Sprinkle with reserved 2 tablespoons grated cheese and 1/2 teaspoon oregano. Arrange two rows of cheese slices over all. Cover tightly with aluminum foil. Bake in a moderate (350°F.) oven 20 minutes; remove foil. Uncover 10 minutes, or until sauce is bubbly and cheese is partly
