

## Butch Butler Resigns from Early ISD



The Early school board met at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday to take the first steps in hiring a head coach and athletic director. Butch Butler, head football coach and AD for the last seven years, resigned Friday to join the sales staff at Holley Chevrolet in Brownwood.

"It was one of the toughest decisions I've had to make," Butler said before taking off on a weekend fishing trip. "I just felt like it was the kind of business opportunity I couldn't turn down."

Butler served Early for a total of nine years in two different stints. He was an assistant coach for two years before moving to Rankin as an assistant and to Rocksprings as head coach. He was honored as the West Texas Coach of the Year in 1973 after leading Rocksprings to a 9-2 record. His assistant at Rocksprings was Roger Goodwin, current Santa Anna head coach who was named West Texas Coach of the Year last football season.

Butler returned to Early in 1974 as head coach and athletic director. His teams have been Early's most consistent winners since the school moved up in classification several years ago.

During the last five years of his stay at Early, the football program produced a 30-19-1 record, boys basketball went 115-35 and girls basketball posted a 99-43 mark.

His 1976 Early team went 9-1, losing only to eventual state runner-up De Leon.

The move will be a change of pace for Butler, who has coached for 15 years since graduating from Hardin-Simmons University. He is also a graduate of Rising Star High School.

Butler's resignation is the second coaching change in the last two

weeks at Early. Chris Frederick, Butler's top assistant, was named head basketball coach after Doug Thompson resigned to take a similar position at San Saba.

Early is a member of District 10-AA along with Bangs, De Leon, San Saba, Dublin, Cisco, Eastland and Ranger.

Butch, Mary, and two children are anticipating the new change over. He is the son of Robert and Edra Butler of Rising Star.

I want to make as much a home away from home for all who are placed in our care and my staff feels the same way".

Her philosophy is such that we are in their home to give them all the tender loving care in the eight hour per shift, with good food, good nursing care, and a pleasant clean home for them. She went on to say, "We are servants of God and Man." Parnell concluded saying, "I also am pleased to find the wonderful way the churches, clubs and other volunteers who devote their time and talents to come to the nursing home to make the days more brighter for the residents—this so enlightens them and makes them feel wanted and loved."

