## Orient Train to California

Through Freight Service From Kansas City Goes On June 29

A new fast freight on the Orient railroad between Kansas City and Los Angeles Cal., will be put in operation next Sunday June 29.

The time between those two points will be 149 1-2 hours west bound and 146 hours east bound.

This fast freight will travel over three roads, Orient, Southern Pacific, and Missouri Pacific. It will come to Wichita from Kansas City via Missouri Pacific. From Wichita to Alpine Tex., the Orient road bed will be used, and from Alpine to Los Angeles the train will run on the Southern Pacific.

The establishments of this fast freight has been planned for some time, but complete arrangements could not be made sooner. The train will pass through Wichita at 12 o'clock each day.

## Contract Let For Bank Building

Odell Contractor Lands The Job Over Three Other Contesting Bids

Bids for the construction work of the new brick building the Bank of Odell is to have built on west main street was opened Tuesday, and the contract was given to J. H. Gobbell one of the home contractors, who underbid the next lowest bid submitted \$131, his bid for the work being \$2459. 25.

The contract calls for a building, 25x50 ft, with an up-to-date vault. The brick to be used in the building is to be of a gray like appearance; work to be finished and the house turned over to the bank about the middle of August.

While at this writing no preparations are being made by contractor Gobbell for starting the work, but all necessary arrangements will be made soon, and another brick building be started in Odell.

This building when completed with its plate glass front will add considerably to the looks of the west corner of the street on which it will stand.

## Heavy Rains Over Country

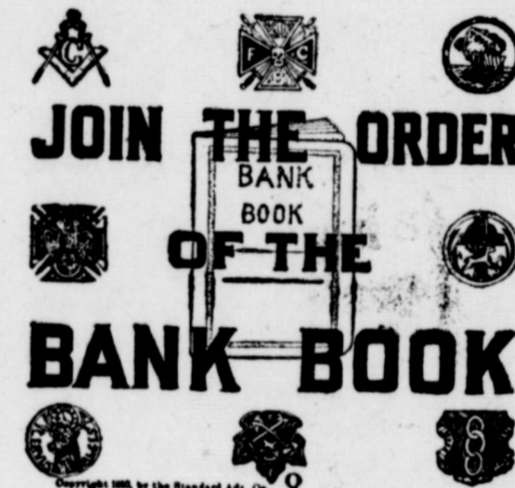
