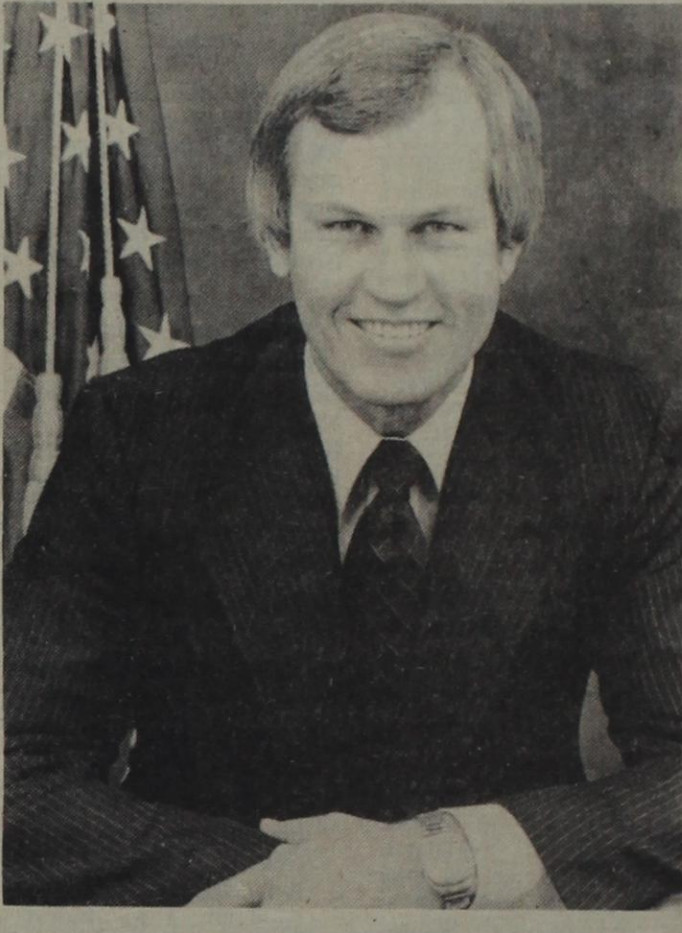

"That is one of my primary goals during the next session of Congress", he said. "One of the reasons I am asking for a renewal of my contract to serve the people of the 17th District".

## Comment Period for 1980 Peanut Program Ends Jan.11

The deadline for making recommendations for the 1980 crop peanut program has been changed from February 4 to January 11, Ray Fitzgerald, administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, announced today. It is better to wear out than to rust out.

Fitzgerald said this action will enable the department to announce peanut program details earlier than in past years, providing producers more time in which to obtain financing and make production plans and marketing decisions. The public is being asked to comment on the national support level for quota peanuts and for additional peanuts as well as the

sales policy for 1980 crop additional loan peanuts sold for export edible use. Comments should be sent to the director, price support and loan division, ASCS USDA, Room 3741 South building, P.O. Box 2415, Washington, D.C. 20013. All comments will be available for public inspection at that office during regular business hours.

## To Parents Of Children Entering Kindergarten In Jan.

Parents of few minutes the first day to fill out some information sheets. Please bring immunization records and a birth certificate to school with you on Monday, January 14th. Jackie Tucker, school nurse has stated that the following immunizations are required by the state law before attending school in Texas: Series of 3 DTP with at least one on or after the 4th birthday, one dose of measles on or after the 1st birthday, one dose of mumps vaccine, and one dose of Rubella vaccine. Supplies the Kindergarten students will need are as follows: 1 number 2 pencil, 1 scissors, 1 box of 8 crayons, 1 tablet, 1 small bottle of Elmer's glue, and one rest mat thick enough to keep child from getting cold on cement floor and small enough so that the child can fold it alone. Kindergarten teacher is Mrs. Robbie Rutherford.

Lunches will be available for 70 cents each day. Breakfast is served from 8:00 at a cost of 25 cents. Milk for the morning snack will be 7 cents daily. Parents are asked to be prepared to stay a