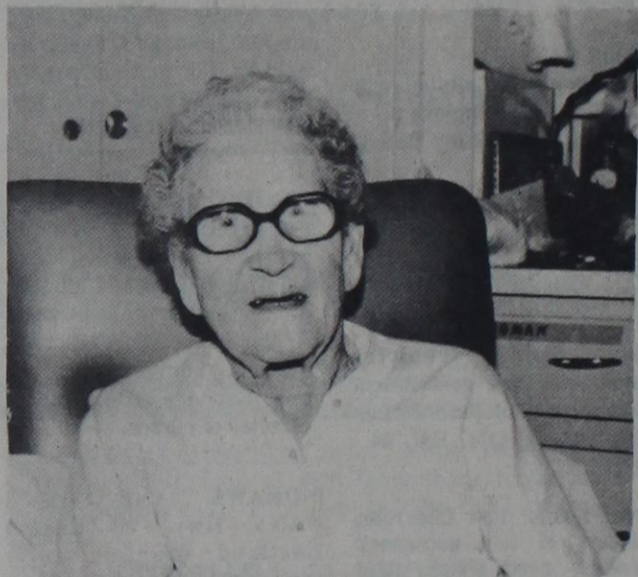

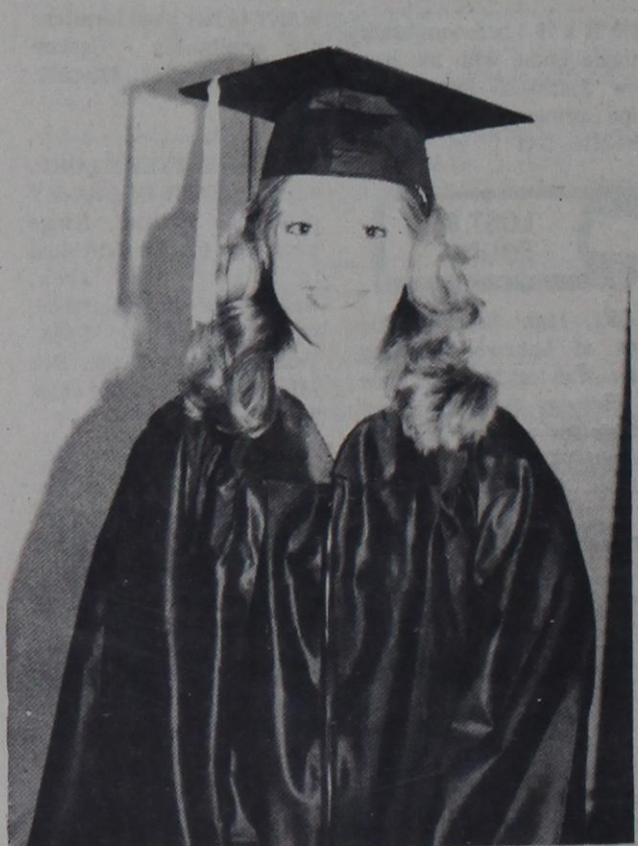

### Program Set On Lowering Estate Taxes

College Station--Farmers and ranchers have been concerned for years about high taxes that erode their estates. Now the Texas Agricultural Extension Service has developed a special program to help take the bite out of high estate taxes.

Three two-day seminars are planned which will help farmers and ranchers learn how to reduce taxable estates and learn new methods for passing their operations to the next generation.

These special seminars on "How To Lower Your Estate Tax Burden" are scheduled as follows: Lubbock, June 18-19; Wichita Falls, July 22-23; and Amarillo, Aug. 27-28.

Each seminar will begin with a discussion on estate taxes, including deductions, expenses and tax rates, points out Dr. Wayne Hayenga, a lawyer and Extension Service economist.

1981 Thursday, June 4,

Basic estate planning devices will be explained in depth. Among these are wills, by-pass trusts, gifts, equalizing estates, disclaimers and property titles.

There will also be a separate segment of the program devoted to treating beneficiaries fairly.

Another discussion will center on estate planning tools for agriculture and will deal with corporations, partnerships and selling part of the business to heirs.

The second day of the program will be devoted to special estate tax rules for agriculture. These include special farm land valuation, deferred estate tax payment rules, life insurance, "flower" bonds and other property.

Joining Hayenga in conducting the program will be Extension economists Marvin Sartin, C.P.A. and Norman Brints.

Estate planning is a step toward reduced taxes, points out Hayenga. This process should start when you plan to inherit substantial property, when you have an active and growing business, when you still have time to take tax-saving actions, when you have minor children, and when your children marry or divorce.

For more detailed information about the seminars, contact your local county Extension agent or Hayenga in the Department of Agricultural Economics, Texas A & M University, College Station, Texas 77843 or call 713-845-5446.

