#### Civil Defense

##### Program Will Be

##### Started Here

Constable Jack Ogle has been appointed as head of Civil Defense in the Ropes community, and he states that the civil defense program will get underway on the first day of January, 1961.

According to information furnished, the civil defense program will be accelerated all over the nation, with the Federal government providing financial assistance.

It is pointed out that Ropes is in a rather vulnerable spot because of the fact it is located so near the air base at Lubbock which, in case of war, would be an atomic target. It is to safeguard the people of this section that civil defense is to be promoted.

The program calls for education and public affairs, inform and train local citizens, present an average of one speech each week on civil defense. To promote individual preparedness, give warning signals and Conelrad, operation alert, promotion of fall-out shelters, to keep the public informed through the press. Plan at least one adult civil defense education course in the community; plan at least one rural course in the community, shelter evaluation and construction, individual preparedness.

Details on this program, which we feel is of utmost value to the community, will be given from week to week.
