Former Burkett Man United States Supreme Court Killed In An Accident

Strickland, an employee of Medford Walker Trucking company, was on the car directing operations when struck on the head by a chain hoist. He died enroute to a Baird hospital.

How to Store Dry Foods COFFEE or jam jars with screw tops and pint or quart mason jars make handy receptacles in which to store rice, cereals, spa-

ghetti and other dry foods in cup-