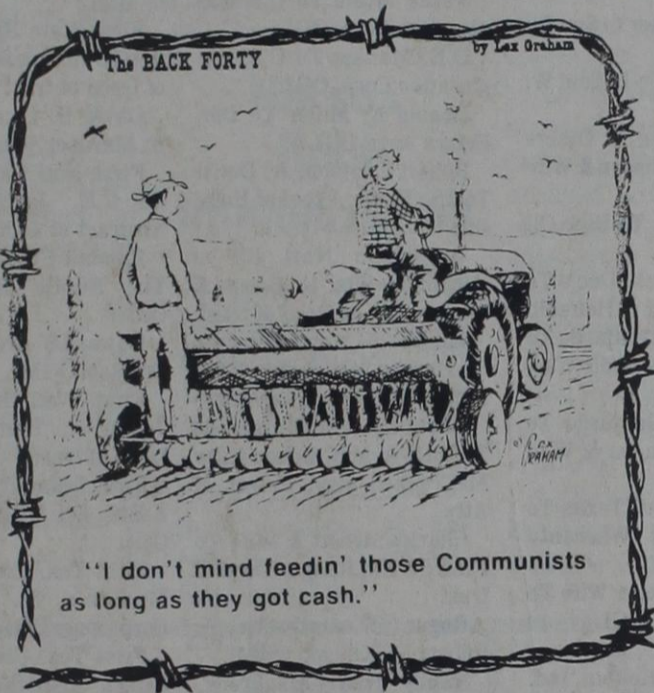

Region 4 nurses of the Texas Department of Health will hold immunizations on Thursday, June 11 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Health Department offices located at 104 North Lamar, Eastland, Tx.

**State Of Texas Has Measles Outbreak**

An outbreak of measles is occurring in the State of Texas (80 times the rate for the entire United States). Almost half of the patients are below the age of 15 months. Eighty percent are of preschool age (less than 5 years old).

The Commissioner of Health in consonance with consultative advice provided from the National Center for Disease Control has reviewed the use of measles vaccine and the following recommendations have been instituted.

1. All persons attending school, including those attending institutions of higher learning, should be fully protected against measles by vaccination or certified in writing by a physician to have had a case of measles (rubeola). In circumstances of increased risk, as explained below, consideration should be given to removing school all individuals not immunized or certified by a physician as having had measles (rubeola).

2. Texas children at increased risk of exposure to measles should be protected by an intensified schedule of immunization. The augmented special recommendations for measles immunization in all such children at increased risk of exposure to measles are as follows:

a. Single antigen measles vaccine should be administered as soon after six months of age as possible, up to the age of twelve months.

b. Children who have reached twelve months of age should receive MMR (mumps, measles, rubella) vaccine.

c. Children who received immunization against measles between six and twelve months must be reimmunized against measles at 15 months of age, using MMR vaccine.

3. There are at least two categories of children who are currently recognized to be at increased risk and requiring special protection:

a. Children living in Texas city or county which experiences measles activity (i.e. even one confirmed case of measles which exposes unprotected persons) within calendar year 1981.

b. Children at high risk of exposure to measles, such as children in families of migrant workers; or children who anticipate travel to or through any area where measles is being transmitted.

4. The severe morbidity associated with the outbreak is also unusual. Hospitalizations and cases of pneumonia were frequent, particularly in children under 15 months old. The age of the fatal case - 13 months - is within the age range for which mortality from this disease is highest.

In view of the fact that cases of measles have been reported in Region 4, an immunization clinic will be held for all who need vaccine by the above criteria. Clinic hours are 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. at 104 N. Lamar, Eastland on June 11, 1981.

**More Allotments, Peanuts for '81, But?**

College Station-- While the government has increased acreage allotments for the 1981 peanut crop to ease current short supplies, allotments--the heart of the peanut program--are in jeopardy under new farm program proposals.

Increased allotments will mean a bigger peanut crop in both Texas and the U.S. this year, points out Johnny Feagan, economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Allotments have been upped 8 percent, but the poundage quota eligible for the loan rate was reduced the maximum 5 percent. Plantings should be up 2 percent in Texas and 4 percent across the nation. This means some 315,000 acres for Texas and 1.6 million acres nationwide.

Last year's drought cut peanut production sharply, with Texas farmers harvesting 42 percent fewer acres than in 1979.

This reduced production, both in Texas and across the nation, left peanut supplies for the current marketing year at 3 billion pounds, one-third less than the previous year

and the lowest in 11 years, points out Feagan.

Because of a good crop in 1979, peanut exports were the second highest on record during the 1979-80 marketing year. However, this year's exports will be limited due to the past season's drought-plagued crop. In fact, import quotas were increased to bring in more peanuts for domestic use, notes the economist.

With these low peanut supplies, farmers can generally expect good prices for their 1981 crop. Texas farmers averaged almost 31 cents a pound for their short crop last year while the national average was about 23.5 cents.

