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With No Papers and No Fear; Undocumented Immigrants Ride for Justice



Calling it the UndocuBus tour, a group of undocumented immigrants are making their way across several states to reach Charlotte, North Carolina, in time to make a difference at the Democratic National Convention.

Their hope is that by the time the convention is over, they will have had a major impact on bringing attention to that unique group of undocumented immigrants who were brought here as

children or adolescents by their parents.

And they just may be making history.

El Editor spoke to one of the riders on Tuesday August 7 who told us they were in New Orleans, that the trip was going well and that they had been no major problems so far.

On a trip like this that is well publicized that the riders are undocumented, one can easily see that the potential of law enforcement action is very real.

Starting out on July 28, in Phoenix, Arizona, the group has already stopped in Albuquerque, Denver, and Austin before heading to New Orleans

According to an update sent out by the group's web site, they participated in a rally at the Travis County Sheriff's office in Austin "to get him to cut his ties with deportation programs". While in New Orleans, the group expects to meet with day laborers, civil rights leaders, and support others who are facing deportation.

In an article this past week in The Nation Magazine, the group was compared to the Freedom Riders of the Civil Rights movement, but the person we spoke to says she feels a bit uncomfortable with the comparison.

She told El Editor that they are just trying to call attention to the plight of the hundreds

of thousands of people just like her who were brought into the country by their parents or under similar circumstances.

And she says that regardless of the policies in place or whatever changes may be made in the law, like possible future changes to the new deferred deportation policy change announced by the Obama administration in June, "what matters is how organized the undocumented are in order to address whatever may come."

According to the Immigration Policy Center, Texas has the second highest number of potential beneficiaries of the new policy with close to 1 million. Closer to home, in the 19th Congressional District, it is estimated that there are close to 3,000 potential beneficiaries; 2,680 which are of Mexican descent, 70 Asian, 40 South Americans, and 20 of "other" nationalities.

Sure You're Registered to Vote?

According to the national LULAC office, "in this election, the Latino community stands poised to change the political landscape and to impact the critical, political issues that affect our community".

In a recent press release, LULAC says that there are 12.1 million "eligible but unregistered" voters.

While many organizations, including some here locally have concentrated on registering potential voters in the past, the efforts don't quite translate into actual votes.

Compounding the problem is that states like Texas are threatening to prevent voter rolls of hundreds of thousands of names; who may still be eligible to vote.

Part of the problem is when people don't show a pattern of voting. The elections office sends out letters to names it identifies asking the recipient to essential confirm their existence.

According to the Houston Chronicle, "more than 1.5 million voters in (Texas) could be on the path to cancellation if they fail to vote or to update their records for two consecutive federal elections. One out of every 10 Texas voters' registration is currently suspended. Among voters under 30, the figure is about one in five."

The law requires that voter rolls be reviewed and updated, but the major problem is that there seems to be flaws in the way that is done. The Chronicle report cites "outdated computer programs, faulty procedures and voter responses to generic form letters, often resulting in the wrong people being sent cancellation notices, including new homeowners, college students, Texans who work abroad and folks with common names". Voters should make every effort to make sure that their local elections office has their current information, or update information which might have changed, like change in residence, or surname in the case of marriage.

There is a national organization called, "Ya es Hora, Ve y Vota" which translated means "It's time, go and vote". They have a toll free number where people can call to verify their registration status. The number is 1-888-VE-Y-VOTA or 1-888-839-8682.

Or voters can go online at a Secretary of State website at www.votetexas.gov where they can access their voter information to see if their voter registration is correct and current.

Complaint Filed With Elections Administrator

One day after the runoff election win by Lorenzo "Bubba" Sedeno against County Commissioner Gilbert Flores, Lubbock resident Armando Gonzales filed a complaint with the elections office alleging irregularities on the part of the Sedeno campaign during the voting period. El Editor asked Dorothy Kennedy, Lubbock County Elections Administrator to tell us what the next step is.

Kennedy says that, "The Lubbock County Elections Office takes any and all complaints very seriously. We are working in conjunction with the Secretary of State, who is the Chief Elections Officer for Texas , with due diligence to explore the merits of the letter from Mr. Gonzales."

El Editor will follow this story and update it if more information becomes available.

