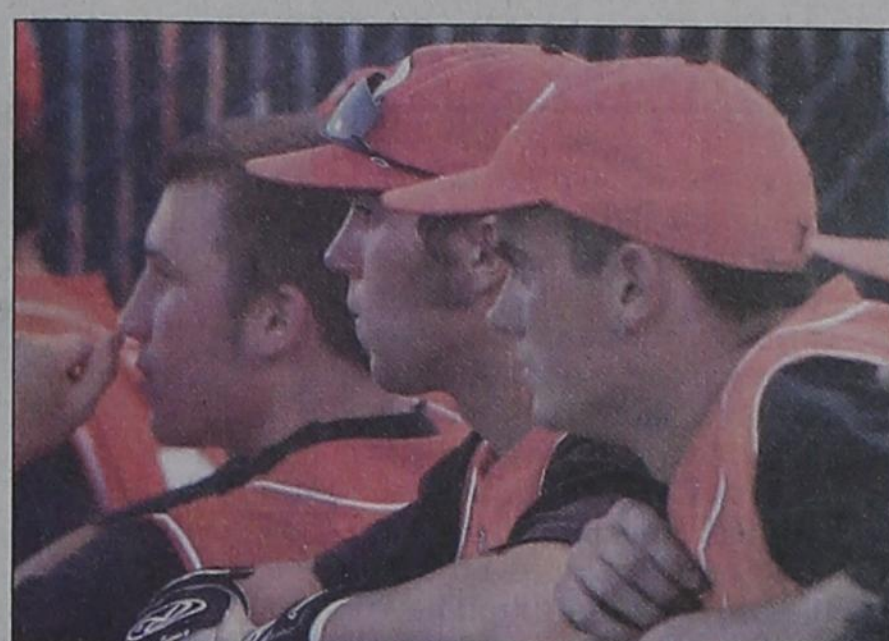

Show raises money, awareness for area child advocacy program

Sunday was a great afternoon to take a ride, and especially, to see a "ride" at the 2008 Cars for CASA Show, held at the Harbor. Kluttz named Royse City ISD Teacher of the Year

Stacy Kluttz was named Royse City ISD District Teacher of the Year at the annual employee appreciation banquet May 12. Kluttz believes educating children is not only a huge responsibility but a challenge because each year is different. Paving the Future

Commissioners tout \$100 million bond initiative

The future of a \$100 million bond initiative this November will be decided by public awareness, according to Precinct 2 County Commissioner Lorie Grinnan.

That's awareness of the bond itself - not the endemic congestion it hopes to relieve, which is obvious to just about everyone.

"A \$100 million bond isn't something that you jump at, but I truly believe this bond is important," Grinnan told the Rockwall City Council at a meeting Monday. "The majority of our roads were built 50 years ago. They were designed to carry fruits and vegetables, not thousands of cars and trucks each day."

The problem, she said, is mathematical. Rockwall County is both the smallest and fastest-growing county in Texas, and demographers predict a maximum population of 250,000 by 2030. Combining that growth with an aging transportation infrastructure is

a recipe for trouble, so earlier this year county commissioners voted to include a bond issue on the general election ballot this fall.

Financially, Grinnan said the payments would be included in local property taxes. They are based on a six percent growth rate, and "worst case scenario" charges would be three cents per \$100 home value over 10 years.

That means, in essence, that the average homeowner with a \$150,000 house would pay less than 3.75 cents per month. The average home value in the city of Rockwall is a bit higher, Grinnan said, but the formula is the same across the board.

The council publicly supported the initiative and praised Grinnan's work on the project. Their major concerns had nothing to do with local planning, but instead focused on the Texas Department of Transportation. The state agency has been dogged by allegations of poor management for months and is scheduled for an agency-wide review by the Texas Legislature later this summer.

"Do you really trust TxDOT anymore?" asked Mayor Pro Tem Stephen Straughan. "Based on our experience, a promise is made and then it doesn't happen. And it's irri-

tating that we have to pay \$100 million just to get their attention."

