To Organize Soft Ball Team Sun.

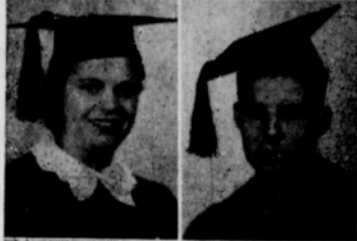
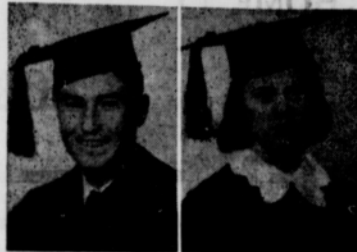
All boys of the community who desire to play on the local softball team this summer are requested to meet at the ball grounds at the school Sunday afternoon, at which time the team will be organized.

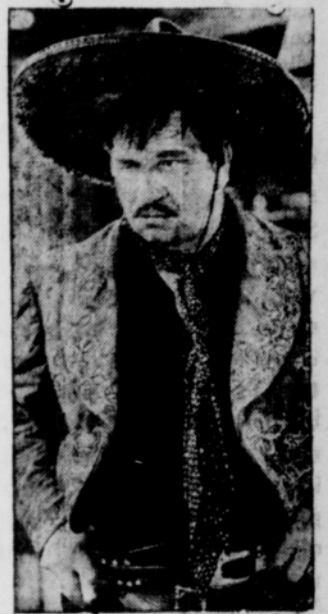

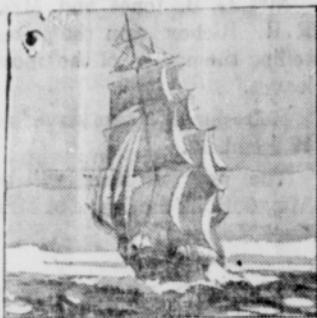

With the added out of doors activities of late spring and early summer, State Fire Insurance Commissioner Marvin Hall warned that camp fires should be completely extinguished after using, that lighted matches and burning cigarettes should not be discarded and camping places and picnic grounds should be kept clean of loose paper and rubbish.

Commissioner Hall stressed the fact that Texas' place as a tourist attraction could be jeopardized by forest fires. In one year in another state, discarded lighted matches were responsible for \$35,000,000 loss in forest fires in a single year.
