In addition to her duties as a secretary in Flight Operations, she has acted as an aide supporting Congressional testimony, a vital source of information for intercenter management, a protocol professional during FOD's interactions with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and a knowledgeable assistant in administrative functions of the Directorate such as preparing manpower reports. "She has moved into areas that approach those of a technical aide," says Eugene Kranz, Deputy Director of FOD.

As secretary to Mr. Kranz, Ms. Pacek maintains technical notes, records, and action items during meetings concerning the STS-1 mission. "This requires a high

level of familiarity with the space vehicle systems, Mission Control Center capabilities and training systems," Mr. Kranz says.

He also cites her willingness to take on new work as a challenge to sharpen her skills and to work long and irregular hours while still keeping up with her secretarial responsibilities of the office.

Of special note is her intelligence. During the Skylab reactivation, she had to relay instructions "of a highly technical nature," Mr. Kranz says. "Mrs. Pacek was very perceptive in recognizing significant issues and bringing them to the attention of the proper console operator."

In all, Janet Pacek has the sharp mind and aptitude that are the traits of outstanding NASA personnel.

Since the inception of the Outstanding Secretary of the Month Award, Mrs. Pacek is the only JSC secretary to have received this honor twice. Mrs. Pacek also received this award in April of 1977.

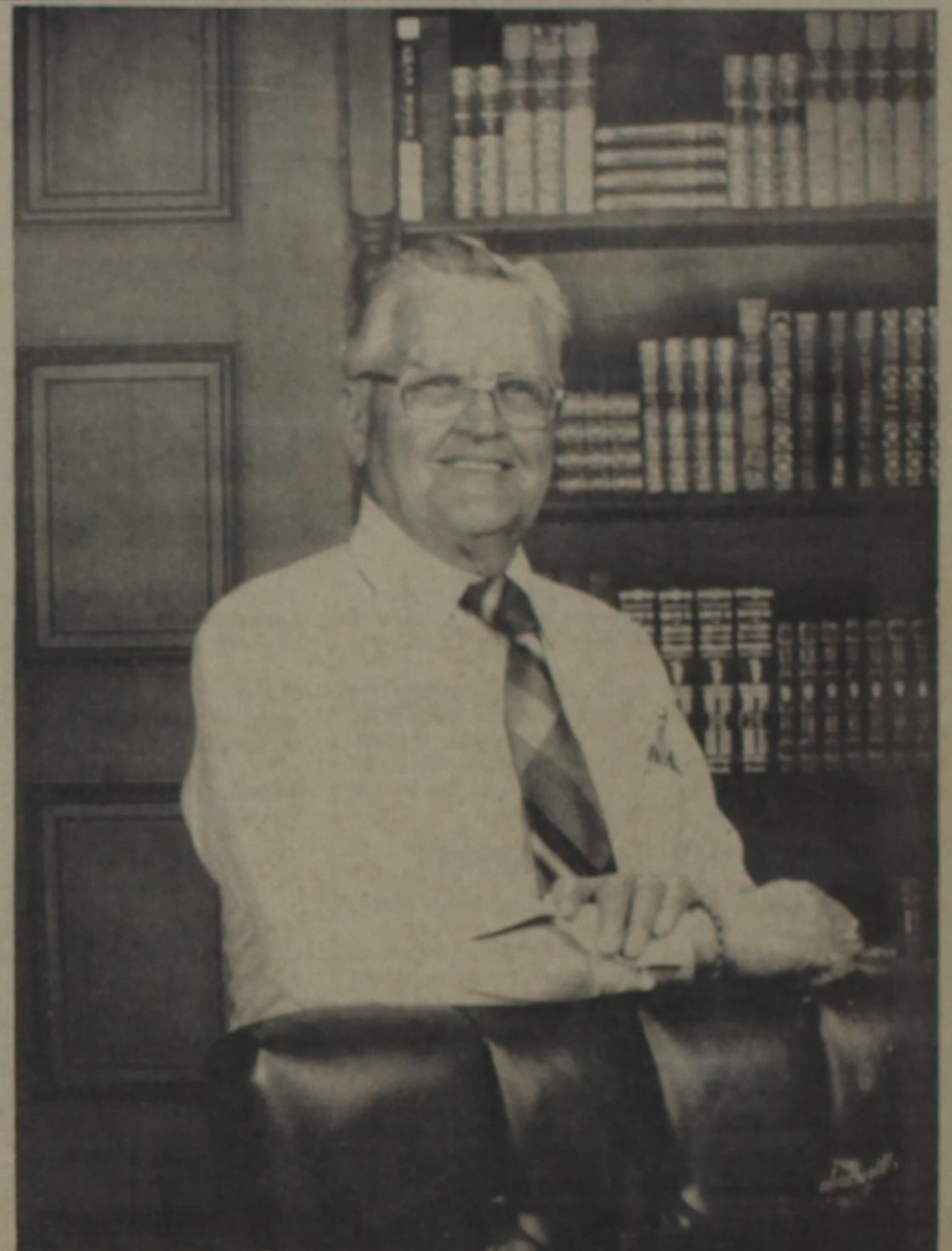
ACU Graduate

He is married to the former Marilyn Clark.

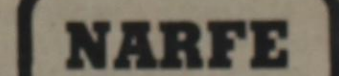


C.A. Claborn Retires With 34 Years Of Community Service