Deferred Deportation Fees Announced

For young undocumented immigrants who are directly impacted by a change in immigration policy called deferred deportation, their situation just got more expensive.

According to the US Citizenship and Immigration Services, or USCIS, persons applying for deferred deportation will be charged a \$465.00 dollar fee which will be used to finance the program.

In order to qualify for the deferral, all applicants must meet certain requirements before applying. They are: at least 5 years of continuous residency, must be enrolled in school, graduated from high school, or received a GED; also must have proof of previous military service or be enrolled in college, and they must be under 31 years of age as of the June 15 announcement date.

Applicants must also have a clean record, and must not have been convicted of a serious misdemeanor, 3 misdemeanors, or a felony.

For all of these applicants, the one thing that bonds them together is that they were brought here by their parents and did not have a choice in the matter.

Women Will Start Benefiting from ACA

Different components of the Affordable Care Act have begun to be implemented and one of the most important is that effective this past week, women must now receive preventive care related to women's health issues. Prior to the law being passed, insurance companies were not required to provide these services if women had a preexisting condition or they could provide them and charge additional premiums. But this change means that women will now be able to receive the services without having to pay additional premiums and at no cost sharing, meaning no co-pays.

The following health services will now be provided, well woman visits, screening and counseling for domestic violence, screening for gestational diabetes if a woman is pregnant, DNA testing for high risk strains of HPV, counseling regarding sexually transmitted infections, including HIV, screening for HIV, contraceptive counseling, and breast feeding support, supplies and counseling.

Perry Not Washington, is the Problem

The Texas AFL-CIO sent out a news release showing that the state of Texas "gets more money in federal tax dollars from Washington than it sends them".

And yet, Governor Perry and other politicians of his breed continue to claim that Washington is the problem.

The primary reason cited in the report which first appeared in the Dallas Morning News, is the state's high poverty rate. And where there is poverty, it is usually government programs like Medicaid which are looked to, to help those in need.

Here in the city of Lubbock , the last US Census showed that over 20% of the population lives below the federal poverty level.

And yet, Perry continues to reject the Affordable Care Act's new Medicaid provision which would provide health insurance coverage to people who don't qualify under the present Medicaid rules, but would, under the new health care act.

HOT NEWS, COLD RECEPTION

UMEXICO CITY—As the East Coast recovered from a very hot spell, historic wild fires were recorded in New Mexico, Colorado in throughout the Southwest, with record temperatures in the Midwest and other places.

That's the picture, the frame for climate change as we know it. Mostly, we simply sit as weather variation, not as the long-winded-about global man-made warming. The picture is still not large enough. To see a director's cut, a wide perspective calls for a multi-screen theater of mind and another geographical notion. What happens in one screening room is also the story running in the other theater.

In far-off Greenland, NASA scientists report this is the first year since 1958 that the ice sheet blanketing the island melted in July. Normally, about half of Greenland's ice melts in the summer. This year more melted than in any of the prior 30 years. It happened so fast that a computer error or malfunction was suspected — 97 percent of the ice sheet surface thawed at some point by mid-July.

Climate knows no borders and the melt could begin affecting Atlantic Ocean water levels.

The unfolding events are not about the first known ecological disaster in modern times. A Mexico City

engineer pointed out to me that the Europeans destroyed the verdant gardens that existed before 1521 which formed islands, called chinampas, in the Valley of Mexico. Their reason was to subjugate the great city of Tenochtitlán, the one Mexico City is built over. The military objective drained the canals that had made the old city like Venice. The transportation and causeways used by the native people to get goods to market from the outer frontiers were transformed into dry land.

Today's paradox is how Mexican government tankers deliver drinking water to those far-flung areas in the north central region where agricultural production and animal stock have fallen off due to drought. This region struggles with the worst dry spell in 81 years of recorded data. The situation of the native Tarahumara people brought national attention when the squadron of potable water tankers was sent to them after their reservoirs and private wells ran dry. About 350,000 head of cattle have starved in the state of Chihuahua alone in the last 12 months, perhaps a million nationally.

One person in the picturesquely south central town of Tequisquiapan at the margins of the draught area, says his town reservoir's water level has been going down for years and he doesn't expect improvement in a dozen years, if then.