However, farmers face higher costs and should consider forward contracting of their crops to reduce some of the risk, advocates Feagan. Contracts have been available at or around \$600 per ton for quota peanuts, with several types of contracts available for additional peanuts. Contracting allows growers to "lock in" a price for their crop and

assures shellers of a peanut supply.

Sharply higher prices for high quality peanut planting seeds are a key reason for rising production costs of the 1981 crop. Growers are paying anywhere from \$60 to more than \$100 per acre for good seed due to short supplies, notes the economist.

On the other hand, leasing of allotments is moving at a normal pace, with prices running 1.5 to 2 cents a pound. Arrangements for land and equipment vary.

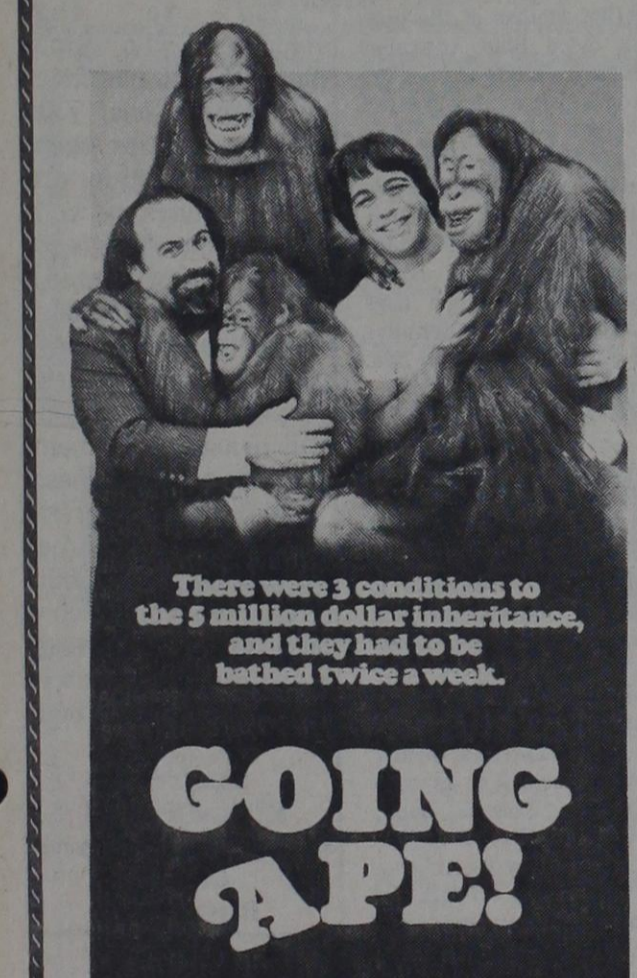

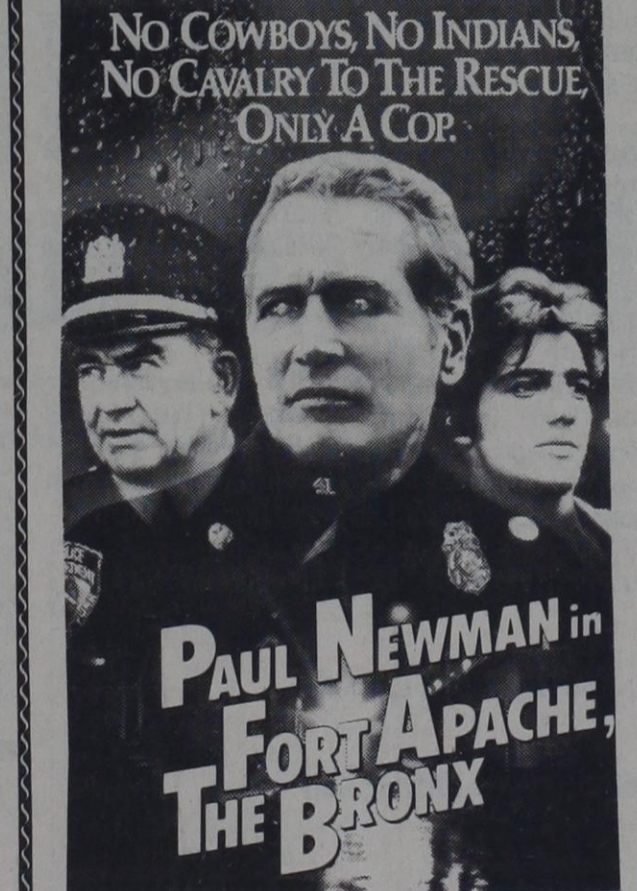

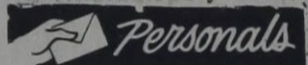

# GORDON SPOT

By DeMarquis Gordon

Have you had trouble getting your tomatoes to bloom to set fruit? Pollination has been a problem around the county. The blooms have been falling before fruit is set. The tomato bloom is classified as a perfect flower, which means that the same flower has both female and male parts. If pollen is inactivated by high temperature or made sticky by cool, wet, cloudy conditions, the female flower part will not be pollinated and the entire flower and the potential tomato will fall off.

We had about 2 weeks of cool nights. During this time few tomato blooms were pollinated. During most of last week the night temperatures have been higher and the blooms are beginning to set fruit.

If you are still having problems of fruit setting, try using a blossom-set hormone which is sold at local stores. These tomato-setting products are most effective during early spring when cool temperatures and cloudy conditions cause poor fruit set.

We have seen some Early Blight fungus on tomato leaves this past week. This disease starts out as black spots mostly on the older leaves. Tissue surrounding the spots may turn yellow and the entire leaf turns yellow. If high temperature and humidity occur at this time, much of the foliage is killed.

Fungicides should be used to prevent Early Blight. There are a number of fungicides that are recommended. Some of these and

Kocide 101, Manzate 200, Diathane M-45, Difolation 4F, Bravo and Cooper County N.

When, how and how much to water are common questions asked by gardeners. Watering is one of the most enjoyable aspects of home gardening but it is also one of the most misunderstood. Misuse of water in your home garden often causes many problems, among them soil crusting, poor root growth, blossom drop, cracked fruit, nutrient deficiencies and various types of plant diseases.

