CONSOLIDATION ELECTION

An election has been ordered to be held Saturday in the Pool, Needmore, and Meadow school districts to determine whether or not they shall be consolidated with each other.

If the voters of these three districts decide to do this, the actual status of the school system will not be affected, nor will the taxes of anyone in these three districts be raised thereby. It has been pointed out that the system under a consolidation plan may be operated more economically than under the present "Grouped" system.

All qualified voters in these districts are urged to vote in this election. Duty, and loyalty to your school demands that you do this.

Santa Fe Shows Increased Profits

The Santa Fe's net railway operating income for July was \$6,495,986 according to a statement released by President E. J. Engel today. This is an increase of \$1,536,577 compared with July 1940.

Gross for the system was \$24,402,339, an increase over July 1940 of \$6,716,537 or 37.98 per cent.

Operating expenses were \$12,979,686, an increase of \$2,027,169 or 18.51 per cent over the same month of 1940. Rail tax accruals were \$4,613,027, an increase of \$2,783,758 or 152.18 per cent.
