

Many graduating seniors will attend on institution of higher learning locally or elsewhere to further their knowledge and earning potentials. Some will select majors that will almost guarantee that upon graduation well-salaried jobs will be available for them. ## A Latino Grows Into His Stetson

When I was growing up near Rosa's Cantina—which is all that El Paso, Texas, has ever been to the politicos in Austin and Washington—a Stetson was a symbol of everything one dreamed about.

We used to call them *tejanas*. We thought that whoever wore one was in a very exclusive league. Stetsons were donned with dignity. "A man can't hold his head proud if he doesn't wear a hat," Dad used to say. "A Stetson," I would whisper to myself.

All of the rich and powerful *bolillos* (the Spanish word for bakery rolls which we used as a nickname for white folks) wore them. If a stranger came looking for someone, we knew that—good or bad—it had to be big. If the man was *jura*—police—he had to be at least a Texas Ranger or FBI agent.

We knew that opportunity wore a Stetson, too, so we always told a stranger in a *tejana* where he could find his man. He could be a rich patron looking for good help. Or a banker. Or the owner to the El Paso Natural Gas Building, then the biggest in West Texas. Maybe even the governor of the state or the president of the country.

Among Mexicans, only the immensely rich cattlemen from Chihuahua wore Stetsons—or a precious few Texas farmers and businessmen.

All of our parents wore Western hats, of course, but most of those hats looked as if they were made of cardboard and covered with a cat's hair. They certainly didn't rate the name *tejana*. Sometimes *bolillos* gave their old *tejanas* to their favorite Mexican workers. But by that time, the *tejanas* looked as if they too were made of cardboard covered with a cat's hair. With grease added. Few could afford better hats.

We had few realistic role models. In my town of San Elizario, outside of El Paso, there was Agustín Payán, who could pick 500 pounds of cotton from daybreak to sunset. Admirable, but we were perceptive enough to know that at a penny and a half a pound, even if one picked a bale of cotton (1,500 pounds) a day for 100 years, a *tejana* would still be only a dream.

Ralph Gonzalez, though, was a big dreamer's dream. Ralph was a farmer and a businessman who worked very hard and got so big that he had to build his own cotton gin. He also owned several stores and founded a bank. We thought he owned the bank and all of the money in it, too. He was unpopular with most of our parents who, if lucky, had small farms and always owned his money.

I truly admired him. From him, I learned to revere a *tejana*.

Ralph drove a pickup and wore faded jeans with holes in them long before Madison Avenue even thought of looking West. But he always wore \$75 *tejanas* and Tony Lama boots.

He loved to go to the barbershop where I hung around and tell us: "I'm nothing more than a hard-working farmer who comes from a very poor home. I have little education, but I have always worked hard and now I wear nothing but \$75 Stetsons and expensive cowboy boots. If you apply yourselves and work hard, someday you'll wear them, too."

He never mentioned his immense holdings. No excess bragging was needed. He knew, of course, that *tejanas* and expensive boots meant to us that hard work and dedication could pay off in unlimited power and riches. Our biggest hope was that someday, after our Saturday bath, we would wear a *tejana* and walk proudly among all men and hear the whispers, "He's a big man."

Despite the eternal protests of Hispanic activists, it makes me very happy to see that dedication and hard work have finally won a considerable number of Hispanics a place in the Stetson league. Although most of us are not rich and times have changed, some of us old-timers still proudly wear *tejanas* as a symbol of what they once meant to us.

What saddens us is that with quota systems and other demeaning gratuities, far too many of our youths are making it quite grandly, derisively wearing baseball caps that say, "Take this job and shove it."

If that's all they have to look forward to—what a pity.

## New York Needs To Clone Texas' Willie Velásquez

He was talking about Mexican Americans, but the things he was saying could be applied to all the Hispanic groups in this country, to all Latinos.

Willie Velásquez, a man who has found his life's mission in registering and empowering Chicano voters in the Southwest, was addressing Hispanic journalists at a conference in Tucson, Arizona. He wanted to make it perfectly clear that he was talking only about the people he had studied.

"I'm going to say Mexican Americans because we work in the Southwest and I don't really know a lot about Puerto Ricans and Cubans and others outside the Southwest," said Velásquez. He is the executive director of the Southwest Voter Registration Education Project. Based in San Antonio, Texas, it has conducted 741 registration campaigns in 197 cities throughout the Southwest and parts of the Midwest since 1972.

Velásquez doesn't know how much of what he said really applies to all Latinos. He could have been talking about the Northeast. He said that politicians traditionally show concern for Mexicans, but it's only every four years. "They come from the East to pick the harvest of Mexican votes," he said. "Then they leave, and you don't see them again in four years...and nothing changes."

He was talking about places like Southwest Texas, but he could have been talking about the South Bronx. What used to happen there is still happening here.

Nowadays, in many areas of the Southwest where Chicanos are a majority, they are also a majority in the school boards and city and county commissions. In some areas, more Mexicans are registered voters than are Anglos and they consistently turn out to vote in higher numbers than Anglos. There were 1,566 Latino elected officials in this country in 1974. Now there are 2,900 and most of them are in the Southwest.

"What the Mexicans are now saying is that the political process actually works," Velásquez said. "We got some resources to do something in a scientific fashion and we got good results."

But why did it happen there, and why hasn't it happened here? Because, unfortunately, we don't have a Willie Velásquez and a Voter Registration Education Project. There has never been a massive registration, research and education drive in the Northeast that first attempted to find out what motivates Latinos to vote.

Velásquez said it is local issues. He said Mexicans began to register when the Latino candidates began to run for local offices and began to talk about local issues, when they saw a potential for change, for getting the streets paved.

The most important elections for Chicanos in the Southwest were not the presidential elections, Velásquez said. "When you asked them what their biggest problems were, they were local. That was an important lesson for us. And the lesson is: Mexican will respond like other Americans when it isn't a national game plan to deliver their vote. When you simply respond to what it is that's bugging them, they're going to react like voters."

Latinos in the Northeast still have to learn that lesson. In New York, too many people have the potential of becoming Velásquez but still feel the way he did before he started the project in 1972.

"When the project began," he said, "I felt that one of the major reasons why it didn't have political strength, political energy, political clout, was primarily our fault. That we were too lazy, that we were Mexicans." He said he had been taught by textbooks which "almost all said that it's in our genes—that somehow Mexican genes say you're not supposed to register."

In the Southwest, aniquated gerrymandering made it impossible for Mexicans to elect their own, although they were the majority, and Velásquez has had to fight in court to change the laws. He has remained nonpartisan, giving Latinos the reasons for voting instead of telling them the candidates to vote for, and he has stood firm on his belief that we should not elect "shady" politicians just because they are Mexican.

In the Northeast, all we need is another Willie Velásquez.

Another tax shelter is investing in EE bonds. Federal income tax on the interest can be deferred until maturity. The interest is exempt from state and local taxes. The yield proves worthwhile only after five years when it becomes 85 percent of the average yield on marketable Treasury securities, with a 7½ percent floor. The accumulated interest is then recomputed and compounded at the 85 percent Treasury rate for each of the previous 10 six-month periods. This interest rate changes each six months and as of May 1, was 9.49 percent.
