## Feather Comforts Out of Feather Beds

Feather comforts offer a desirable means of making use of discarded feather beds.

Approximately 3 pounds of good quality feathers should be used. It is better if they are goose feather; the down, of course, makes the best comfort. The feathers may be stripped of the mid-rib, or it may be cut out by scissors. If they are not stripped, all of those with a stiff mid-rib should be discarded.

Be sure the feathers are clean.

The covering for the comfort requires 10 yards of some feather proof material. Satin-faced feather proof ticking is best. It is 36 inches wide and sells for about 50c per yard. Bohemian ticking can be used, and if the ticking is sufficiently attractive, no outer cover is needed, as this adds to the weight.

To make the comfort, first stitch two widths of the material together, 2 1-2 yards long, for the top of the cover, and stitch two widths together 2 1-2 yards long for the lining of the comfort. This makes a comfort about 71 inches wide and 89 inches long. Stitch top and lining together along the center seam, then stitch or quilt across from side every 9 inches until there are 8 pockets on each side 9 inches wide and 35 1-2 inches deep. There will remain at the bottom of the comfort about 17 inches of cover with no feathers. This is good for tucking under the mattress to help hold the comfort to the bed; then, too, why use valuable feathers for tucking under, and the length of most beds is about 72 inches.

Divide the feathers into 2 equal parts, using one half of them for each side of the comfort. Stuff feathers into the pockets, working with one half of the comfort at a time. Stuff by putting a handful in each pocket and repeating until all the feathers are used. When a vacuum cleaner is available, the feathers or down can be blown into the comfort tick, which has been made up previously with the

Quilt or stitch lengthwise of the comfort so that the feathers will be held in 9 inch squares; this requires three rows of stitching on each side of the center seam and parallel to it. Round off the corners of the comfort, and lastly bind the edge with bias binding of same material.

## Soil Conservation Meeting Report

March 25, 1941

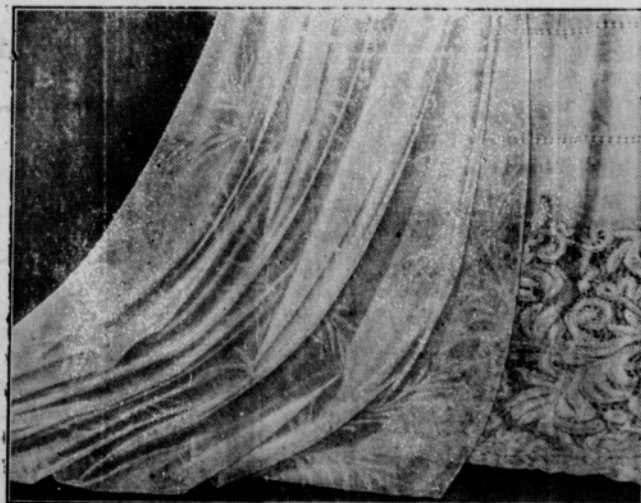
Mr. W. G. McDonald, chairman of the District Board of supervisors, and Mr. F. M. Ellington, chairman of the Yoakum County Land Use Planning Committee, and E. R. Steen, District Conservationist of the Soil Conservation Service attended a conference in the interest of the Cochran-Yoakum-Terry Soil Conservation District at Amarillo Friday. There were representatives there from five states; Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas and Colorado. Other supervisors of the District are Mr. Lee Brownfield, of Brownfield, Mr. W. A. Woods, and Mr. W. W. Smith of Cochran County. The Board of supervisors has worked out its Program, which is information regarding the Soils, Slopes, Amount of Erosion, and Land Use, along with Social and Economic information. This information was worked up through groups such as the Land Use Planning Committees. The work plan for the District will be worked out in a similar manner within the next few weeks, then it will be possible for the District Board of Supervisors to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture and the Soil Conservation Service, or any other agency in the Agricultural Dept., whereby assistance to the farmers in the District can be had. A conservation Farm Plan will be signed between the District Board of Supervisors and the farmers or ranchers. Demonstration farms scattered over the District have been worked on this Spring.

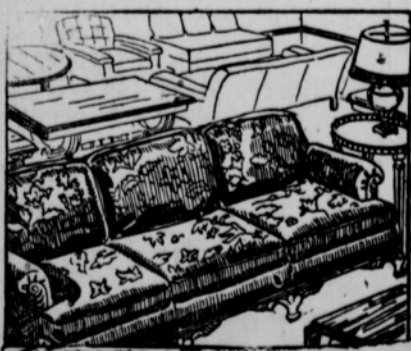