Regardless of how you water your garden, remember to apply sufficient water to wet the soil to a depth of at least 6 inches. How often to water will depend upon climatic conditions, rate of growth, stage of maturity of your garden, and soil type.

Check the soil, not the plants, to deter-

mine when to water your garden. Looking at plants for symptoms such as wilting to determine when to water is a serious mistake. Plants wilt for many reasons, such as diseases, too much fertilizer, heat or perhaps too much water. If soil is relatively moist an inch or so deep, you do not need to water. Remember, heavy soils will need watering less frequently than sandy soils.

Most gardeners water by flooding or furrow irrigation. For this method to be effective, it is best to have plants on raised beds so water can go between them. With flood or furrow irrigation, apply water slowly to soak the soil thoroughly.

Watering with a sprinkler is probably the most convenient method. It is simply a matter of placing the sprinkler where it can water the entire garden. Be sure to ann-

ly at least one inch of water at each watering. This can easily be determined by placing a coffee can in the sprinkler pattern and catching about an inch of water.

When using a sprinkler, turn it on early enough in the day to allow foliage to dry off before nighttime. Wet foliage in combination of cool nighttime temperatures often results in serious types of foliage diseases.

Drip or trickle irrigation is a relatively new concept which is gaining popularity. This type of system literally drops water onto the soil surface near plants so that it seeps slowly into the soil. This method is much more efficient than either furrow or overhead watering although the initial cost is high. However, being more efficient, these systems generally pay for themselves within a short period of time.

Paying attention to how, how much and when you water can make the difference between success or failure of your garden.

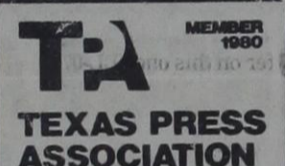

## Pressed Flower Arranging Class

Planning nutritious, appetizing meals and snacks is a major responsibility for the homemaker. Meal planning and budgeting the family food dollar is more of a challenge than ever before. The average family spends one-fifth of their income on food. The limited income family will spend an average of 1/3 of their income on food.

