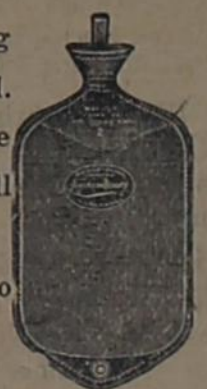

Rylander's Rain Gauge. Winter Circus Made Possible By Screen

The rain gauge at the farm of W. N. Rylander four miles north of town on Jerry's Branch shows a total rainfall for 1918 of 21.02 inches, against a total for 1917 of 11.87 inches.

It will be noted from the monthly register below that the greater part of the 1918 rainfall was during the last quarter of the year. March, July, August and September show absolutely no rain at all. The 1918 crop was made and gathered on 8.50 inches of rain and more than half of this fell in April, too late for corn planting and did not last for cotton planting. The fall by months is as follows:

Table showing monthly precipitation for 1918: January 1.25, February .50, March .475, April 4.75, May 1.25, June .75, July .75, August .425, September .440, October .387, November .2102, December .2102, Total 21.02

The January precipitation came as snow. In all this was about 7.25 inches of snow, equal to 1.25 inches of rainfall.

During the crop making period 1918 was the driest year ever known in this country.
