Fletcher Releases First Album

Seattle, Washington worship leader and songwriter, Stan Fletcher, a Gruber native, has just released his first album, *Never Ending Love*. The album was recorded and mixed in Los Angeles over the past nine months. This is the culmination of a life-long dream, and the beginning of a new era in Stan's life.

Stan is currently residing in Federal Way, Washington with his wife, Stacy, and their two children where he serves as a pastor and music minister on staff at "The Church at Palisades." Stan is also a model and his photos have appeared in advertising for many national clients.

This debut release has been produced by Monte Ingersoll and Tim Jaquette. Stan penned the words and music for this collection of 12 contemporary Christian songs, and invited some of the greatest names in Christian music to play and sing for his CD.

The album features names like Bob Somma, who is the arranger and also one of the guitar players on the album. Bob, songwriter and recording studio in Azusa, California. Drummer for the project is Stevie DiStanislao, drummer for David Crosby/Stills/Nash fame.

John Campbell, a producer, arranger, and composer for records, films, and television, built orchestration tracks for three of the ballads in the project. John also composes much of the music for the "Adventures in Odyssey" series, and wrote the famous theme song for the series. Jeff Lams, New York Broadway musical director, added additional piano parts and keyboard parts along with Mark LeVang of Los Angeles. David Jeremiah, actor, voice-over-artist, and Grammy-nominated songwriter, provides powerful background vocals for two of the songs.

Stan's greatest passion since coming to know the Lord has been to share the heart of Christ with as many people as possible through his music. This album chronicles his journey back to a life that had new meaning. Each song tells a different story as Stan found his way back to a lifestyle he had abandoned. "It is a story of despair and redemption, about loss and recovery," commented Stan. "However, the best part is about celebration. It's all about starting over."

TAAS Test

The 2001 Summer TAAS (Texas Assessment of Academic Skills) exit level tests will be given in July at Spearman High School, (403 East 11th Street) for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students as well as out-of-school students who have not passed some or all portions of this test.

Dates for the TAAS are Writing- July 10th, Math- July 11th, Reading- July 12th. Testing will begin at 9:00 a.m. each morning in the video conference room. Students should report ten minutes prior to the testing time.

Only students who are not currently enrolled in Spearman High School who still need to pass the TAAS to fulfill graduation requirements must preregister for the test. Students preregistering for the TAAS must have a picture identification for each testing day in order to be able to take the tests.

My friend Deborah Jacops sent me the following story. It really touched me and I thought I would share it with you. I hope you enjoy it.

At the prodding of my friends, I am writing this story. My name is Mildred Hondorf. I am a former elementary school music teacher from DeMoines, Iowa. I've always supplemented my income by teaching piano lessons-something I've done for over 30 years. Over the years I found that children have many levels of musical ability. I've never had the pleasure of having a protégé though I have taught some talented students. However I've also had my share of what I call "musically challenged" pupils.

One such student was Robby. Robby was 11 years old when his mother (a single mom) dropped him off for his first piano lesson. I prefer that students (especially boys!) begin at an earlier age, which I explained to Robby.

But Robby said that it had always been his mother's dream to hear him play the piano. So I took him as a student. Well, Robby began with his piano lessons and from the beginning I thought it was a hopeless endeavor. As much as Robby tried, he lacked the sense of tone and basic rhythm needed to excel.

But he dutifully reviewed his scales and some elementary pieces that I require all my students to learn. Over the months he tried and tried while I listened and cringed and tried to encourage him. At the end of each weekly lesson he'd always say, "My mom's going to hear me play someday."

But it seemed hopeless. He just did not have any inborn ability. I only knew his mother from a distance as she dropped Robby off or waited in her aged car to pick him up. She always waved and smiled but never stopped in. Then one day Robby stopped coming to our lessons. I thought about calling him but assumed, because of his lack of ability, that he had decided to pursue something else. I also was glad that he stopped coming. He was a bad advertisement for my teaching!

Several weeks later I mailed to the student's homes a flyer on the upcoming recital. To my surprise Robby (who received a flyer) asked me if he could be in the recital. I told him that the recital was for current pupils and because he had dropped out he really did not qualify. He said that his mom had been sick and unable to take him to piano lessons but he was still practicing.

"Miss Hondorf...I've just got to play!" he insisted. I don't know what led me to allow him to play in the recital. Maybe it was his persistence or maybe it was something inside of me saying that it would be all right.

The night for the recital came. The high school gymnasium was packed with parents, friends and relatives. I put Robby up last in the program before I was to come up and thank all the students and play a finishing piece. I thought that any damage he would do would come at the end of the program and I could always salvage his poor performance through my "curtain closer."

Well, the recital went off without a hitch. The students had been practicing and it showed. Then Robby came up on stage. His clothes were wrinkled and his hair looked like he had run an eggbeater through it. "Why didn't he dress up like the other students?" I thought. "Why didn't his mother at least make him comb his hair for this special night?"

Robby pulled out the piano bench and he began. I was surprised when he announced that he had chosen Mozart's Concerto #21 in C Major. I was not prepared for what I heard next. His fingers were light on the keys, they even danced nimbly on the ivories. He went from pianissimo to fortissimo...from allegro to virtuoso. His suspended chords that Mozart demands were magnificent! Never had I heard Mozart played so well by people his age.

After six and a half minutes he ended in a grand crescendo and everyone was on their feet in wild applause. Overcome and in tears I ran up on stage and put my arms around Robby in joy. "I've never heard you play like that Robby! How'd you do it?"

