - 12

Last week, the Callahan County Star stated that elementary & Jr. High students were to register Aug. 1-8. We were wrong.

All students in grades on through eight who will be attending the Baird schools this year are to pre-register on Monday Aug. 11 or Tues. Aug. 12. The office will be open from 7:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. each of those days for the convenience of parents who will be registering their children. If students have had recent immunizations, registration would be a good time for us to up-date your school immunization record. Immunization requirements for students entering school for the first time are as follows: POLIO - At least three

doses of oral polio vaccine, provided at least one dose has been received on or after the fourth birthday.

**TETANUS - DIPHTHERIA** - At least three doses of DPT and/or TD vaccines are required, provided at least one dose has been received on or after the fourth birthday.

**MEASLES** - Measles vaccine is required on or after the first birthday. A History of measles illness may be accepted if validated in writing by a physician.

**MUMPS** - Mumps vaccine is required. A history of mumps illness will be accepted in lieu of mumps vaccine if it has been validated in writing by a physician.

**RUBELLA** - One dose of rubella vaccine is required.

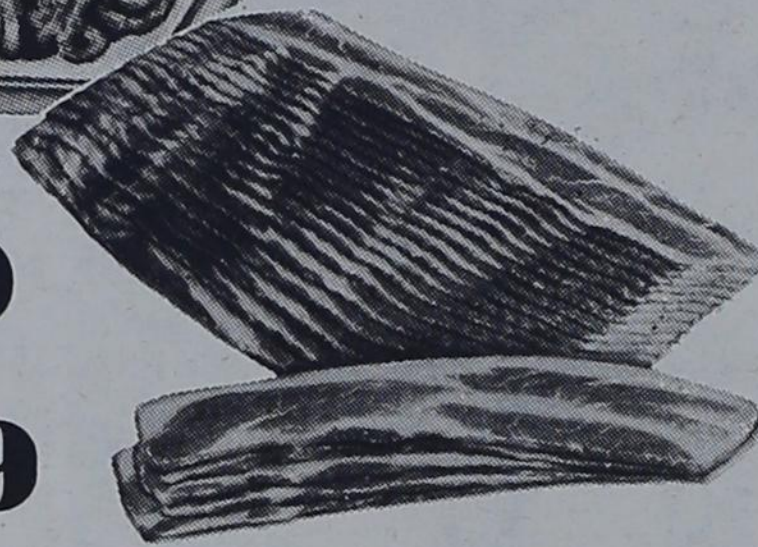

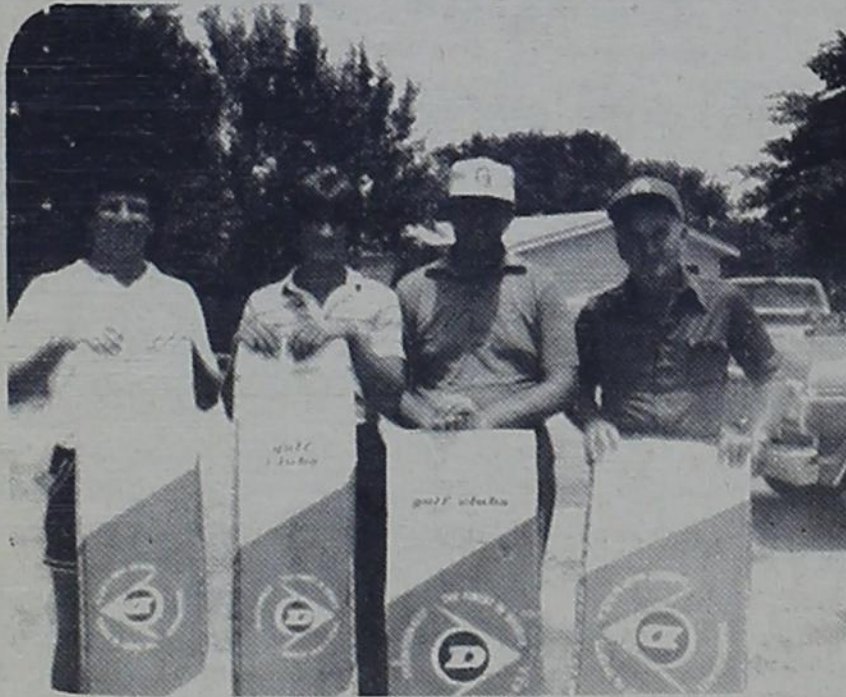

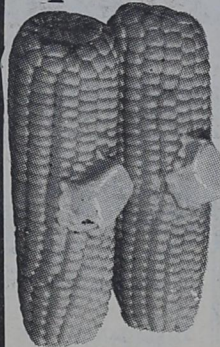

# Conservation Program Increases Funding

In June, a bill extending the Great Plains Conservation Program from Dec. 31, 1981, to Sept. 30, 1991, became law.

The new legislation, Public Law 96-263, will increase GPCP funding from \$300 million to \$600 million and will raise the yearly cost-share expenditure from \$25 million to \$50 million.

"This is a positive step to insure that farmers and ranchers throughout the Great Plains will have added incentive to apply conservation measures on their land," Jim Boykin, district conservationist for the Soil Conservation Service at Baird said.

Under the extended program, landowners can apply soil and water conservation measures to their land and receive cost-share assistance for the work. First, landowners must agree to carry out all needed conservation work on their farm or ranch. The agreement is then secured by signing a

contract with the Soil Conservation Service for a period of not less than three years and not more than ten years. Once the contract is signed, the SCS guarantees funds will be available for the conservation work for the period of the contract.

The SCS has administered the Great Plains Conservation Program since it was enacted in 1956. While working through local soil and water conservation districts, SCS has given technical and financial assistance to 55,000 Great

Plains farmers and ranchers in treating soil and water conservation problems under the program.

"136 landowners have treated 73,000 acres in Callahan County with assistance provided through the program since 1960," Boykin said.

Over the next 10 years, SCS and soil and water conservation districts will help additional Great Plains farmers and ranchers plan and install effective conservation practices on their land.

"The hot, dry climate and

easily eroded soil in the 10 Great Plains states require that we intensively manage our soil and water resources," Boykin said. "The drought of the 1970's, and the summer of 1980, is a reminder that we must protect the plains from wind and water erosion and thus reducing the possibility of another dust bowl."

"Despite success in controlling erosion under the GPCP, much work remains to be done in order to combat serious drought and erosion problems," Boykin concluded.

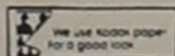

# Callahan Man Gets 10 Years Probation

A 17-year-old Callahan County man who admitted pulling more than 20 rural burglaries in Taylor, Callahan and Jones counties was placed on probation for the maximum period of 10 years Tuesday.

As part of the plea bargain with prosecutors, James Stanley Reston of Route 4, Clyde, was also ordered to make restitution totaling \$3,308 to the victims of all the burglaries. Reston paid \$1,050 of the restitution to Jones County victims at the time he was placed on probation.

Reston had been charged in Taylor County with only one burglary, but admitted a total of 11 here. The one for which he was indicted involved the Dec. 7 break-in of the Danny Bryan residence on Route 5.

Seven Jones County burglaries admitted by Reston were considered as adjudicated offenses, barring the state from prosecuting him in the future on those particular crimes. They involved break-ins of the home of James Griffith,

Henry Washburn, Jean Buinn, Brady Chapman and Ray Moss, according to Jones County officials.

The Taylor and Callahan County burglaries admitted by Reston were not enumerated, but were included in the plea bargain and in the restitution totals, Assistant Criminal District Attorney Jack Grant said.
