

Farm Bureau Sponsors Students To Citizenship Seminar in Waco

BAIRD — Callahan - Shackelford County Farm Bureau will sponsor four high school students to this year's Citizenship Seminar, to be held on the Baylor University campus in Waco July 15-19. Interviews for those who would like to be considered will be held at a salad supper at Baird school cafeteria Saturday, June 1st, at 8 p. m. Any student who qualifies is welcome to attend.

To be eligible for attendance at the seminar, students must be entering the 11th or 12th grades in September, 1974, and must be in the upper 30 percent of their class, scholastically, with good character and leadership ability.

The purpose of the seminar is to convey to the students a better understanding for our American heritage and the competitive enterprise system that

has made ours the greatest of all nations. They will also be informed about some of the forces that are eroding our way of life. The ultimate goal, in addition to helping them be better informed, is to cause them to want to share their information with others. To do this effectively, the student should be able to express himself before a group. A short speech at the interview will be in order.

Students do not have to be farm boys or girls or members of Farm Bureau families. The purpose of the program is to develop "better informed citizens."

All expenses, meals, lodging and transportation will be paid by Farm Bureau.

The State organization will assume the responsibility for providing appropriate adult counselors during the seminar and on the chartered buses. Separate housing facilities will be provided for boys and girls.

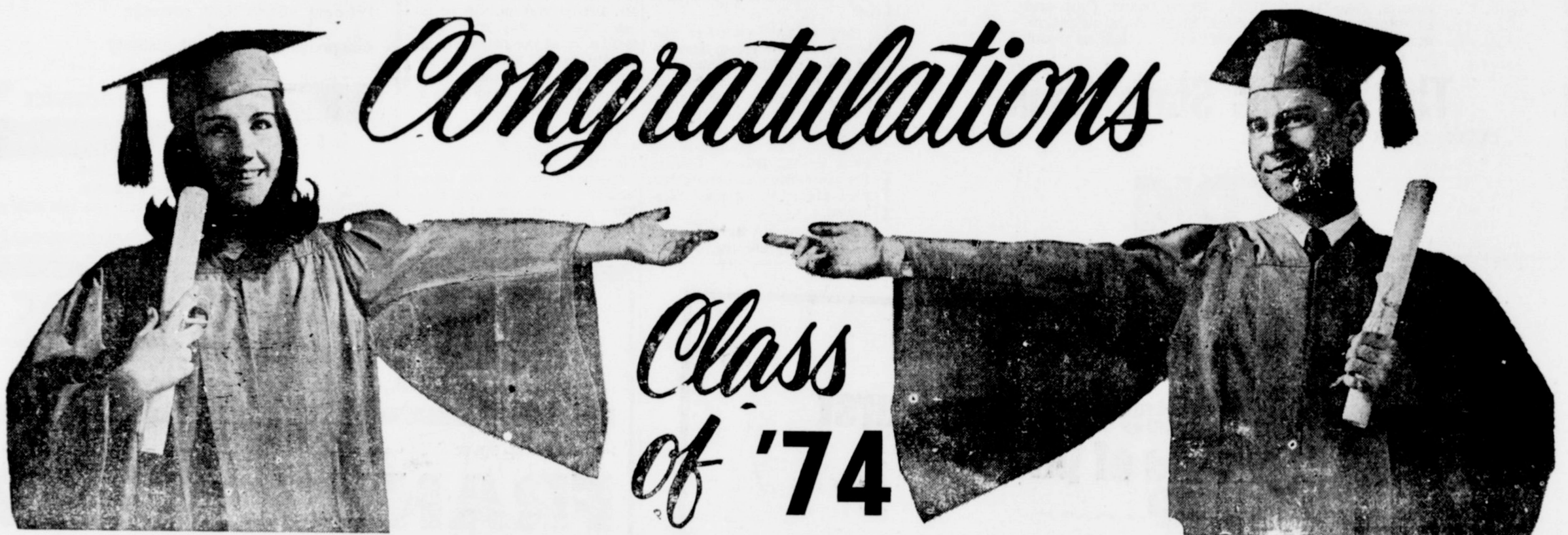

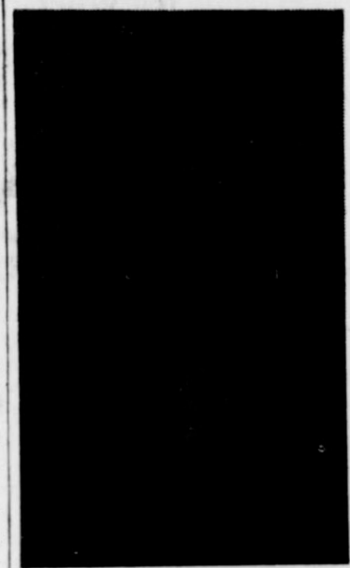