TxDOT bases much of its funding allocations on local involvement, Grinnan said. The bond initiative is designed to support work on segmented and partially completed projects, and the more weight local governments can bear, the more likely the projects will be completed. She said the system is complicated, but consistent on this issue - passing the bond will increase the chances of renovating roads in Rockwall, and passing it sooner will be cheaper than passing it later.

Many council members agreed with Straughan, and hoped the institutional review would make TxDOT's policies more fair. Mayor Bill Cecil agreed, but said the worries at the state level should not discourage local involvement.

"There's a lot of finger pointing right now, not just from TxDOT and the state, but also at the federal level. And there's been a real push for changes from the public," Cecil said. "I can tell you this, though. From a historical perspective, if you've got a project ready to go and you've already dealt with all the collaborative issues, that project will get funded before other projects."

those attending were members of the Concrete Lizards, a car club from Garland. They have been in existence for about 13 years. Everyone is "the President," they have no meetings but they have a blast together.

By the end of the afternoon, judges awarded over 40 total prizes in various categories. The "Best of Show" Awards with their respective vehicle category went to: Car-Joe Gonzales, '52 Chevy; Truck-Leroy Haden, '40 pickup; Motorcycle-T.J. Nevins-Mayer, '03 Indian Vintage Chief; and Rat Rod-Tom Potts, '46 Chevy.

The "People's Choice" Award went to Jerolyn and Harley Finnell and their "Harley Davidson" F-150 Ford truck, dedicated to their son. Each of the Finnell team wore orange shirts with an touching inscription on the back, "in loving memory of Blake 'Fuzion' Finnell, missed but not forgotten" (1986-2007).

Best Paint Award went to Lawrence Horton for his '51 GMC truck. Best Interior Award went to Lonnie McSwain and his '54 Chevy Bel Air. Best Engine Award went to Rick Stokes for his '55 Chevy Bel Air. And Billy McSwain won the Best Graphics Award with his '04 Black Chevy SSR. Additionally, cars, trucks, and motorcycles were awarded "Top 25" status. Tracy Welborn, win-

Though a fun-filled afternoon, this event had a very serious function - to raise the awareness of CASA and the need for more volunteers. Many people ask, "Just what is CASA?" Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs) are people who fight to ensure that children have a safe and permanent home. A child advocate volunteer is a "voice" for an abused or neglected child.

Lone Star CASA, a non-profit organization, has joined the national movement to ensure that children going through a complicated legal process have representatives coming alongside attorneys and caseworkers to speak for the individual needs of each child. Last year, 42 volunteers logged over 2000 hours helping 115 children of Rockwall and Kaufman counties through the court system.

The need is great. Currently in Texas, less than 30 percent of abused and neglected children have a CASA volunteer. That translates to around 16,000 children who need help today. Gideon and his servant, Purah, went to spy on the Midianites.