Here are some ideas for you to use in developing a cost-saving plan for your family. Doing the best job of food buying starts before you walk into the supermarket; it begins with inventory, meal planning, and a "super shopping list".

**TAKE INVENTORY** - Take inventory of the food in your cabinets, refrigerator and freezer. This information helps you use food ads a bit later to plan meals on a weekly basis.

**PLAN MEALS WEEKLY** - Plan meals on a weekly basis. Involve family members in the plans. They can help with menu selection and in assuring variety. This "pre-planning" a week ahead helps you make use of seasonal best buys, specials and coupons - and that saves money. Planning menus on a weekly basis also helps cut down "impulse buying", and it answers the ever-present question, "What shall I fix for dinner?"

**MAKE "SUPER SHOPPING LIST"** - Once you've taken inventory and planned your meals, make a "super shopping list". This starts with a "running" grocery list. It is a list you keep in a handy place in the kitchen so you can jot down food items on it during the week as supplies run low. Near your list, keep coupons and food ads - to keep the whole system efficient.

**BUYING STEPS** - Before you go to the store, organize your coupons and group your shopping list by areas of the

store. This helps eliminate time and added steps. Eat before shopping. You will probably do less impulse buying if you aren't hungry. Follow your shopping list, but be flexible - so you can take advantage of unadvertised specials.

**RECIPE FOR THE WEEK** - This week's recipe is entitled yeast biscuits. They are very good and very economical to make.

**Yeast Biscuits**  
2 tablespoons warm water  
1 package dry yeast  
6 cups flour  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon baking powder  
1/2 cup oil

2 1/2 cups buttermilk  
Combine warm water and yeast. Combine dry ingredients in a separate bowl. Mix dissolved yeast with oil and buttermilk mixture. Add flour mixture. Mix well. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and stow in refrigerator.

To Use: drop by tablespoons on ungreased cookie sheet at 425 degrees for 12-15 minutes. Yield 3 1/2 dozens.

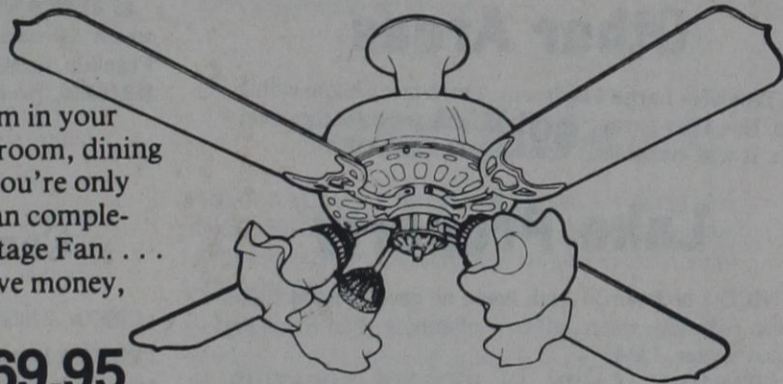

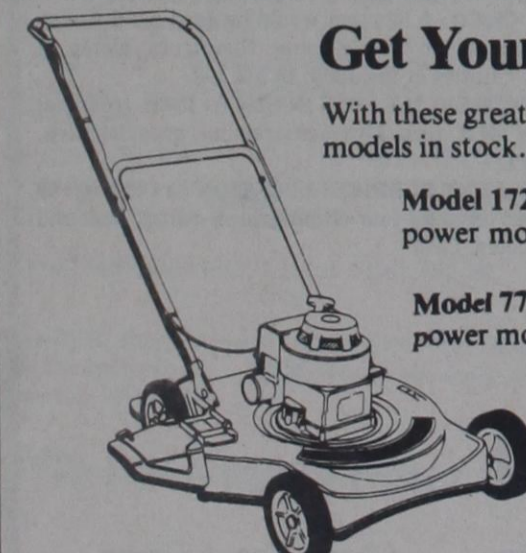
