### Class 1-A Men Sent To Lubbock

Major Joseph R. Peller, Army Recruiting Officer at Lubbock announces that his office has been notified that 420 Class 1-A registrants will be sent to the Army Examining Station at Lubbock within the next 30 days for examination.

After these men have passed through the Army Examining Station, they will be returned to their homes to await the next call for induction.

Young men of the above class interested in enlisting in the Air Corps or other branches of the Regular Army are urged to contact the recruiting office at once as they can not be accepted for enlistment after they have passed through the examining Station, but must wait until they are called for induction.

### Plan Wisely For Home Defense

The National defense program has given a challenge to plan more fully and more wisely than ever before. The Farm Security Families in Terry county have already begun making plans for another year.

Plans are including more home improvements this year than ever before. Many of the families are making minor house repairs, building in clothes closets, pantries, papering and painting, building cellars, and making frame gardens. They are also putting out trees and shrubs to improve the appearance of the home. The production and storage of food for family use has been included in plans. When it is possible, more than one year's food supply is being stored.

The farm families, to fulfill the defense role, need good land, economic security, and adequate income, health, security of tenure, happiness and contentment. The FSA families are striving to secure

these things so that they may plan their part in this role of national defense.

Through the patriotic cooperation of various schools throughout the West Texas area, it is now possible for eligible young men who do not possess the college credits required for appointment as Aviation Cadet to fit themselves to pass an examination that will secure them such appointment, even though they may have no college training.

Young men interested are urged to contact at once the Army Recruiting Station in Lubbock for detailed information.

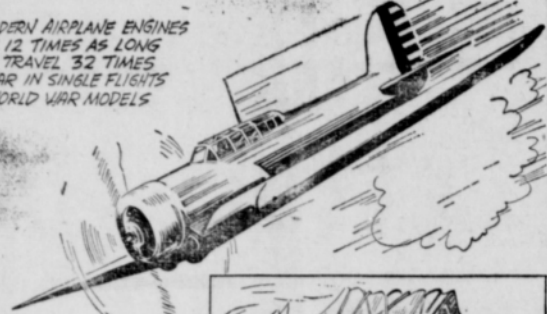