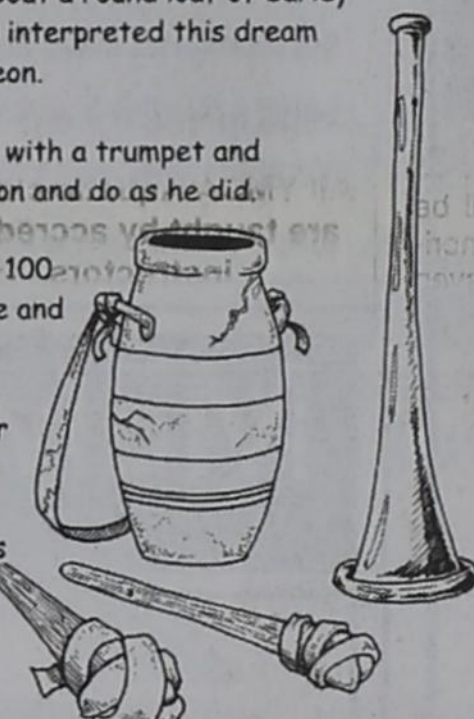

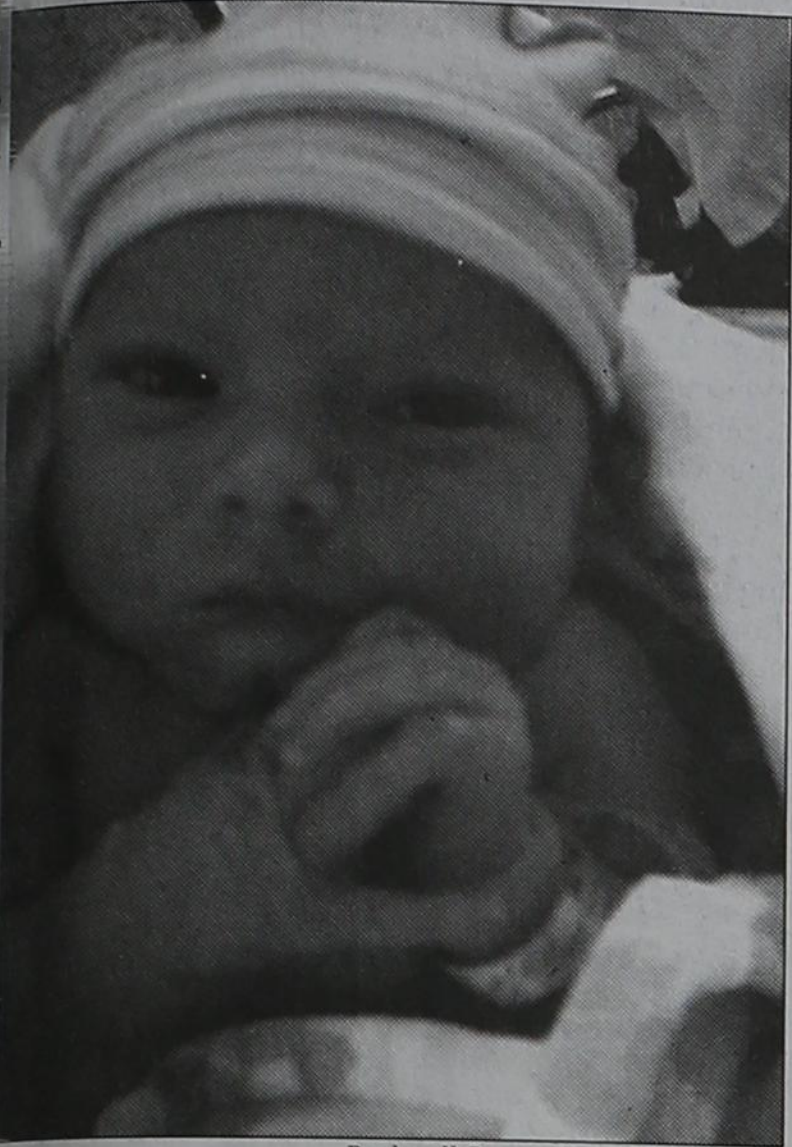

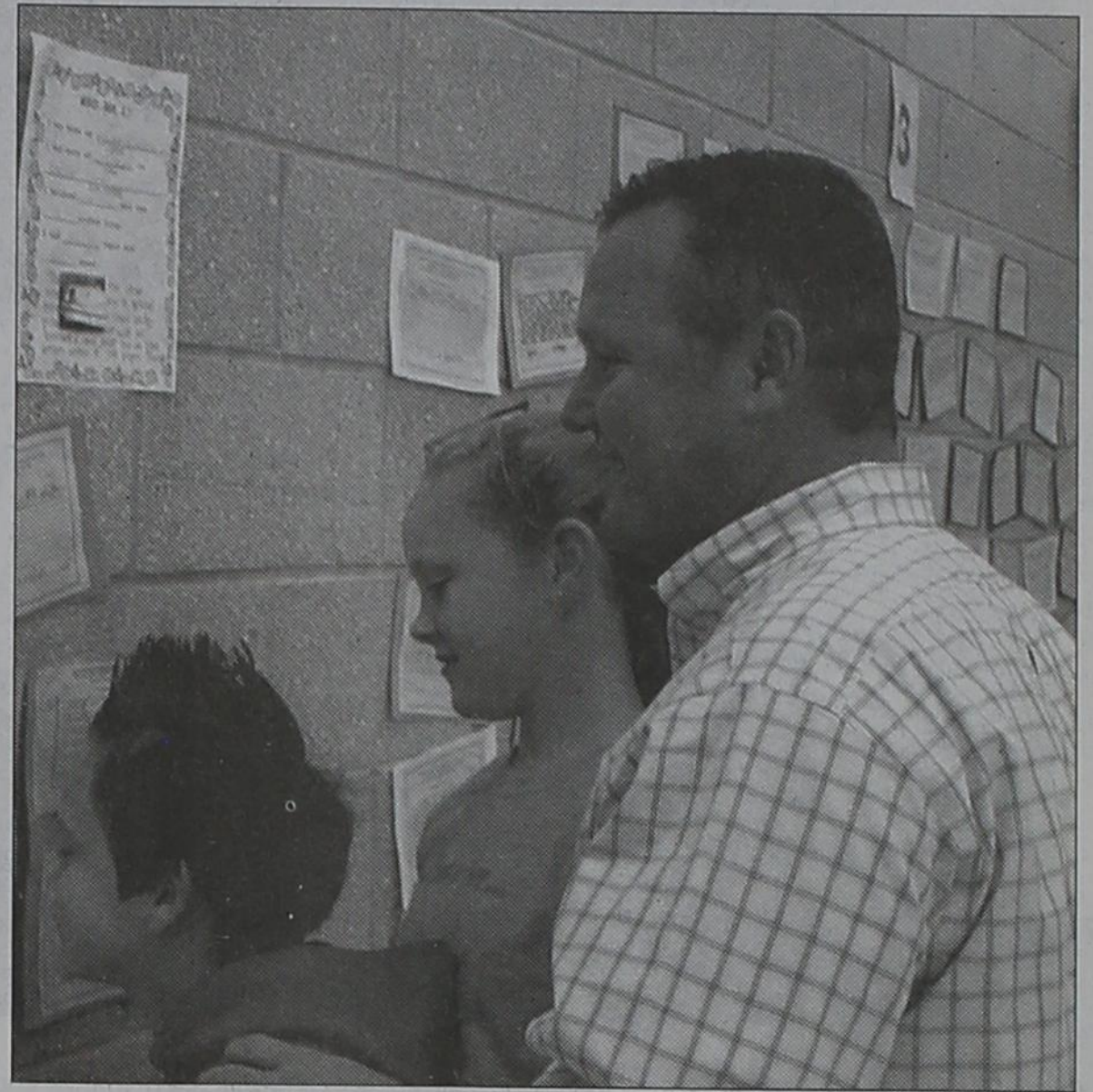
Hays Elementary PTA sponsors April 11 event

TRANSLATION: You are next on our list of people to harass into refinancing.

3. Correspondence that refers to renegotiating or restructuring is a disguise for a refinancing.

4. Mortgages of "Cut Your House Payments in Half" - A misrepresentation of an Option ARM.

5. YOU CANNOT BORROW MONEY AT A RATE OF 1% - A predatory advertisement that currently discloses an Annual Percentage Rate (APR) less than 5.5%.

6. Instant falsehood.

7. It's my personal favorite - "This property qualifies for the Economic Advantage Effective Interest Rate Reduction Program."

