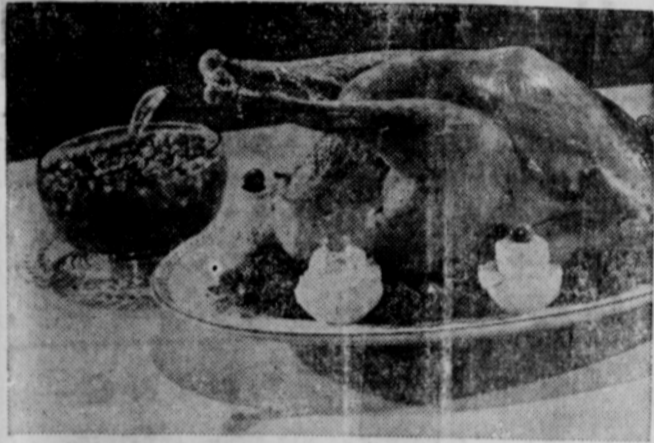


Cranberries Adorn King Turkey!



Thanksgiving — turkey — cranberries! The words have the kind of rhythm associated with roast beef, mashed potatoes, apple pie, or any other typical American menu. But because it's traditional, let's not feel full about it.

Of course, there are many households that wouldn't enjoy Thanksgiving without the good old-fashioned cranberry sauce to give color and tang to the flavorsome turkey of the day. But why stop there? Cranberries are entirely too ornamental not to have other functions at the feast day table. Try garnishing the bird with inch-thick slices of orange, cut round. On top of each orange-chunk set a marshmallow that has been freshened, not browned, in the oven. In the center of the marshmallow, place a raw, bright-red cranberry. Spread parsley for green emphasis around the edge of the turkey platter and be prepared for a delighted chorus of oh's and ah's, from the folk gathered around the festive board.

As for desserts, there's Cranberry Meringue Pie, for instance. It's a change from plain cranberry pie and delightfully ornamental too.

CRANBERRY MERINGUE PIE
 1 1/2 cups sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/2 cup water 2 tablespoons butter
 1 pound (4 cups) Cranberries 1 teaspoon vanilla
 4 eggs, separated 4 tablespoons powdered sugar
 2 tablespoons flour Baked pie shell

Boil sugar and water for 5 minutes. Add cranberries, cook until skins pop open. Beat egg yolks with flour and salt, pour cranberries over mixture. Cook for 2-3 minutes, stirring constantly. Add butter and vanilla. Cool. Fill pie shell, top with meringue of whipped egg whites and powdered sugar. Brown in slow oven, 325° F., 15 minutes.

Or, Steamed Cranberry Pudding, with Foamy Cranberry Sauce, another tasty dessert that won't be hard on the eyes.

STEAMED CRANBERRY PUDDING
 1 cup flour 1/2 cup finely chopped suet
 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder 1 cup chopped Cranberries
 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 egg
 1/2 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup milk or water
 1/2 cup bread crumbs

Mix ingredients in the order given. Turn into a well greased mold, cover with waxed paper and steam for 2 hours. Serve with Foamy Cranberry Sauce.

FOAMY CRANBERRY SAUCE
 4 tablespoons butter 1/4 cup sweetened cranberry juice
 1 cup confectioners' sugar (from Ten-Minute Cranberry Sauce)
 1 egg, separated Grated rind 1/2 orange

Cream butter and sugar together. Add beaten egg yolk, cranberry juice and orange rind. Fold in stiffly beaten egg white just before serving.

New Machine Is Really A Dilly

J. M. Burleson, Manager of the West Texas Gin invited us down Saturday afternoon to watch his new piece of machinery in operation, and we saw something that made our eyes almost stick out on stems. It does about everything but talk. It automatically either dries or humidifies the cotton. With this new machinery, the damp, wet cotton is thoroughly dried and cleaned before it reaches the ginning equipment, and it is impossible to scorch or burn the cotton, as it automatically adjusts itself to the condition of the cotton. The cotton he was ginning looked to be in fairly good shape but the trough leading from the cleaner which carries off the trash had a large stream of sand constantly flowing from it. And to show the contrast, Mr. Burleson picked up a handful of cotton coming from the drier cleaner and tossed it back onto the wagon and it was miraculous at the difference in the whiteness of it and the cotton on the wagon.

Mr. Burleson says if the farmers will take advantage of this new machinery, which cost them several thousand dollars, it will mean a great saving to them on the grade of their cotton.

FSA Loans Are Now Available To Meadow Farmers

Financial assistance is available through the Farm Security Administration to assist small farmers who need supplies, equipment and repairs to enable them to contribute to the Food for Defense program, Dennis Q. Lilly, county rehabilitation supervisor, said today.