In September of 1949, the new store was completed and C.A. has remained bookkeeper ever since.

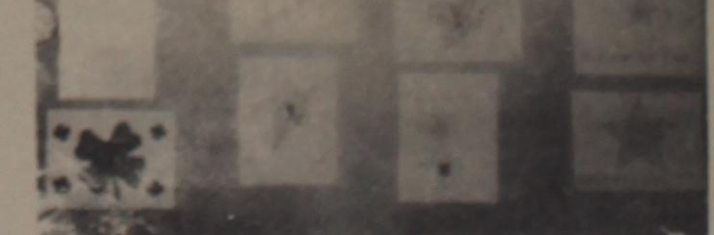
C.A. was always active in the Rising Star community and was honored this year by the Rising Star Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture as a recipient of the Community Service Award.

The play begins Thursday, June 19 and continues through

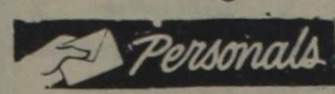

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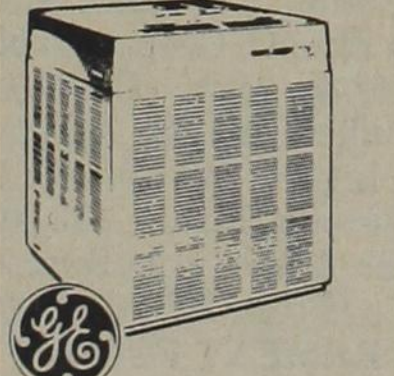

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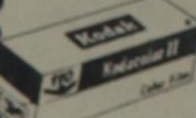

WHAT SAITH THE SCRIPTURES?

QUESTION: What is meant when Jesus is referred to as Lord?

ANSWER: The term "Lord" used in the New Testament scriptures is defined as "one who has power or authority; one who owns a person or possession and has control over it; a master, an owner, a ruler with full legal authority". This term is applied to Jesus Christ for he has been appointed Lord by the Father, and should be accepted as Lord by every person.

During Jesus' ministry on earth he was frequently referred to as Lord. The many miracles he performed caused the multitudes to recognize him as the Lord of creation with power over all of nature (Mt. 14:13-33; Mk. 5:1-20, Jn. 9:1-38; etc.) The demands which Jesus placed before those who would be his disciples caused many to accept Jesus as Lord over their individual lives (Lk. 6:46; Jn. 6:66-69). As the Saviour of mankind he was also declared to be Lord, for he has the power and authority to provide forgiveness of sin (Lk. 13:22-24; Mt. 1:21. Even at Jesus' birth the angelic message was "there is born to you this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk. 2:11).

