Thursday, Aug. 28, Juniors and Seniors will register. From 10 to 4.

Friday, Aug. 29, Freshmen and Sophomores will enroll. From 10 to 4.

Saturday, Aug. 30, general Faculty meeting at high school office, 10 a. m.

The school will adopt the 12 grade system this year. The change will conform with the plan recommended by the State Department of Education.

A large number of the people living in the Needmore district have requested all of their children be allowed to attend school at Meadow this year, and for that reason the school board has adopted the plan of operating only one grade school this year. Under this arrangement a student coming in will have the advantage of longer class periods, longer study periods, better libraries, better instructional facilities, better playground equipment and the use of an indoor gymnasium, and the assurance that when he is ready to enter high school his opportunity to prepare himself for high school work has been equal to that of any other student in the district.

New teachers in the school this year will be Mr. L. A. Stephenson in high school, and Mrs. Stephenson and Miss Kirksey in grade school. One other teacher will be employed in high school.

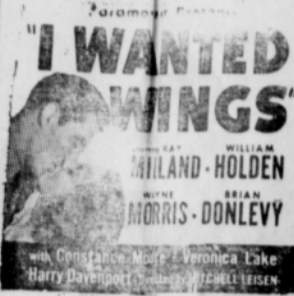