Through the microphone Robby explained: "Well Miss Hondorf...remember I told you my mom was sick? Well, actually she had cancer and passed away this morning. And well...she was born deaf so tonight was the first time she ever heard me play. I wanted to make it special."

There wasn't a dry eye in the house that evening. As the people from Social Services led Robby from the stage to be placed into foster care, I noticed that even their eyes were red and puffy and I thought to myself how much richer my life had been for taking Robby as my pupil. No, I've never had a prodigy but that night I became a protégé...of Robby's. He was the teacher and I was the pupil. For it is he that taught me the meaning of perseverance and love and believing in yourself and maybe even taking a chance in someone and you don't know why.

This is especially meaningful to me since after serving in Desert Storm Robby was killed in the senseless bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City in April of 1995, where he was reportedly...playing the piano.

May God bless and keep you; May He make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; May the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.

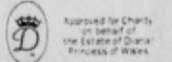

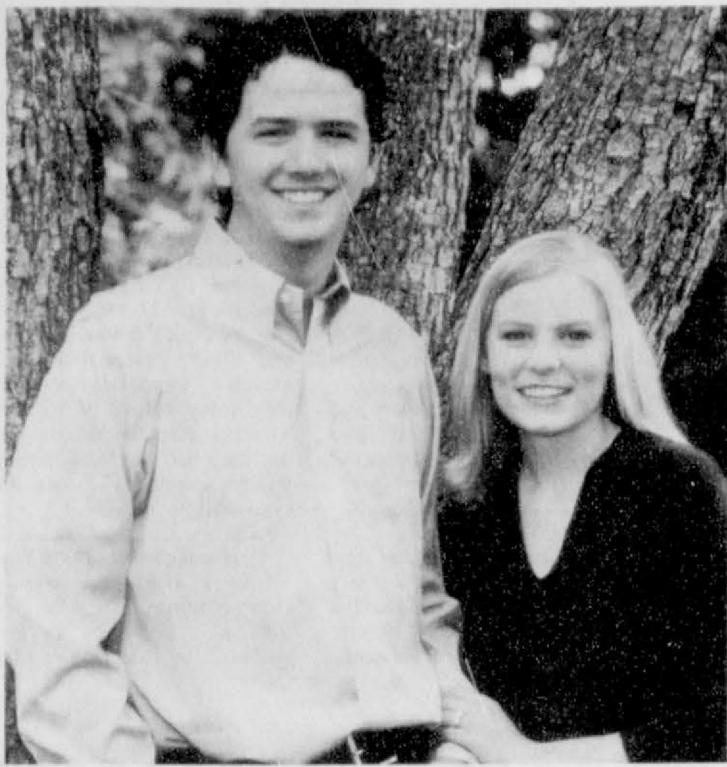

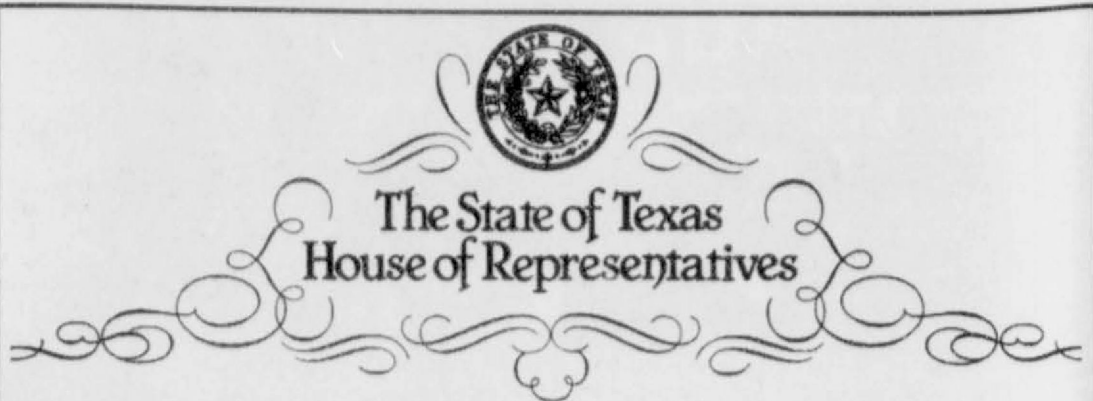

Grants covered personal protective equipment, mechanical lifting devices, and fall protection equipment. Many focused on defensive driving, first-aid/CPR courses, blood borne pathogen kits, electrical safety, fire protection, and school security equipment. Other districts were awarded funds to develop wellness programs, schedule health screenings, create Wellness Days, develop supervisors' training, and produce employee handbooks.

"Competition has significantly increased each of the four years the grant program has been offered, and this year was certainly no exception," Thompson said. "The review and evaluation process required the entire month of May and was extremely difficult given the number of well-justified applications submitted," he said.

"Raising awareness and reducing injuries and losses is a win-win situation that saves valuable resources and increases productivity. The grant program continues

to be an integral part of the Fund's overall effort to help our members achieve their loss control objectives," Thompson said. "Grant applications did a fantastic job analyzing their specific needs, and we applaud them for their commitment to loss prevention in their organizations. We believe the grant program will have a positive effect on participating districts and education entities, and the Fund is dedicated to providing continued support of their efforts," he said.

TASB is a statewide nonprofit association established in 1949 to serve local Texas school districts. School board members are the largest group of publicly elected officials in the state. The districts they represent have a combined annual budget of \$26 billion and employ nearly 600,000 people.

The TASB Risk Management Fund has been providing risk management coverage to Texas school districts since 1974. More than 1,100 school districts, education cooperatives, junior colleges, education service centers, and county appraisal districts participate in one or more of the Fund's coverages.