Following his death upon the cross and burial in Joseph's tomb, Jesus was raised from the dead by the Father. Jesus' evident power over death caused the apostle Thomas to address him "My Lord and my God" (Jn. 20:28). After being taken up into heaven to reign at God's right hand, Jesus sent forth the Holy Spirit to empower the apostles to

preach the gospel of salvation (Acts 1-2). The apostle, Peter, said concerning him "This Jesus did God raise up, whereof we are all witnesses. Being therefore by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he hath poured forth this, which ye see and hear...Let all the house of Israel therefore know assuredly, that God hath made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom ye crucified" (Acts 2:32-36).

Any who would be saved must acknowledge Jesus as Lord & master, owner, ruler): "Because if thou shalt confess with thy mouth Jesus as Lord, and shalt believe in thy heart that God raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved" (Rom. 10:9). All who claim Jesus as Lord must then live their lives accordingly, for Jesus himself said, "Why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do the things which I say" (Lk. 6:46). We must "turn unto the Lord" and then "cleave unto the Lord" (Acts 11:21,23). 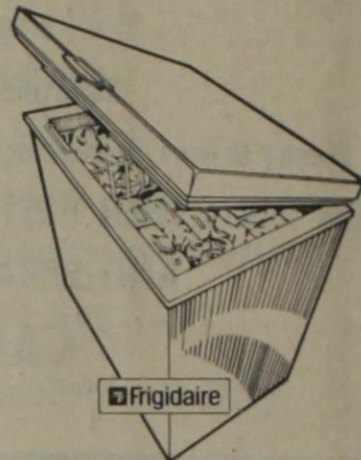

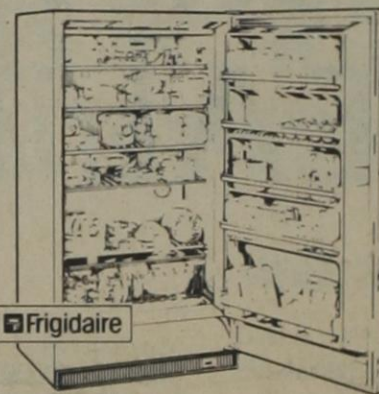

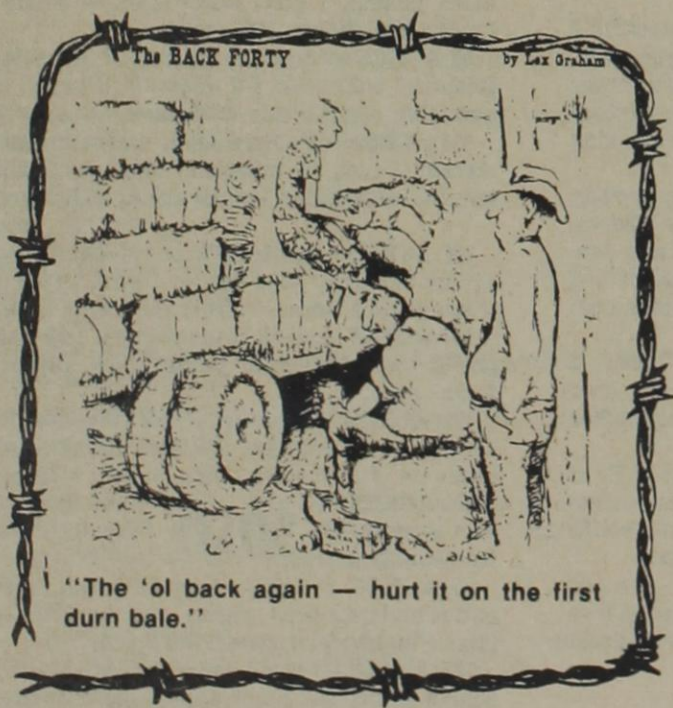