DIRIGENTES Y EXPERTOS HISPANOS OPINAN SOBRE LA LEY DE SALUD DE OBAMA

Ahernero al Tribunal Supremo ha convalecido la distintiva ley de salud nacional, Affordable Care Act, las cuales deben abordar su interpretación y la implementación del contrato que va de 2.801 páginas.

Al anunciarlo el falso el 28 de junio, muchos expertos hispanos y dirigentes de organizaciones lo aclamaron casi unánimemente. Una encuesta realizada por Hispanic Link News Service desde el fallo ha encontrado que otros están planteando serias objeciones referente a algunas de sus provisiones más relevantes.

Análista de investigaciones principal del proyecto sobre políticas de salud del Consejo Nacional de La Raza, Kara Ryan, dijo que el fallo era "un hito importante".

Para unos seis millones de hispanos se abriría una camino a la cobertura médica si se implementa por completo la ley para el 2014, afirmó indicando que esto significa el mayor avance individual para cualquier grupo étnico.

Casi todos los hispanos de esta nación carecen de seguro médico, así como el 20% de los africanos americanos.

Presidente del Tribunal Supremo, John Roberts, cambió de una posición conservadora y apoyó a los magistrados liberales cuando el Tribunal falló con un voto de 5 contra 4 indicando que cumpla con la Constitución la ley de salud del Presidente Obama.

Nombreado por el predecesor de Obama, George W. Bush, el presidente del Tribunal Supremo afirmó que el Congreso tiene la autoridad de recaudar impuestos y apoyó a los magistrados liberales cuando el Tribunal falló con un voto de 5 contra 4 indicando que cumpla con la Constitución la ley de salud del Presidente Obama.

Estdado de Florida, cuya población es hispana en un 22%, además de Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Nebraska, Carolina del Sur y Wisconsin, han declarado que rechazar la expansión de Medicaid: algunos expertos proyectan que esto dejará a unos 100 mil de hispanos sin seguro médico. Ocho estados más —Alabama, Georgia, Indiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, Texas y Virginia— están teniendo hacia el rechazo de la expansión.

Gobernador de Florida, Rick Scott, defendió el dilema del seguro médico nacional como un "problema del costo del cuidado médico", y la ley del presidente Obama no hace nada por atender el problema", le dijo a Hispanic Link News Service su vocera, Lane Wright.

En Nevada, cuya población es hispana en un 27.1%, el gobernador Brian Sandoval no ha dicho públicamente si su estado expandirá la cobertura de Medicaid.

Un vocero le dijo a Hispanic Link News Service que están revisando toda la información antes de tomar una decisión.

Abogado de derechos civiles, James Lyons, manejó que si bien la ley se mantiene en pie, el gobernador tiene la opción de rechazar la expansión de Medicaid para perjudicar a los hispanos. "Todo el mundo dice, 'Todo el mundo dice,' pero si yo de hecho no lo han confirmado para los pobres que no tienen seguro médico. Existir la disponibilidad de cuidados médicos, pero no seré cierto."

Cincuenta de Washington, D.C., Wadi Gomero-Cruz, dijo que la ley en realidad será de beneficiio a la población desatendida. Lo que el critica es que sea irresponsable económicamente.

"En vez de dirigirse a la fraude que ocurre con Medicaid, Obama propuso esta ley simplemente para cubrir el gasto," dijo. "Está ley corre el riesgo de perjudicar a nuestros médicos y especialistas a favor de metas políticas. Si bien ayudará a los hispanos, temo que dañará al sector médico y por ende dañará a todos por último."

Congresista Mario Diaz-Balart (republicano por Florida) en una teleconferencia el 27 de junio alegó otro punto conflictivo: "Desafortunadamente el presidente no dice que si esto fuera una cosa gratis para todo el mundo y [que] nadie va a pagar".

A pesar de las críticas y la incertidumbre, la mayoría de las organizaciones hispanas siguen optimistas.

Jessica González-Rojas, directora ejecutiva del National Latina Institute for Reproductive Health, dijo que los jóvenes latinos se benefició de una provisión de la ley, la que permite que los padres de familia incluyan a sus hijos en su seguro médico hasta que cumplen los 26 años. Más de 700 mil latinos ya están disfrutando de este beneficio.

A partir del primero de agosto, las mujeres podrán recibir cuidados médicos gratuitos tales como las mamografías, anticonceptivos y pruebas de papilomatosis, sin tener que aportar su propia pago.

