# Maurice Whitehead's Car Is Stolen -- Cotton Trailer Tires stolen and slashed

Monday night the local phone booth was robbed and a car stolen from Maurice Whitehead.

Deputy City Marshal told the Plainsman:

"There is no doubt but that I was sitting across the highway from the phone booth when it was robbed. The fog was heavy but I could see the booth, and I heard some boys talking. I thought they were putting in a phone call.

"They left, and later a car without lights drove out on the highway. I tried to stop them but they kept going. I shot at the car twice and know I hit it. I kept after them and they turned off on a dirt road and jumped out of the car and took off across a field. I could not catch them, so I came back to town to get someone to drive the car in, and while I was gone they returned to the car and escaped.

"However, I did get the car they had driven into Ropes. It had been stolen in Brownfield."

The Whitehead car was found in Amarillo where the thugs had deserted it. According to Sheriff Weir Clem there is a gang working out of Fort Worth, making a specialty of stealing cars and robbing phone booths. Phone booths have been robbed at Meadow, Anton and Ropes.

## Harvest Skids To Halt As Rain Falls Over The Ropes Territory

Intermittent rain and drizzle during this week has brought the cotton and grain harvest to a jarring halt.

The damp weather was set off by a cold front which moved into the area Sunday night when thunder storms

were reported over the South Plains. By Tuesday the sky was completely overcast and an almost continual drizzle was falling, with rain squalls at intervals.

Reports from five gins in the territory showed that up

to the time of the rain 6,141 bales had been ginned. We were unable to get a report from Buster's Gin, due to telephone trouble.

Most of the remaining crops will probably be gathered with machines.

The grain harvest was also stopped, but is near its finish, and according to reports from the two Ropes elevators 530 cars of grain had been bought up to Wednesday.

Sheriff Weir Clem and two deputies spent Wednesday working in Ropes on a case involving the theft of wheels and tires off a trailer belonging to Doyle Dean Darby and working in town with City Marshal Dub Riney and the Deputy City Marshal, trying to locate persons guilty of slashing more than forty tires on trailers at the Coop Gin.

Wednesday afternoon Sheriff Clem picked up four Latin Americans who confessed to taking the tires from the trailer, but denied any part in the tire slashing. Clem is of the opinion that they are guilty of both offenses. However the Deputy City Marshal told the Plainsman he had thirteen suspects who were involved in turning the trailers over. These will be questioned by the sheriff and other officials before the week is out.

A Latin-American, who is employed at the gin, said the depredation took place a little after nine o'clock Tuesday night. That he saw the boys, who appeared to be between the ages of eighteen and nineteen, cutting the tires, but that he was afraid they would jump on him with the knives if he said anything, so he went back into the house.

Sheriff Clem told us: "We are going to get the ones who are guilty. If the ones we have in custody did not cut the tires we are going to get the ones who did."

### Wreck Victims

#### Said Improving

According to information given the Plainsman Tuesday G. R. Johnson and Robert Hudson, who were critically injured in a car wreck near San Angelo on Saturday, the 21st, and are in a San Angelo hospital, are showing improvement.

It is said that if Mr. Johnson continues to improve as he has the past few days, he will be able to return to his home in Lubbock the last of this week. He suffered a cut on his forehead which required several stitches, broken ribs which punctured his lung, a broken left leg below the knee, and several abrasions.

Mr. Hudson was severely cut about the face, but is recovering as well as could be expected, after suffering two heart attacks.

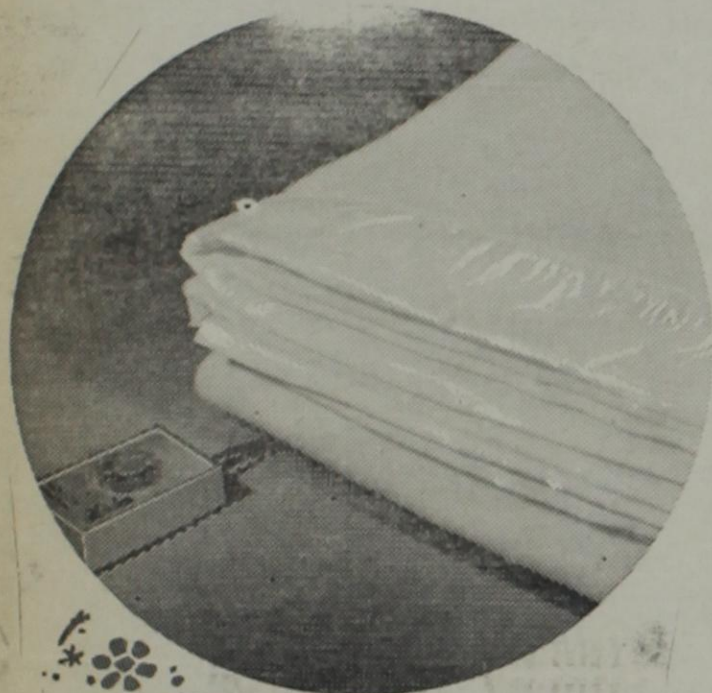

"Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" Jno. 8:32