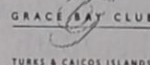

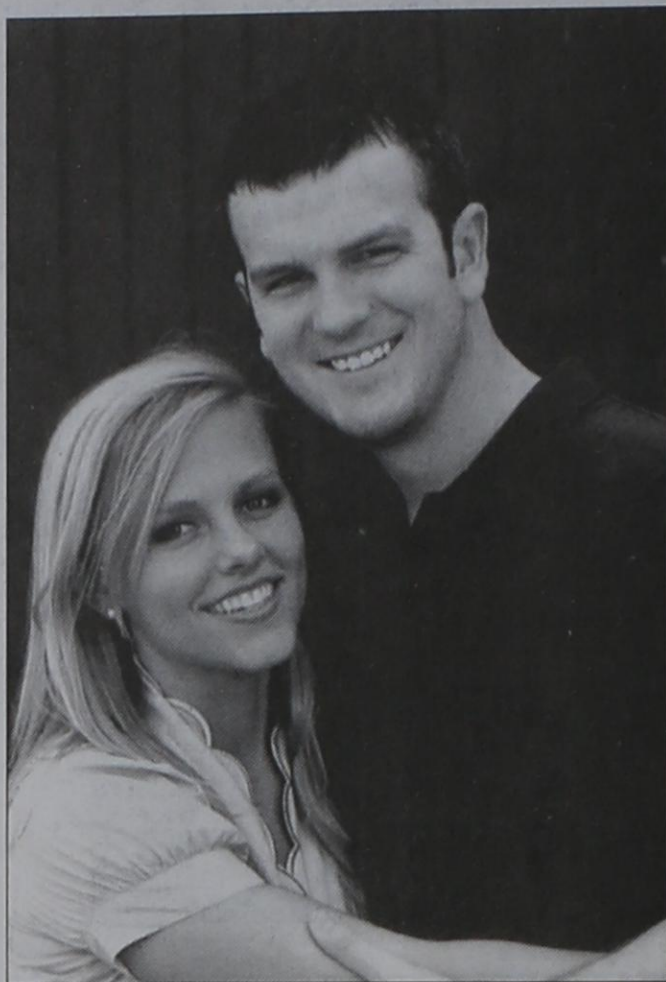

Reading for Adults program completes successful year

The Reading for Adults program at the Rockwall County library has had a successful year despite the challenges of getting ready to move to a new location in September.

Funding from the Wish Your Well Foundation, local donors and Friends of Rockwall County Library have helped make the literacy program a success.

The program also is in need of additional funding for books and materials to meet the increased demand.

