Tuesday Tillers Select Yard of the Month

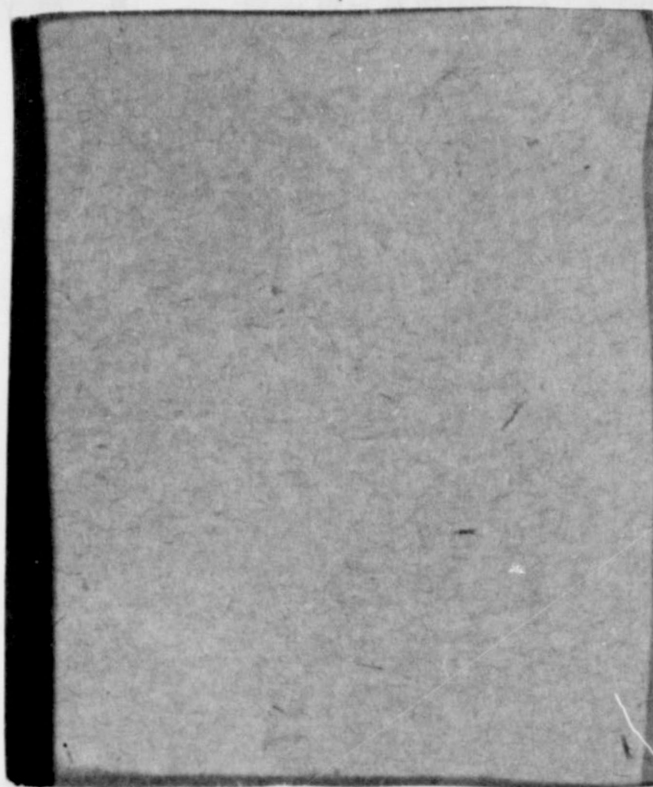
