Right Purpose, Wrong Method

WE FULLY REALIZE that we have been trying to do the right thing in the wrong way. It has been indelibly impressed upon us that the results of one act brought a bigger cloud over the University than all the good we possibly could do.

The president of the outwaded "D. M. C." secret order in the University of Oklahoma thus pleads his case and that of his associates in a frank statement given the press the other day, following an investigation by University authorities of a recent campus flogging.

These students, whose secret society has been in existence for more than a quarter of a century, merely made the mistake that many older and wiser men have made. Righteous purposes never justify unrighteous methods.

Those students of Oklahoma University who have seen the error into which they had fallen, and who have frankly admitted it, are entitled to whatever degree of charity their school may be able to grant them.

More About Fees.

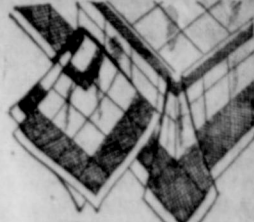
The paper bearing the prayer was ruffled and showed evidence of having been folded and unfolded many times. There was no date on the document, which read as follows:
