#### Olustee Citizen Held on Charge of Wheat Theft

The preliminary trial of J. E. West, of Olustee, on charge of stealing 20 bushels of wheat from the granary of Mr. Wright, living 8 miles southwest of Olustee on Aug. 29, this year, was held before Justice H C Gilliand Mon-



stamp out hog cholera. According to reports and all indications the disease seems to be getting hogs this fall as last season, and to check it and keep it from spreading is now up to farmers. It appears to the Reporter, that one of the benefits it would be to the stockmen in being organized under Mr. Spears' plan, would be where they attended their local meeting regularly, there they could find out where new cases of cholera had broke out in the community, where the disease was prevaling worst among the hogs and incidently learn of many other things at the meetings that would be to their advantage.

Near this time last year when cholera was thinning out so many herds in the community, the Reporter at the request of our Coun ty Farm Demonstrator, reproduced an article written by Dr. Frank R. Jones, U. S. Veternary Field Surgeon, regarding the treatment of hogs infected with cholera and suggestions as to how to keep the disease from spreading. The suggestions are logical ones, and since the same disease seems to be getting another hold among the hogs, we are again publishing the suggestions interior to sunlight offered by Dr. Jones with the hope that they may of some benefit to some farmer in this coun-

TO KEEP HOG CHOLERA FROM ed. REACHING YOUR HERD

Locate your hog lots and pastures away from streams and public highways, and not allow

Do not visit your neighbor or of you have hog cholera on prem

Do not drive into hogs when returning from market or after driving on public highways.

Do not use hog lots for yarding wagons and farm implements Do not place newly purchased stock, stock secured for breeding fourth Thursdays in each purposes, or stock exhibited at county fairs, with your herd Keep such stock quarenteed a least two weeks and use care to prevent carrying infection from these to other pens in feeding and attending stock.

Burn to ashes or cover with

feet of earth all dead animals and the viscra removed from animals at butchering time because they attract the attention of just as strong hold among the buzzards, dogs, etc., which are liable to carry hog cholera infec-

Confine your dogs and do not keey pigeons unless you confine

IF HOG CHOLERA APPEARS IN YOUR HERD

Treat your hogs immediately with anti-hog cholera serum, after which they should be kept on a light diet and pure drinking water, and confined to limited quarters that may be cleaned daily and sprayed three times a week with one part of compound cresol solution, to thirty parts of water, until the disease has abated in the herd. To obtain the best results the serum must be administered before the disease has progressed in the herd.

Notify your neighbors that your herd is infected, that they may take the necessary precautions to keep hog cholera from reaching their herds.

TO RID PREMISES OF INFECTION Remove all manure and saturate with quick lime.

Burn all litter, rubbish and old

hog troughs. After the premises are thoroughly cleansed, spray walls. floors and other surfaces with diainfectant (one part compound cresol solution to thirty parts water). Where hog houses are small turn them over, exposing

Wallow holes and cess pools should be filled in, drained or fenced off.

All runs underneath buildings should be cleaned and disinfect-

Don't trust your own knowledge of hog cholera. If your hogs get sick consult your County Demonstration Agent or write describing symptoms, to


