Cheese Easily Digested.

FIRST TO COMMENCE RECONSTRUCTION WORK

Kansas National Live Stock Association Takes "Bull by the Horns."

About the first actual reconstruction work to be taken up since the end of the war is that being done by the Kansas National Live Stock Association, which is making a strong effort to re-stock the farms of Kansas and Oklahoma, depleted of their horses and cattle by the war. And as practically every farmer and stockman has come to the point where he is no longer satisfied with "scrubs," the Association will bring to its Live Stock Exposition in Wichita, Feb. 24 to Mar. 1, thousands of head of pure bred cattle, horses, swine and sheep not only for exhibition, but for sale as well. The middle west has been scourged for this purpose and the entries will represent states as far apart as Wyoming and Alabama.

The sales of blooded stock will be held daily under the auspices of the Association itself and not by private parties and each sale will be supervised by one of the registry associations, insuring a square deal for every purchaser, large and small.

The residents of this section will never have a better opportunity to add good live stock to their herds and flocks and it is to be hoped that a goodly number of these fine animals will find their way to this county.

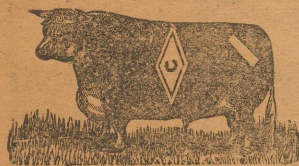