Por el momento, la ley no cubre a los inmigrantes indocumentados, ni a aquellos capaces de comprar su propio seguro médico. Deben fijarse de los centros médicos comunitarios y del programa de emergencia de Medicaid, lo cual resulta más costoso.

González-Rojas añadió que la ley impone límites sobre las latinas en cuanto a temas de servicios de aborto.

"Tenemos la esperanza que surja algo de sabiduría de entre estos legisladores para considerar lo que le conviene al país y para ofrecer cobertura médica a todo nuestro pueblo," dijo González-Rojas. "Es una lucha... Hasta no incluir a todas estas personas, no vamos a dejar de pelear."

One of the individuals involved in organizing the event called it "A great success". We couldn't agree more and we say "Congratulations on a Job Well Done".

Who is the Real Political Opponent Here?

In every political race, someone has to win and someone has to lose.

Consequently, the candidate and supporters on the losing side are faced with making the decision of how to respond to the loss.

In most cases, it is usually a candidate from an opposing party who has to make that choice. And, so if the reaction is nasty, we have to understand that is the normal understanding.

But in this case, it was a Democratic Precinct runoff election, and both candidates were from the same party. But you couldn't tell by some of the remarks we saw posted online. The race between Gilbert Flores and Lorenzo "Bubba" Sedeno was a very contentious race between two candidates who have a different view of the role a Lubbock county commissioner plays and how they will do the job. Consequently, they each had their share of Democratic supporters; some who were more personally invested in the race than others.

In reading some of the comments posted on Facebook, we were struck by the hateful and divisive words posted after the election by the Democrat who had supported Flores. As an example, here is one of the comments:

"No self respecting Democrat will vote for this disgusting turncock of a person for anything."

The writer was referring to the winning candidate Lorenzo "Bubba" Sedeno.

That to us seems to be more of a personal and emotional attack on an individual as opposed to making a political argument for not voting for a particular candidate. Is that what we want Democratic voters to base their decision on when they decide who to vote for in November; when the opposing candidate is a Republican?

We have to remember that a majority of voters in Precinct 3 who took time to vote made the decision to select Lorenzo "Bubba" Sedeno as their Democratic Party. We don't think they would appreciate those types of comments about a candidate they feel qualified enough to win their vote.

These kinds of hateful comments only serve to discourage potential voter participation in the political process.

In a city as conservative as Lubbock, where we are quickly running the risk of becoming a one party city, perhaps it would be best to keep these personal attacks out of the public forum and settle our differences in a more civil manner and in a more proper forum.

We should stay focused on the main goal, which is to elect Democrats if they remain loyal to the party, profess to be Democrats and still believe in Democratic political principles.

If that, perhaps it is time to consider getting out, move on and join some other political party as some others have done.

And we will also say that the Democratic Party has bigger battles to fight in order to regain some semblance of competitiveness in local and county political races.

The choice is very simple. Lose with grace and dignity; or strike out at the winner and their supporters and give Republicans even more reason to attract Democrats to their party.

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Obama Orders \$30M More in Farm Drought Aid

President Barack Obama said he ordered an additional \$30 million to help crop and livestock farmers crippled by a "devastating" and "historic drought."

The U.S. Agriculture Department money, which has already been allocated and does not require congressional approval, is intended "to get more water to livestock and restore land impacted by drought," Obama told reporters before a White House Rural Council meeting on the government's drought response.

The council, composed of Cabinet-level and other officials from across the government, seeks to promote rural economic prosperity.

"We are seeing devastating drought throughout the country," Obama said Tuesday afternoon. "It is a historic drought, and it's having a profound impact on farmers and ranchers all across many states."

The administration has "already designated over 1,500 counties from 32 states as disaster areas, which gives qualified farmers access to low-interest emergency loans," Obama said.

"We've also opened up more land for haying and grazing," he said. "And we've worked with crop insurance companies to give farmers a short grace period on unpaid insurance premiums, since some families will be



struggling to make ends meet at the end of this crop year.

"This has been an all-hands-on-deck response," he said, thanking Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack for his leadership.

Obama pointed to additional administration steps to help people and businesses hurt by the drought. These included a Transportation Department program to help commercial truck drivers transport supplies to farmers and ranchers and Small Business Administration program for low-interest emergency loans.

