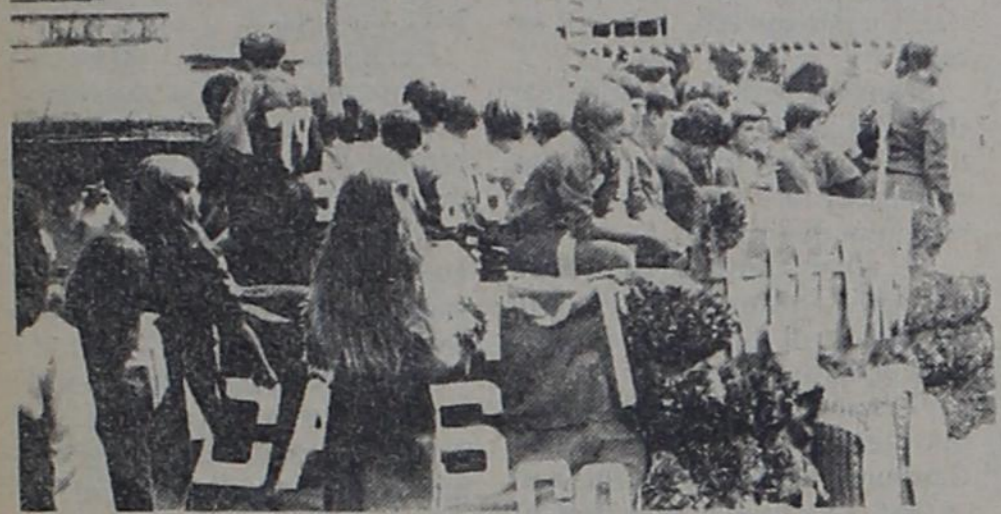

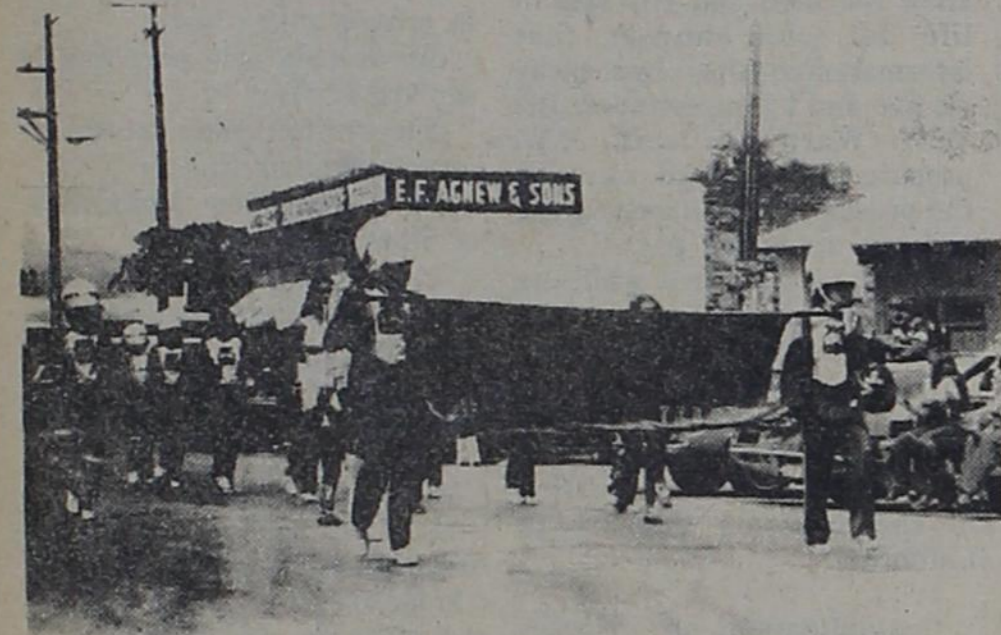

## Abilene High Schools To Sponsor College Night

Junior and senior students of high schools in the Big Country who are planning to go to college and the parents of these students will have an opportunity to meet and talk with representatives from various colleges, universities, and vocational training schools at a college night program at Cooper High School on Thursday, October 28, at 7:30 p.m. Representatives from thirty institutions have been invited. In addition, representatives from the Army, Navy, and Air Force ROTC programs and a representative to discuss Financial Aid will participate in the program.

The evening program will begin in the auditorium where Max Whitely, President of Cooper High School Student Council, will preside. Dr. Lewis Lemmond, Assistant

Superintendent for the Abilene Independent School District, will welcome the students and parents.

Following the general meeting in the auditorium, each student and parent will have an opportunity to attend three discussion groups of thirty minutes each to obtain information about three different colleges in which they are interested.

College representatives will discuss entrance requirements, application procedure, estimated yearly cost, courses of study, types of housing available, financial aid, and other topics of concern to students and parents.

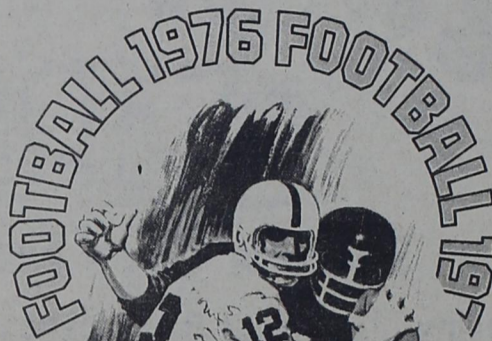