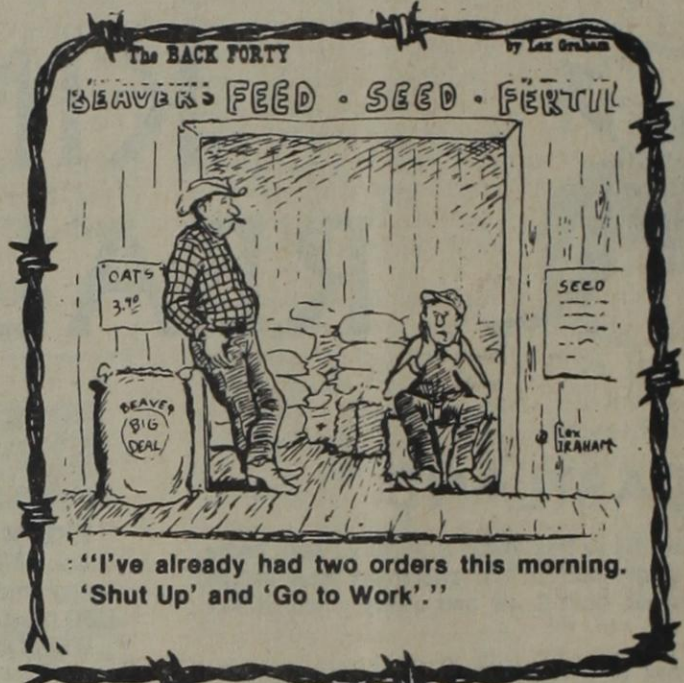

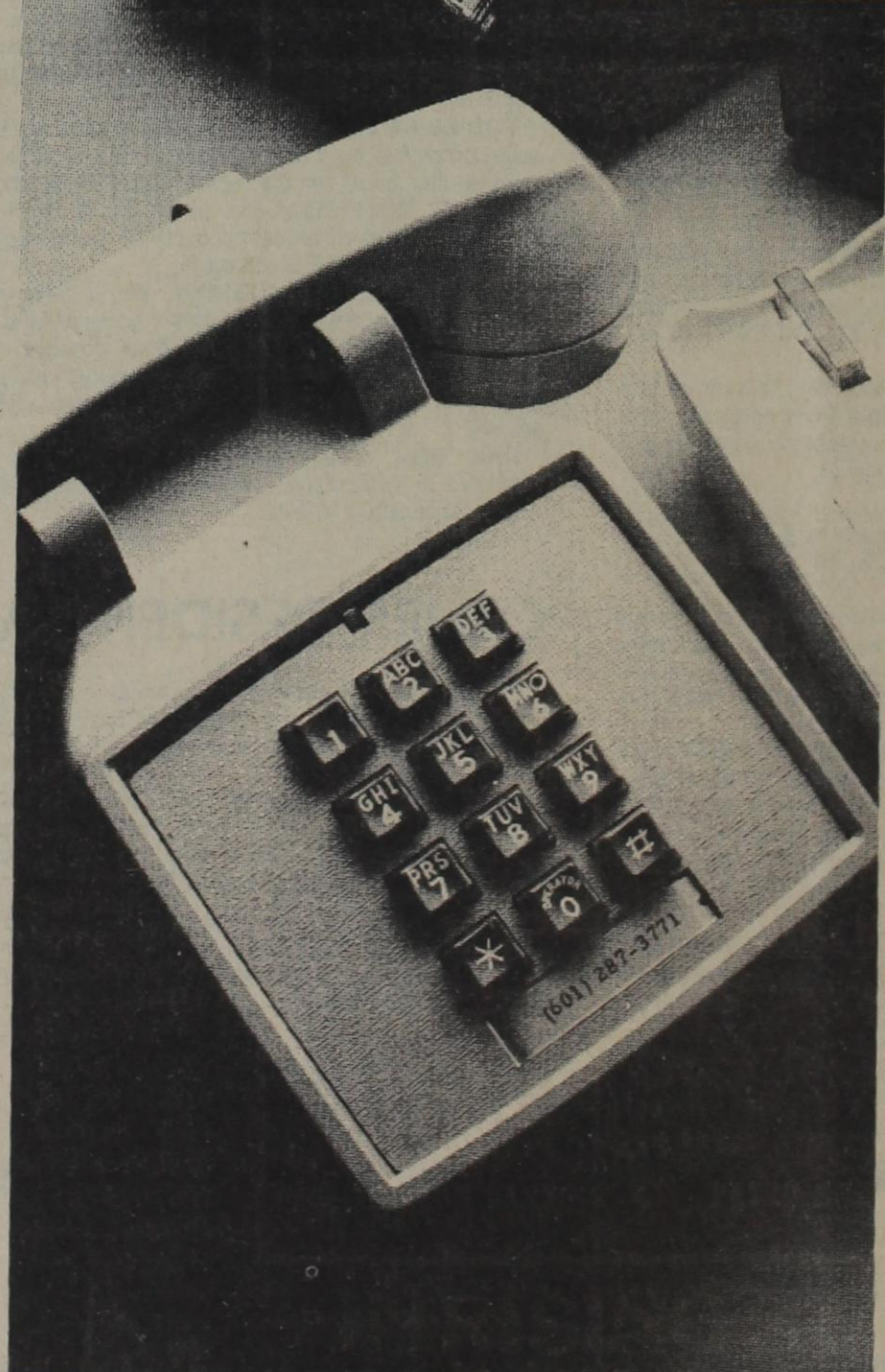