"But obviously, we've got a lot more to do, because a lot of folks are being affected by this," he said.

"When there's a disaster like this, everybody needs to pull together."

Obama repeated his call for Congress to pass a five-year, \$500 billion farm bill.

Passing the bill would "not only provide important disaster relief tools, but also make necessary reforms and give farmers

the certainty that they deserve," he said.

Kevin Smith, a spokesman for House Speaker John Boehner, R-Ohio, said the Republican-controlled House passed a bill to aid livestock producers, but the Democratic-controlled Senate did not act on it.

A bipartisan

House majority took responsible action to help farmers and ranchers suffering from this drought," Smith said. "It's unfortunate that Senate Democrats have blocked this relief package from getting to those in need."

House Republicans Thursday passed a short-term \$383 million package of loans and grants for some drought-stricken livestock producers and farmers.

But Democratic leaders in the Senate, which passed the five-year agricultural policy omnibus farm bill June 21, said they wouldn't rush through the House measure simply because they were getting ready to begin their five-week summer recess.

"I'm not passing a bill that only covers some producers," Senate Agriculture Committee Chairwoman Debbie Stabenow, D-Mich., said Thursday.

The end result was that Congress took no action to provide drought aid before breaking for the summer.

Mejoran perspectivas laborales para hispanos en EEUU

Solis, durante una conferencia con periodistas. "Si los hispanos progresan, nuestra nación progresará".

Estados Unidos cuenta con casi 25 millones de trabajadores hispanos, es decir, un 16% de la fuerza laboral estadounidense, según la Oficina de Estadísticas Laborales.

El reporte difundido titulado "El estado de los hispanos en Estados Unidos" ("The State of Latinos in the United States") señala que los latinos podrían representar un 18% de la fuerza laboral antes del 2018 y un 24% antes del 2050.

A pesar de que hay más hispanos en el país que han nacido



en Estados Unidos, más de la mitad de los hispanos que trabajaron en 2011 nacieron en el extranjero (un 52%), indica el informe.

Según Solis, los niveles de desempleo entre hispanos son más altos que entre blancos, pero la cifra cayó en los dos últimos años de 13 a 10.3%.

Gran parte del desempleo entre hispanos fue generado por la

pérdida de puestos de trabajo en el sector de la construcción. Aun así, la Oficina de Estadísticas Laborales proyecta que esta industria crecerá un 2.9% anual hasta el 2020.

"Este crecimiento puede beneficiar enormemente a los hispanos, quienes están ampliamente representados en el sector, sin embargo la mayoría de este crecimiento serán empleos recuperados que fueron eliminados durante la recesión," indicó el informe.

Se prevé que la industria de la salud y de la asistencia social sea la que más crezcan pero los hispanos están poco presentes en estos sectores, sólo representan un 10.4% de los trabajadores de esta industria.

California, Arizona, Illinois, Nueva York, Florida y Texas son los estados con los mayores niveles de desempleo entre hispanos.

El reporte también destacó que los niveles de educación de los latinos trabajadores son bajos: tan sólo seis hispanos que trabaja y tiene más de 25 años cuenta con estudios universitarios.

El estudio del Center for American Progress está basado en datos de la oficina del censo, del Departamento de Trabajo de Estados Unidos, de los Centros de Control y Prevención de Enfermedades, del Centro Hispano Pew y del Consejo Nacional de Negocios de Mujeres, entre otros organismos.

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Arnett Benson National Night Out



Mexican actor Gael García Bernal, just 33, became one of the youngest actors to win an award for career excellence in the 65-year history of the Locarno Film Festival on Wednesday, ahead of the Piazza Grande screening of Pablo Larraín's *No*, in which García Bernal played a gifted advertising executive who helped to oust Chilean dictator Augusto Pinochet.

Also on wednesday was the world premiere screening La Fille de nulle part (The Girl From Nowhere), written, directed and produced by Jean-Claude Brisseau, who also played the film's male lead. The film, which screened in competition, was made with an extremely low budget from Brisseau's own savings.

Locarno artistic director Olivier Père introduced García Bernal as a "Latino diva," while García Bernal marveled at the crowd that nearly filled the 8,800-seat

Piazza Grande, saying it was truly "grand" — using the Spanish word that means both "big" and "great."

