Gruver Wins At District Track

Three Gruver track teams took first-place honors in district meets last week.

The Gruver varsity boys outdistanced ten other teams and a fierce wind to score 130 points compared to second-place Wheeler's 111. The junior varsity literally ran away with first place outsoring second place Claude 217 to 113. The seventh grade girls won over a field of five teams to take top honors.

Howard F. Porter, 84, of Spearfish, died on Friday, April 2, 1999 at his home following a lengthy illness.

Porter was born on June 11, 1914, at Glenwood, Minn. to Frederick Horace and Luella (Faulkner) Porter. He was proud of his Irish and English heritage. He attended schools at Glenwood, St. Cloud and Alexandria, Minn. He graduated from Alexandria High School in 1932.

Porter attended God's Bible School in Cincinnati, Ohio for three years. He married Eleanor Bentley in 1939 and they lived in Seattle where he attended the Seattle Pacific University. He graduated in 1944 and they moved to South Dakota where he pastored several churches.

He served at the Mitchell Free Methodist Church, Prairie View Church south of Kennebec, the Brookings Free Methodist Church and the Bates Charge near Wessington. The family moved to Spearfish in 1951 where he was pastor of the Little Log Church and was an orderly at the Fort Meade Veterans Hospital in Sturgis. He was employed as an electrician for 25 years at Black Hills Power and Light retiring in 1979.

He was married to Margaret (Withee) Ketchem in 1974 in Rapid City and they made their home in Spearfish. Following his retirement, the Porters traveled throughout the United States for seven winters with the Mobile Missionary Assistance Program.

He was active as a volunteer in community service. He served as secretary of the Spearfish Volunteer Fire Department for 11 years.

Survivors include his wife, Margaret of Spearfish; five daughters, Mary Eleanor Beamish of Crawford, NB, Celeste Langer of Aurora, CO, Christy McElroy of Rockville, MD, Carol Jordan of Oklahoma City, OK, and Veronica Strackbein of Ft. 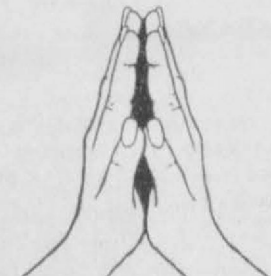

Out At The Lake

With spring here, more people are making camping trips to the Park. Reg and Jody Robertson of Spearman camped earlier in the week, and they were followed by two couples from Sunray. Over the weekend three campers came. Two of these were the Darryl and Janice Harvey and the Rodney McDowell family. Rick Harvey and family of Indiana had arrived to help Darryl celebrate his birthday.

Other visitors were 65 boys of the Lone Wolf District Cub Scouts with several adults on Friday night. They left Saturday morning about ten. One of their activities was to walk the Nature Trail.

Last week for three nights in a row, people got stuck on the road east of the bridge and north of the

creek. Believe the signs!

The big news this week at the Lake is the big shad die off. Jim said they were finding dead shad as big as 12 to 14 inches, although most of them were 5 to 6 inches. He said this bait fish is very finicky and sudden temperature changes or algae bloom are both known to cause these die-offs. It started last Monday and is continuing. When you notice them swimming on their side or back, you know they will soon die. No other variety of fish has been found dead, but specialists from the Parks and Wildlife are trying to determine the cause. Some of the fishermen think it may be due to algae bloom as they are finding some slime on their lines.

This bounty of food washing to shore has made about 25 ring billed gulls happy. Another bird enjoying the feast was a great

egret in breeding plumage. Two roadrunners have been spotted near the office. I hope someone will be able to locate their nest. They make a platform nest of sticks lined with roots, feathers, grasses, snake skins, mesquite pods, and dried manure, placed in low cactus, tree, or bush 3-15 feet high.

Richie Fletcher made me happy with a telephone call last week.

While reading *Lost Trails of the Cimarron* by Chrisman, he had discovered a mention of the Rifle Pits that said the buffalo hunter George Ray was there when they were dug in what was later Irv Steele's pasture. I have the book, but I had missed this item. Chrisman is the man who wrote about "The Treasure of the Rifle Pits." Thanks, Richie.

Under "Timeless Tales" on April 19, 1941 lawmen banded together at Amarillo Convention Center, including State Police, sheriffs, constables, liquor board

officers, special agents and F.B.I. Hansford County Sheriff Hix Wilbanks of Spearman sought the assistance of the 125 officers in solving the slaying of an unidentified woman found near Gruver a month before. Further details were given.

No one connected to this case is still living here, but the woman was identified, the guilty caught and executed. All this was accomplished by exceptional detective work by the Hansford County sheriffs office. Many publications carried accounts for many years.

The other item appeared in "This day in History - Celebrate 2000."

April 9, 1947 a tornado 1.5 miles wide struck White Deer, Glazier, Higgins, Woodward and moved on to Kansas. In Glazier 17 were killed, 49 injured; Higgins 51 killed, 157 injured; Woodward 101 killed. This tornado stayed on the ground 221 miles, the largest ever recorded in weather bureau history.

The tornado did not strike Spearman, but the terrific winds extended to this town. As with recollections, each person remembers where he was, etc.

Early voting for the upcoming School Board elections began April 14, 1999 and will end on April 27, 1999. The general election will be held on Saturday, May 1, 1999.

Spearman ISD lists five applicants filing for two vacancies each of three-years duration. The seats of school board members Andy Scarborough and Robbie Dewberry will be decided in the election.
