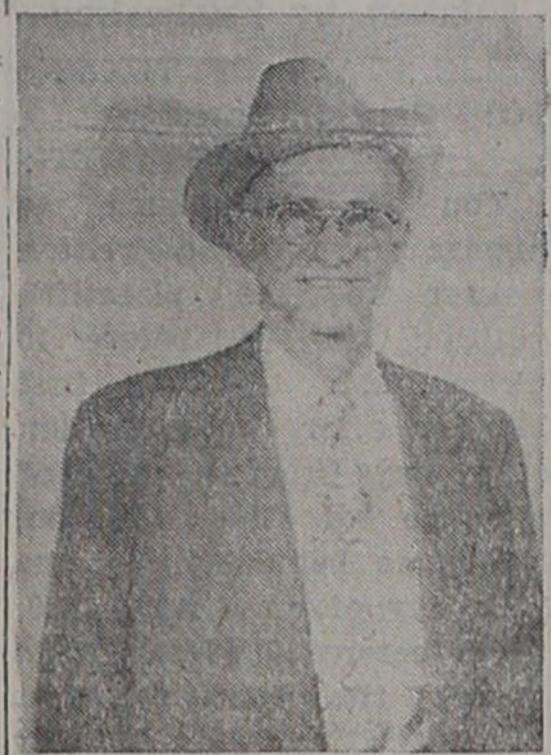

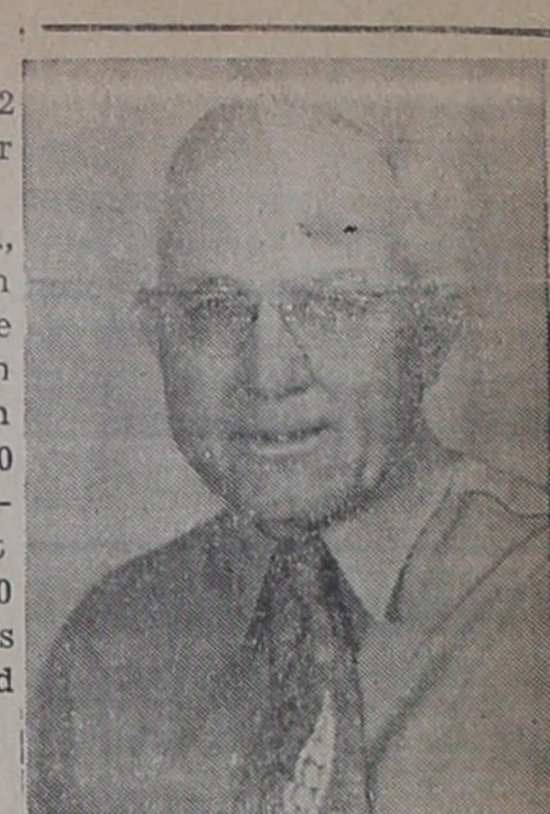

Other members have attended certain days, also.

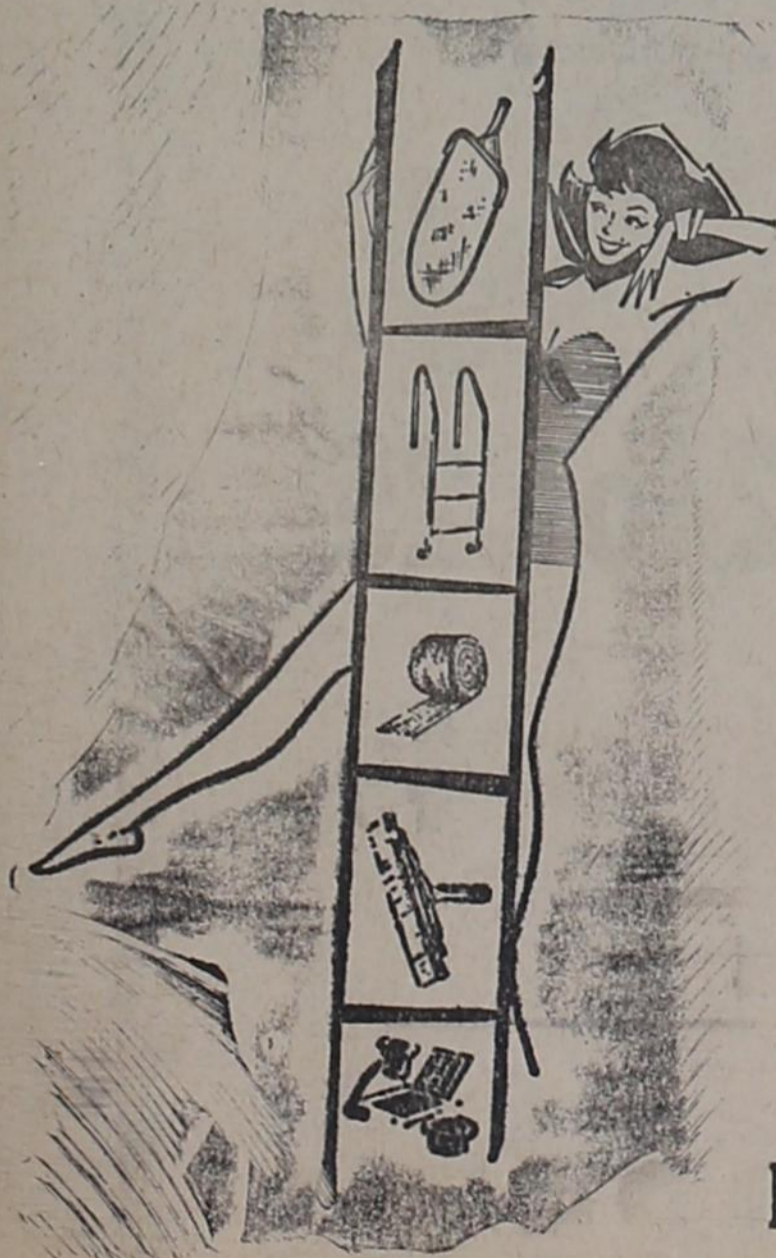