Expanding its services to low income farm families, this agency of the Department of Agriculture is conducting a state wide drive to give small farmers an opportunity to aid the defenders of democracy and to relieve their own distressed conditions.

Working under the direction of the State and County USDA Defense Boards, of which Farm Security is a part, this agency is said to be ready to make loans to qualified farm families to step up their production of needed foods. Long term loans are available for a great many purposes.

Increased production and improved home consumption will be encouraged by the FSA for its borrower families rather than the expansion of the farm enterprise. Better care of livestock, more adequate use of available facilities, purebred sires, culling, better housing for poultry and livestock, more canning and improved selection and preparation of food and feed storage, are among the things being emphasized by this agency.

Among types of assistance which the Farm Security Administration is prepared to furnish eligible small farm families in Terry and Yoakum Counties to enable them to participate in the National Defense program are:

1. Loans for the purchase of silage cutters, feed grinder binders, trailers, and other harvesting and operating expenses to store feed crops in trench silos or other storage methods.

2. To increase the production of poultry, poultry products, dairy products and pork, Farm Security will finance suitable shelter for poultry, dairy cattle or hogs, either by the use of temporary shelter, remodeling present buildings, or constructing new buildings, provided proper tenure agreements

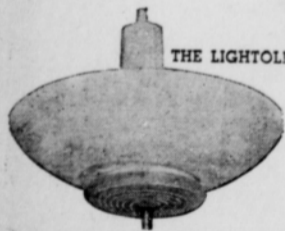

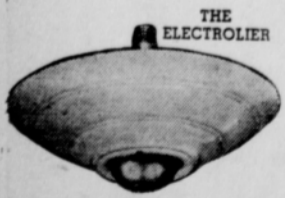

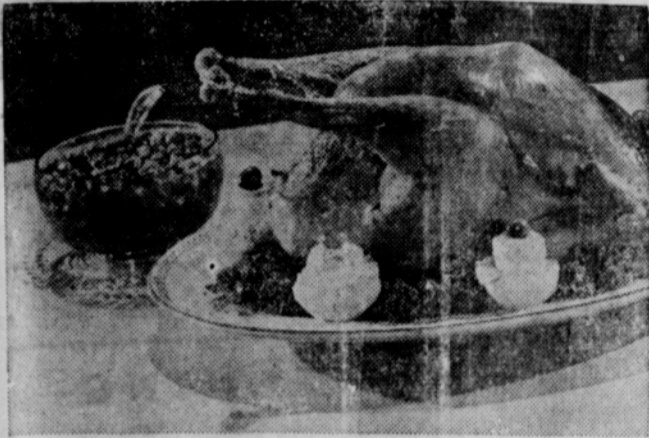

Whole Wheat Ginger Cake (12 servings)

1-3 cup fat, 1-2 cup sugar, 1 cup molasses, 1 egg, well beaten, 2-3 cup raisins, 1

tablespoon white flour, 1 cup sour milk, 2 cups whole wheat flour, 2 tsp. baking powder, 1 tsp. soda, 1-2 tsp. salt, 1 tsp. ginger, 1-2 tsp. cloves, and 1-2 tsp. cinnamon.

Grease 2 layer cake pans and dust with flour or line with paper. Dust raisins with the white flour. Cream sugar and fat. Add molasses and beaten egg. Sift together the whole wheat flour, salt, soda, baking powder, and spices and add to the first mixture alternately with the milk. Bake in moderate oven. (350 deg. F.) 30 to 40 minutes.

Whole Wheat Bisquits

2 cups whole wheat flour, 1 tbsp honey or sugar, 3-4 cup milk, 2 1-2 tsp baking powder, 2 tbsps butter or lard, Mix flour and baking powder, work butter into flour, stir in honey. Add liquid, knead til dough is right to roll out thinner than white flour bisquits, and bake in slow oven.

3. Farm Security will finance supplements for a good feeding program; the agency will finance, in some cases, the purchase of milch cows, sows and feeder pigs up to the normal carrying capacity of the borrower's farm. FSA will finance the purchase of young chicks to bring the farm flock to normal carrying capacity of the farm.

4. To aid in food preservation and storage this agency will finance eligible farm families purchase pressure cookers, jars and other canning equipment. Loans are available to construct cellars, milk collars, shelves or other storage space needed to protect the family's food supply.

5. To provide ample water supplies for the production and storage programs. Farm Security will finance the development of available water, including wells, pump towers, windmills, overhead supply tanks, pipes and so forth as rental arrangements will justify.

Mr. Dennis Q. Lilly said loans are available to qualified small farmers for many purposes other than those listed above to enable them to improve their own conditions and contribute to the National Defense program.
