## F.F.A. Spring Project Show To Be March 15th

Prof. A. L. Hartzog, Instructor of Vocational Agriculture in the Meadow Schools has announced that the annual Spring Project show will be held March 15th.

The Calf division will feature entries of fat beef steers placed by the following members of the FFA Chapter: Edward Warren, James Warren,

Robert Lyles, Lynn Murray, Homan Moorehead, Olin Moore, Herbert Byrd, J. C. Preston, Kenyon Banks, D. J. Yowell, Ellis Ray Walker, Duaine Norman, Aubrey Williams, Robert Beasley, Edwin Nettles, Billie Joe Tilger, Calvin Bartlett, and Terrell Bell.

The majority of the calves were put on feed

about Sept. 1 and were fed balanced rations by home grown feed, supplemented with meal, while being allowed to run on sudan pasture all calves were fed dry lot, and were in no instance permitted to have nurse cows. Thus a feeding routine practical to this section has been followed and in most cases the calves have made very good

gains which will net the boys a reasonably nice margin of profit.

The calves will be shown in two classes with 750 pounds the dividing line.

The hog division will feature several classes of fat and breeding animals, not yet determined by the show management, which is as follows: Bus. Mgr. J. C. Preston, Asst. Mgr.

Duaine Norman, General Supt. of show, Edwin Nettles, Supt. of Beef Div. Robert Beasley, Supt. of Hog Div. Robert Lyles.

This will be the largest livestock show which has been promoted by the local boys. Judges will be Bill McKinney, former Terry Co. AAA man, and County Agent R. N. McClain.

## Formby Sponsors Rural School Aid Bill In Tex. Senate Sub-Committee

A young West Texan who used to walk nearly three miles to a three-teacher country school has been named Chairman of the highly important committee in the Texas Senate to handle the \$16,000,000 Rural Aid bill for 1942 and 1943. Senator Marshall Formby of McAdoo, of this senatorial district, is Chairman of the five-member sub-committee which will handle the bill in the Senate to dish out about \$8,000,000 per year for the next two-year period.

It is reported that all appropriation bills will be passed out of the Senate almost two months earlier than usual this year. The appropriations for the Judiciary already are ready for passage in the Senate.

## FEDERAL LOANS NOW AVAILABLE FOR ADDED FARM AND LIVESTOCK WATER FACILITIES

Dennis Q. Lilly, rehabilitation supervisor and Dorothy M. Whitney, Home Management Supervisor for the Farm Security Administration in Terry County have returned from a District Meeting in Lubbock where they attended a district meeting to discuss the FSA's Water Facilities program.

Mr. Lilly said that he

had received additional authority to recommend for approval Water Facilities applications for farm families in all parts of the county.

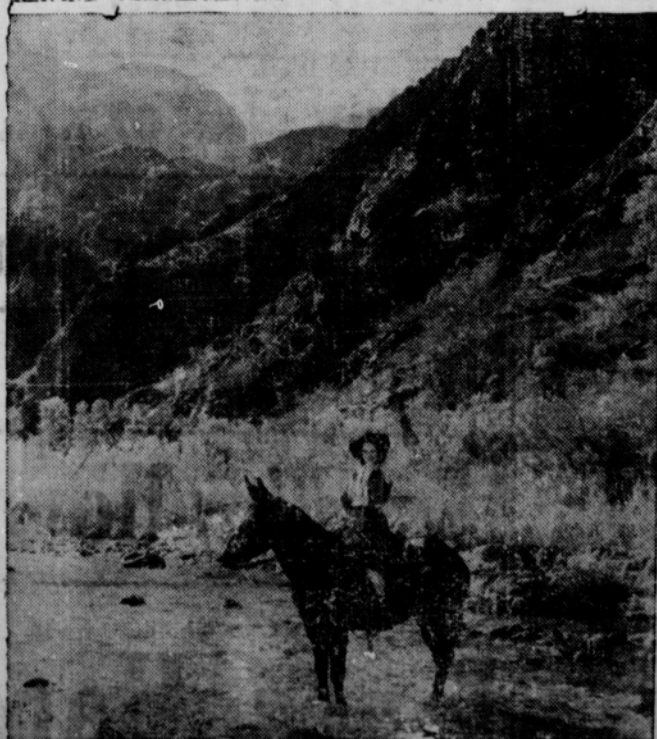
"Funds in the form of loans to farm families are available" Mr. Lilly said, "for the installation of facilities for farmstead and livestock water developments."

"Facilities which may be installed, repaired or developed," he continued, "are cisterns, walls, pools, ponds, tanks, springs or seeps."

Appurtenances for the use of water, such as windmills, stock trough storage tanks, bathroom fixtures (including minor house repairs), sinks pipe, towers, necessary labor, garden fences, windbreak tree planting, milk troughs, and so forth are also included."

It was emphasized however, that no irrigation system, other than the one acre maximum per farm unit, are authorized, except in the Rita Blanca Drainage, Coldwater Palo Duro Watershed and Mustang-Monument Seminole Area.

Mr. Lilly said he expects scores of farm families in Terry County will improve their water facilities as a result of this program. Farmers and farm women interested in obtaining complete information about this program should immediately contact Mr. Lilly or Miss Whitney at the County Farm Security Administration office in the Brownfield Building.

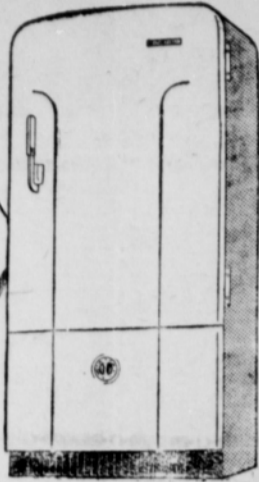

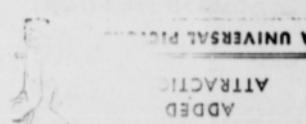

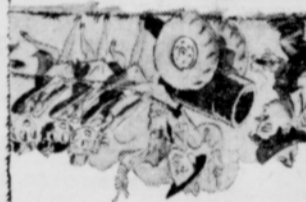