García Bernal said that despite a career lasting more than 20 years and acting roles in more than 40 films, shorts and television programs that he still feels like he is "green" as an actor.

"I think I still have a lot of room to grow," the diminutive García Bernal said. "Perhaps not with Locarno's Excellence Award, the same award given to 66-year-old UK actress Charlotte Rampling earlier in the festival. Locarno also gave a Golden Leopard career award to exclusive French director Léos Carax, 52, while other career honors went to producer Arnon Milchan, 68, and, soon, to 57-year-old Hong Kong director

Johnnie To.

Perhaps as a nod to his comparatively young age, García Bernal displayed a youthful exuberance when the black-and-gold prize, shaking the award over his head and using it to play air guitar.

Earlier, La Fille de nulle part turned heads in a full Fevi cinema, second only to Piazza Grande among Locarno's largest venues. The film, an unusual love story between a grieving widower who lost his wife a generation before (played by Brisseau) and a homeless woman, was made for just €62,000 (around \$77,000). Brisseau said the production used only one



camera, which was transported at times by an adapted baby carriage.

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Kobe, LeBron power U.S. past Aussies



As the shot fell through the net, Kobe Bryant held three fingers on each hand. It was his third straight 3-pointer in the fourth quarter, enough for the U.S. men's Olympic team to finally put away宿 Australia.

Yes, all's fine with Bryant, and the Americans' gold medal, as well.

Bryant silenced his critics and broke open a tight game with six 3-pointers in the second half Wednesday night as the U.S. advanced to the semifinals of the London Games with a 119-86 victory over Australia.

"Somebody made him mad. I could see it in his eyes," American Kevin Durant said. "I wanted him to kind of turn it on and what's he did."

On a night when LeBron James had a triple-double, the story was Bryant's awakening from his Olympic slumber. The five-time NBA champion has even said this team could have beaten the Dream Team, and on the 20th anniversary

say of that squad's gold medal win, he on the kind of show that makes his claim hard to dismiss.

Bryant scored all of his 20 points after the half-time, finally delivering the kind of game expected of him in London.

He had insisted his time would come, and none of his teammates ever doubted it.

"I kind of knew what button to push with him. I was talking to him at half-time and in the third quarter and I guess I pushed the button. He woke up to see that, I've been on the other side of the ball and had the situation before," teammate Carmelo Anthony said.

Bryant, a top-five scorer in NBA history, brushed away Anthony's attempts to take credit as easily as the questions he's been hearing in London.

"He was just saying, 'Let's see what we see during the season.' But by that point, I was already revved up," Bryant said.

James finished with 11 points, 14 rebounds and 12 assists for the Americans, who advanced to their third straight Olympic semifinal meeting with Argentina, which beat Brazil earlier Wednesday. Deron Williams added 18 points, while Anthony had 17 and Durant 14.

The Americans beat the Argentines 126-97 on

Monday in the final game of pool play, yet another night they didn't need much from Bryant, who came in averaging just 9.4 points and hearing whispers that something must be wrong with him, though both he and his teammates kept assuring people there was no problem.

This was a bit different — eventually — after Bryant missed on all four shots in the first half.

"Just kind of searching for something to get me going, for something that would activate the Black Mamba, as Coach calls it," Bryant said.

That came when Australia scored the first 11 points of the second half, cutting the Americans lead to three after back-to-back 3-pointers by Joe Ingles. The U.S. lead was only six before Bryant, who had never gotten in an offensive rhythm in London and just minutes earlier had committed another puzzling

offensive foul, finally broke out.

He made a 3-pointer, then batted away a pass, chased it down along the left sideline and pulled up for another 3 that made it 70-58. James followed with a basket that pushed it to 14, and the Americans never let the Australians get much closer.

Bryant made sure of it.

He finished 6 of 10 behind the arc, making three straight in the fourth quarter as part of a 17-2 run to blow it open, the crowd chanting "Kobe! Kobe!" before he finally missed on a ridiculous long attempt before calling it a night.

Patty Mills scored 26 points and Ingles had 19 for Australia, which had the misfortune of running into the U.S. in the semifinals for the second straight Olympics.

The difference in the game was their transition buckets and 3-pointers, and Kobe got a little bit stiff," Mills said.

"And for great teams, that's all they need and they stretch it out."