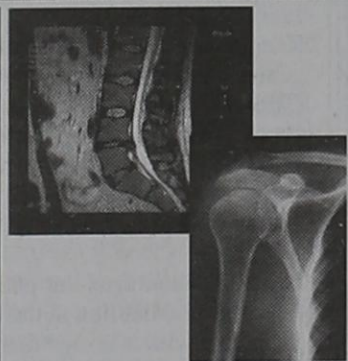

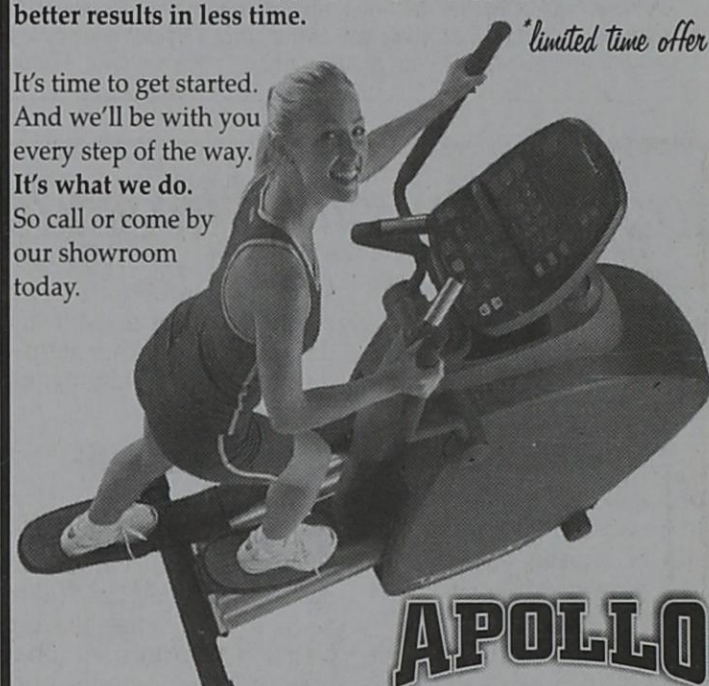

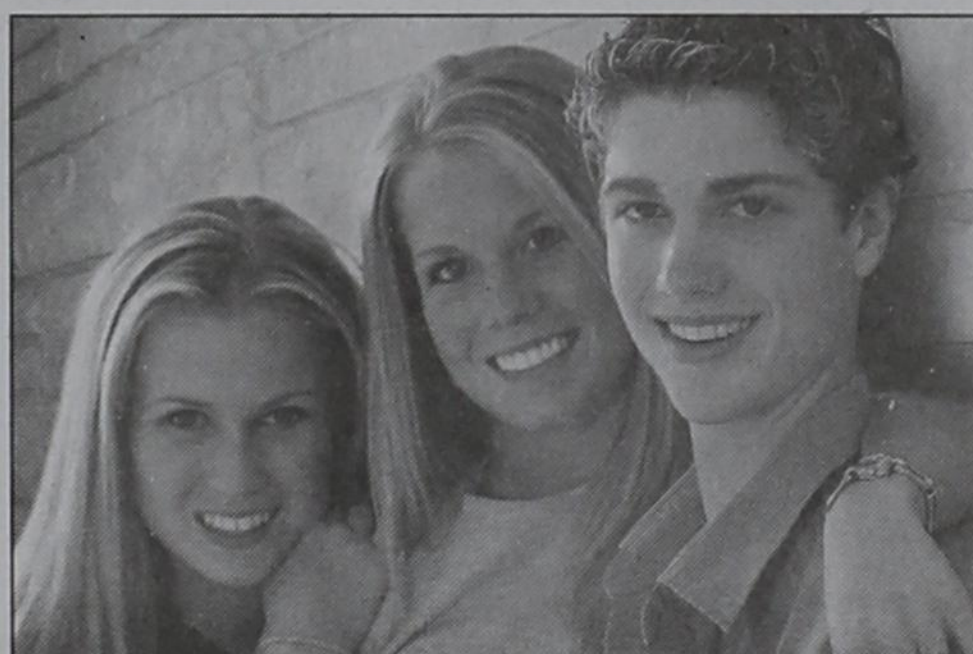

Everybody's ever said an Angle Food Cake has to be 'perfect'

Good news about angel food cake is nothing to do with baking a perfect thing into thick slices, and serving big bowls with syrupy strawberries cream. Memories of Angle Food Cakes pack. What that means is most of us bakers could get away with and still have a good tasting cake. For the marathon bakers of us also spent an entire day seppings, weighing the whites into small jars, and labeling them for the freezer. When we finished, our hands were slick with whites, and we could probably have had an egg with our eyes closed. It isn't until much later that we learned

angel food cake was probably invented by frugal Pennsylvania Dutch cooks who created the recipe to use leftover egg whites. In their knowing way, they must have understood something about chemistry. The batter is mostly egg whites, which are beaten until foamy and folded with flour and sugar. In the oven, the airy foam produces steam, which makes the cake rise. To conserve as much air as possible, bakers turn off the mixer the moment the whites form perfect peaks. They also go easy on the folding.

Now we all get another shot at the angel food cake, but this time it's deliciously different. This version, with fresh thyme and lemon zest, has not been tweaked with experi-

mental amounts of anything and is ideal for layering with fruit and ice cream.

Thyme Angel Food Cake

- 1 cup cake flour
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 10 egg whites, room temperature
- 1 tsp. cream of tartar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3 tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 3 tbsp. stemmed thyme leaves
- 2 tbsp. finely grated lemon zest

Preheat oven to 350F. Sift flour and confectioners' sugar together.

Beat egg whites with a mixer at high speed until foamy. Add cream of tartar and salt; beat until soft peaks form. Beat in lemon juice, then beat in granulated sugar in 2-tablespoon increments, allowing each to become incorporated before adding the next. Beat in thyme and lemon zest.

Fold flour mixture into egg white mixture with a rubber spatula. Spoon batter into an ungreased 10-inch tube pan.

