# Freedom In Truth

"YE SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH, AND THE TRUTH SHALL MAKE YOU FREE".  
JNO. 8:32

"So faith cometh by hearing by the word of God," said Paul in Rom. 10:17. This can be true with respect to the true faith. Faith that comes from the word of God or untrue faith. It comes from hearing. The faith that an individual possesses comes in a great degree from what he has heard. Some one has said, "We are all what we are because of what we have been taught." Therefore we believe what we have been taught. Now if one has been taught nothing but the pure

unadulterated word of God he will know and believe nothing but that. In Matthew 15 and Mark 7 Jesus was confronted with people who had been taught part of

the word of God, and also the traditions of the fathers. Their faith was a mixture of God's word and the traditions of the fathers and Jesus condemned them. He said, "Ye make void the word of God by your tradition." He further said concerning their traditions, "Every plant my heavenly Father planted not, shall be rooted up." So it behooves each of us to make sure our faith, what we believe is based on nothing

but "thus saith the Lord". Paul came to Ephesus in Acts chapter 19 and found twelve men who had been taught in part. Their faith was strong in what they had been taught, but when asked if they had received the Holy Spirit when they believed, they said,

"Nay, we did not so much as hear whether the Holy Spirit was given. And he said, Into what then were ye baptized? And they said John's baptism." Paul explained that John's baptism was not in effect at that time, so "they were baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus". These men had not been completely taught. Their faith was strong in as far as they had been taught, but they had not been taught the complete truth. When they received

the baptism that was valid at that time must be in the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized. "Without faith it is impossible to please God." Heb. 11:6. What kind of faith? A faith that come from nothing but the gospel of Christ. A faith mixed with the gospel and the teaching and traditions of men will never please God. **THINK** on these things.