Even the Australian fans were cheering for Bryant as he walked to the locker room after a postgame interview. First, he knocked fists with the Aussies' kangaroo mascot, wearing boxing gloves on his hands.

Bryant sure knocked out the Aussies.

Bodies fell and blood flowed in a physical first half, the Americans taking plenty of hits but delivering them as well, such as the one that sent Australia's David Barlow to the bench with a bloody nose that took a while to control.

But the spirited play brought out the best in Bryant, who insists he's content taking a lesser role with other such younger scorers such as James, Durant and Anthony willing to carry the load.

He said the same things in Beijing and came through with 20 points in the

gold-medal game, so the Americans know they can count on him to rise to a challenge.

They expect another one from Argentina, which beat the U.S. in 2004 on its way to the gold medal, a loss the Americans avenged before winning gold in Beijing.

Right now Spain is in the other semifinal.

The crowd on the first night of action at the North Greenwich Arena included NBA Commissioner David Stern and Deputy Commissioner Adam Silver, who have said they may prefer the Olympics to limited to players 23 and younger.

First, they saw why fans want to keep the spirit alive, and what expectations exceeded from Bryant all along. "You see it all the time, but that was the first time we've seen it here," Durant said. "He got us upset and when he does that he's in another world."

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Crean réplica del corazón para experimentar tratamientos

Un grupo de científicos ha creado la primera simulación exacta de un corazón que se podrá personalizar para probar terapias antes de aplicárselas al paciente y que serviría, a la vez, para sacar a la luz los entresijos aún por descubrir de uno de los órganos más complejos del cuerpo humano.

Desde hace más de dos años, expertos del Barcelona Supercomputing Center (BSC) y del Hospital de Sant Pau de la capital catalana trabajan en la recreación de un corazón que se espera que, ya a finales de este año, reproduzca a la perfección los mismos procesos que uno natural, aunque alimentado con sangre virtual.

"El corazón es una bomba mecánica muy sofisticada que tenemos que conocer mejor, porque todavía hay muchos puntos oscuros", explica a Efe el jefe de la Unidad deImagen Cardíaca del

Sant Pau, Francesc Carreras. Uno de estos retos a resolver empíricamente es el mecanismo electromecánico que activa el corazón para que se contraigan las fibras y se produzca el bombeo de sangre.

Si bien la medicina ya es capaz de arreglar problemas electromecánicos con aparatos de sincronización, como los marcapasos, todavía no ha podido describir por qué esas correcciones funcionan.

Carreras espera que la recreación ayude a entender esos procesos y que contribuya también a confirmar la teoría, aceptada ya por toda la comunidad médica, de que las fibras dentro del corazón conforman una única pieza helicoidal que se contrae por torsión, como cuando se escurre una toalla, para hacer la función de bombeo.

para ver, en pocos minutos, cómo evolucionaría la patología en 10 años.

"Sabremos con antelación, por ejemplo, cuál es el momento más indicado para cambiar una válvula que tiene una disfunción", destaca Carreras.

Para lograr las ecuaciones necesarias para reproducir como en la realidad todos los movimientos del corazón, la supercomputadora Mare Nostrum usa un millar de procesadores de forma simultánea.

"La parte más compleja es resolver de forma correcta todo el sistema de ecuaciones que describen el funcionamiento del corazón y eso implica resolver el problema eléctrico, la deformación del músculo cardíaco o el movimiento de las válvulas", explica José María Cela, responsable del BSC en el proyecto.

La última fase, aún pendiente de ejecutar, es insertar la sangre y para ello hay que resolver las ecuaciones que describen el movimiento del líquido tal y como sucede en la realidad.

"Esperamos que aproximadamente a finales de 2013 tengamos un prototipo completo para iniciar validaciones con casos de estudio clínico", subraya Cela.

Hasta entonces, el BSC trabajará para crear un mecanismo rápido que, en unos 20 minutos, sea capaz de ajustar los parámetros de serie que sean aproximados para personalizarlos en función de las características del corazón de cada paciente.

"La simulación debe ser capaz de reproducir de forma fidedigna y cuantitativamente correcta un corazón, pero no abstracto, sino el de una persona concreta", concluye Cela.