Bake 35 minutes or until cake is lightly browned and springy to the touch, about 35 minutes. Invert pan; cool completely. Loosen cake from sides of pan using a narrow metal spatula. Transfer cake to a serving plate. Serves 12.

Can fresh produce spark creative ideas?

When I lived overseas the best place to use fresh produce was at the market. Weekly, fresh vegetables were trucked to a city from outlying farms. While supermarket goods tended to be overpriced, I could be guaranteed of fresh produce at the market. Each Wednesday morning I loaded my large wicker basket into the back of my van and drove to do my shopping.

The scene was busy. Half the women in the market of Quito were shopping - the other half were shopping for their children. After finding a parking spot I went to the back of the van to get my basket. Without fail Maria appeared. Maria had a big smile and a cheery greeting. Maria made her living by carrying baskets. With Maria behind me I navigated my way through the maze of people, the potatoes. Purple, brown, red, and in all sizes, the choice was staggering. Taking time to chat with the seller was not only pleasant but also practical. She and I exchanged pleasantries as she deftly weighed and bagged produce, then laid them in the bottom of my basket. From the neatly packed rows of carrots, broccoli, lettuce and other vegetables I avoided making my selection. I avoided anything that was grown to a large size, my children would not eat it. No amount of cooking could make them palatable.

Next, the fruit. There was a dizzying array of familiar and unfamiliar fruit. Papaya, pineapple, all kinds of melons and tropical delicacies gave off a warm, sweet odor. When I purchased avocados I was asked, "When will you be serving them?" She had them in varying stages

of ripeness and I could count on the avocados being perfect when I told her when I planned to serve them.

Fresh tomatoes were always available and I used to make a dish with bread cubes, sliced tomatoes, mozzarella cheese and an onion topping. Wanting to preserve the flavors, but trying to cut back on empty carbohydrates, I developed this recipe and included zucchini for more flavor and texture. It's suitable for the first stage of the South Beach Diet.

Tomato Zucchini Bake

- 1 medium onion, chopped finely
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 2 tbsp. butter or margarine
- 1 tsp. olive oil
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. dried basil
- 2 medium zucchini, ends trimmed, sliced 1/4 inch thick
- 3-4 medium tomatoes, sliced 1/4 inch thick
- 20-25 pieces of partly skim mozzarella cheese, each 1 1/2 inches square, 1/4 inch thick

Heat butter and olive oil in a medium skillet. Add onion and sauté gently until tender, 5-7 minutes. Add garlic and sauté another minute. Add salt, pepper and basil.

In a round, non-greased baking dish, layer alternate slices of tomato, zucchini and mozzarella cheese, spiraling in to the center. Spoon the onion-garlic mixture over top.

Bake at 400 degrees for 15-20 minutes, until hot and slightly tender.

This dish can be prepared a few hours in advance and then baked at the last minute.

Wine Guys

Paso Robles winery is offering great values from central coast

I've tasted so many good wines recently this week we are playing catch up. Here are some good juice options to try:

Redwood Creek Pinot Noir 2006 (\$15). The wine is made in California but from grapes grown in the Languedoc-Roussillon region of France. Simple red cherry and strawberry flavors with a smooth texture.

Gabbiano Alleanza 2005 (\$35). This Italian blend of merlot (70 percent), sangiovese and cabernet sauvignon is a great value for those of you looking for a complex wine for under \$50. Huge aromas of sweet cherries, cinnamon and pepper. Cherry and blackberry flavors with spice and tobacco notes. Velvet texture make it a quaffable wine to serve alongside meat and cheese.

Ruffino Il Ducale 2004 (\$24). We love interesting Italian blends and this is a beauty. Made up of primarily sangiovese (80 percent), merlot and cabernet sauvignon, the wine has cherry and plum aromas, blackberry and dark chocolate flavors, soft tannins and long finish. It would go well with parmigiano reggiano or pecorine romano cheeses.

