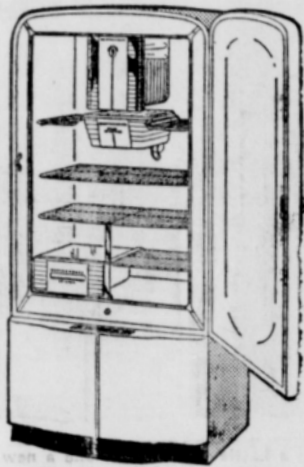

Modern Cobler Pie

1. 2 cups fruit (any kind) and juice. 1 1-2 cups sugar, or according to fruit.

2. Mix 1 cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 1-4 tsp baking powder, 1-8 tsp salt and 1 cup sweet milk.

3. Place 2 tbsp butter in pan or baking dish and melt. Add batter mixture next and then add fruit last. Put in moderate oven and cook slow until batter cover fruit then place on top rack and increase heat and let brown.

Serve, plain or whipped cream, as desired.