Descifran cómo funciona el olvido

Con la ayuda de ordenadores, científicos argentinos han descrito mecanismos asociados al olvido que pueden servir para desarrollar tratamientos contra la depresión y enfermedades degenerativas como el mal de Alzheimer, explicó hoy a Efe uno de los responsables del estudio.

Los investigadores del Instituto Universitario del Hospital Italiano de Buenos Aires desarrollaron un simulador del hipocampo, región del cerebro capaz de recordar situaciones, a través de un modelo matemático realizado en el ordenador.

La máxima aspiración es desarrollar una tecnología que ayude a crear un "chip" que pueda ser implantado a personas con enfermedades como el mal de Alzheimer y que active los procesos de la memoria, declaró el doctor

Pablo Argibay, a cargo del estudio iniciado hace seis años junto a la bioingeniería Victoria Weisz.

"Se trata de un chip que potencialmente pueda hacer las funciones del hipocampo. Es una tecnología que aún no está disponible, pero que podría ayudar a las

personas con enfermedades degenerativas", señaló el investigador, también perteneciente al Consejo Nacional de Investigaciones Científicas y Técnicas de Argentina.

Los científicos detectaron que cuando el hipocampo genera

nuevas neuronas, las memorias adquiridas más recientemente son mejor retenidas

datos obtenidos con electrocardiogramas y TAC de un paciente, podrían personalizar el corazón virtual y avanzar en el tiempo

el científico, puede servir también para las personas con depresión, a quienes se suele administrar fármacos que "ayudan a crear nuevas neuronas, las cuales permiten retener nuevas memorias y, de ese modo, desplazar las viejas memorias que son traumáticas".

"El hecho de conocer el funcionamiento del hipocampo mediante el simulador abre a desarrollar teorías acerca de cómo podría producirse el olvido y cómo podríamos intervenir sobre el fenómeno", puntualizó.

El hipocampo, llamado así por su forma similar a un caballito de mar, está asociado a la denominada memoria episódica, que permite recordar un evento a partir de alguno de sus componentes, es decir, cuando a partir de una imagen es posible recordar una situación vivida.

La investigación se basó en la neurogénesis, descubierta en la década de 1980 por el científico argentino Fernando Nottebohm, quien contradijo la hipótesis aceptada durante décadas de que no podían crearse nuevas neuronas en el cerebro adulto.

"Si algunas demencias se produjeron como consecuencia de la pérdida de generación de neuronas, podríamos recuperar esa capacidad con una terapia basada en células madre o sustancias para que el fenómeno se produzca", dijo el responsable de la investigación, que será publicada en la revista "Cognition".

Por lo pronto, en el laboratorio del instituto universitario arman por estos días un robot con la capacidad de simular la función del hipocampo, lo que puede abrir paso a nuevos descubrimientos para no olvidar.

"Confían en nosotros". Ese es el mensaje que está transmitiendo el gobierno a tan sólo días de que se abren las aplicaciones de jóvenes indocumentados para la acción diferida. A partir del próximo 15 de agosto, los jóvenes que se beneficiarían con el Proyecto de Ley del Sueño (DREAM), podrán postular al proceso de acción diferida por dos años, con posibilidad de ser renovado. Este mecanismo les permitirá permanecer en el país y acceder a permisos de trabajo.

Incluso después de que el gobierno divulgará las guías sobre el proceso de aplicación, aún persisten dudas dentro de organizaciones de jóvenes y activistas.

El director del Servicio de Ciudadanía e Inmigración (USCIS), Alejandro Mayorkas, insistió en que "se están estableciendo protocolos para asegurar la calidad de las decisiones".

Un punto importante, considerando que la resolución de USCIS, no puede apelar. "Entregaremos guías adicionales sobre el proceso, el 15 de agosto, respecto a la documentación necesaria para probar que se cumplen con los requerimientos", reafirmó.

En una carta enviada por United We Dream y NILC, el 30 de julio pasado, las organizaciones mencionaron a Mayorkas sus preocupaciones. Existen dudas y "mensajes de miedo, que están causando que muchos potenciales postulantes, tomen la actitud de esperar".

En la misiva piden que cuando la aplicación sea denegada, USCIS realice una revisión por parte de un supervisor y provea al postulante de una explicación escrita de las razones del rechazo.

Mayorkas dijo que "no comentaría situaciones hipotéticas y recordó que harán un análisis caso a caso".