Primus 2005 (\$21). Vermont's fabled winemaker Agustin Huneeus believes in Chile's carmenere grape and has been determined to make a world-class wine from the indigenous grape. It stands out nicely in this blend of 17 percent carmenere, 32 percent cabernet sauvignon and 51 percent merlot. Characterized by pronounced spices, the Primus has good body, cherry notes and big tannins.

Domaine Phillippe & Vincent Jaboulet Syrah 2005 (\$15). Here is a simple red wine suitable for sipping or alongside pasta, hamburgers or other simple fare. Bright berry fruit. If you want something more complex, try the Crozes-Hermitage Rouge (\$28) from the same region. More gutsy, but still abundant in ripe fruit.

Henry's Drive Shiraz 2006 (\$36). Mouth-filling plum and boysenberry fruit with a hint of chocolate and mint. Layered, complex flavor with good depth - serve with meats and grilled foods. The 2005 reserve shiraz (\$54) is a phenomenal wine, albeit more expensive.

Sbragia Family Vineyards Gino's Vineyard Zinfandel (\$28). From the Dry Creek region, this fruit-packed zinfandel tantalizes the palate with juicy blackberry, raspberry flavors and hints of clove and black pepper.

St. Agnes Vineyards Alexander Valnernet Sauvignon 2004 (\$25). Big and bold, this plum and spice flavored wine has a rich texture to make it enjoyable now.

St. Agnes Vineyards Symmetry (\$25). Rich blackberry and cassis fla-

vors with hint of chocolate and spice. Fruit forward and packed with soft fruit flavor.

Redwood Creek Pinot Noir 2006 (\$15). The wine is made in California but from grapes grown in the Languedoc-Roussillon region of France. Simple red cherry and strawberry flavors with a smooth texture.

Gabbiano Alleanza 2005 (\$35). This Italian blend of merlot (70 percent), sangiovese and cabernet sauvignon is a great value for those of you looking for a complex wine for under \$50. Huge aromas of sweet cherries, cinnamon and pepper. Cherry and blackberry flavors with spice and tobacco notes. Velvet texture make it a quaffable wine to serve alongside meat and cheese.

Ruffino Il Ducale 2004 (\$24). We love interesting Italian blends and this is a beauty. Made up of primarily sangiovese (80 percent), merlot and cabernet sauvignon, the wine has cherry and plum aromas, blackberry and dark chocolate flavors, soft tannins and long finish. It would go well with parmigiano reggiano or pecorine romano cheeses.

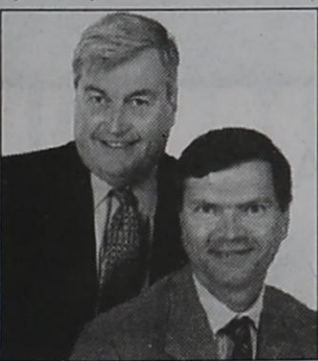
Primus 2005 (\$21). Vermont's fabled winemaker Agustin Huneeus believes in Chile's carmenere grape and has been determined to make a world-class wine from the indigenous grape. It stands out nicely in this blend of 17 percent carmenere, 32 percent cabernet sauvignon and 51 percent merlot. Characterized by pronounced spices, the Primus has good body, cherry notes and big tannins.

Domaine Phillippe & Vincent Jaboulet Syrah 2005 (\$15). Here is a simple red wine suitable for sipping or alongside pasta, hamburgers or other simple fare. Bright berry fruit. If you want something more complex, try the Crozes-Hermitage Rouge (\$28) from the same region. More gutsy, but still abundant in ripe fruit.

Henry's Drive Shiraz 2006 (\$36). Mouth-filling plum and boysenberry fruit with a hint of chocolate and mint. Layered, complex flavor with good depth - serve with meats and grilled foods. The 2005 reserve shiraz (\$54) is a phenomenal wine, albeit more expensive.

Sbragia Family Vineyards Gino's Vineyard Zinfandel (\$28). From the Dry Creek region, this fruit-packed zinfandel tantalizes the palate with juicy blackberry, raspberry flavors and hints of clove and black pepper.
