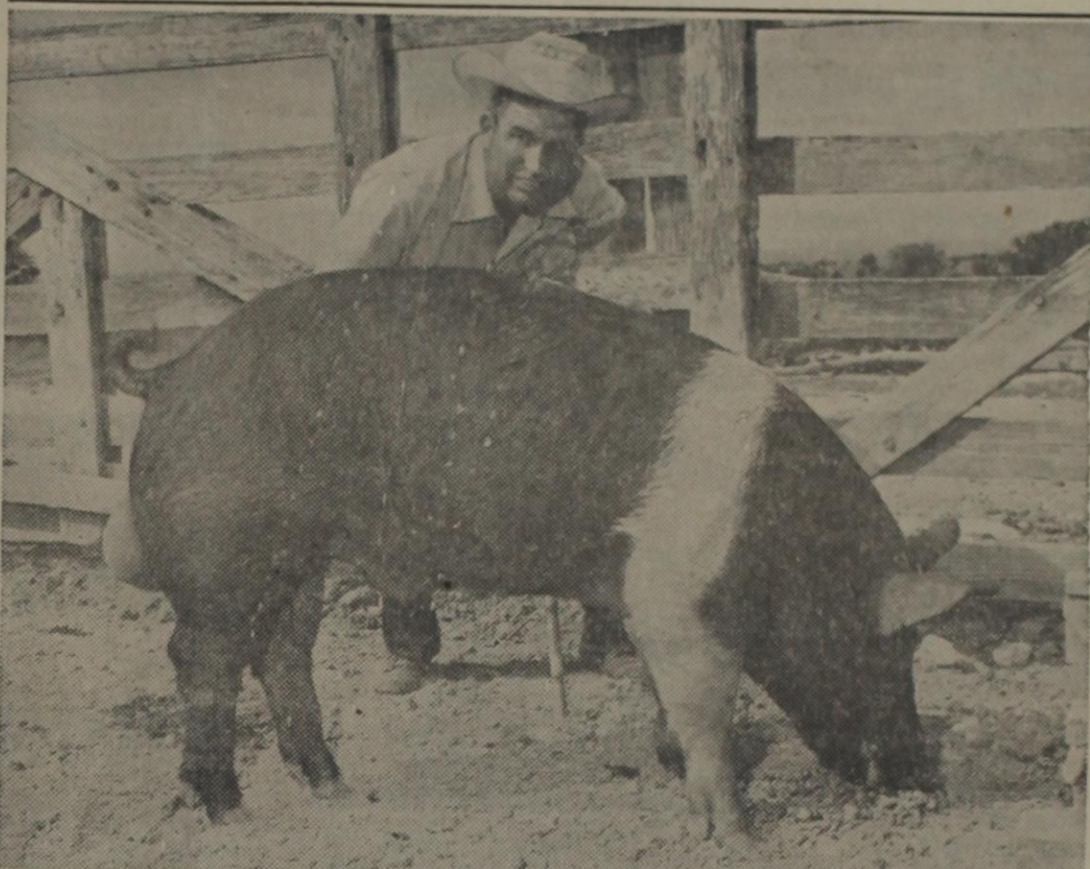

This is Bimbo, one of the prize Texas Hampshire boars that will compete against Iowa Hampshires on Oct. 9 at the State Fair of Texas in Dallas for the "Blue Boy" championship. "Blue Boy" was the champion boar that was one of the "stars" of 20th Century-Fox's new version of the movie "State Fair," which was filmed at the State Fair of Texas. Since the original locale of the novel "State

Fair" and of previous movie versions was the Iowa State Fair, officials of the State Fair of Texas challenged Iowa Hampshire breeders to produce a better type of "Blue Boy" than the Texas type. #### TO ATTEND NATIONAL FFA CONVENTION

R. C. Lewis will depart from Amarillo on Monday, October 8, 1962, to attend the National Future Farmers of America Convention to be held in Kansas City, Missouri next week. He will join the other FFA members who will attend from Area I. The special car will be taken from Amarillo by Santa Fe.

He will be a guest of the Convention during the week. He will be in the ceremony Wednesday, October 10, when the American Farmer Degrees will be conferred on those who attained the degree during 1962. He was approved last June, but the actual conferring of the degree takes place at the National Convention.

To be eligible for the American Farmer Degree, a boy must be a Lone Star Farmer, be out of school at least one year, have earned at least \$1,000.00 in FFA work, shown outstanding ability in leadership and participation in FFA activities, and hardest of all, he must be included in the quota for the degree. The quota is one American Farmer for each 1,000 members in the FFA. To receive the degree, a candidate must be able to be selected over the other applicants. All candidates from Area I far exceeded the minimum qualifications, but only the top five could be selected to receive the degree. This is the highest degree that is given by the Fu-
