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Barack Obama On Immigration In 2012: Not So Different From 2011

When President Obama's immigration policy staffers gathered to help pen the State of the Union Address passage dedicated to their issue, they didn't have much to work with. Comprehensive immigration reform never came close, and the Dream Act failed. What's a speechwriter to do?

Control-C. Control-V.

"I believe as strongly as ever that we should take on, once and for all, the issue of illegal immigration," Obama said in his Tuesday evening speech.

Indeed, he "strongly believe[d] that we should take on, once and for all, the issue of illegal immigration" last year, according to his State of the Union speech.

This year, he reminded lawmakers that "hundreds of thousands of talented, hardworking students in country face another challenge: The fact

that they aren't yet American citizens," an allusion to the Dream Act, which would provide legal status to some undocumented immigrants who came to the United States as children, if they're the military or attend college.

Last year, too, he talked about the "hundreds of thousands of students excelling in our schools who are not American

citizens."

Obama, who broke the record in fiscal 2011 for deportations,

then turned to the fears these young people face. "Many were brought here as small chil-

dren, are American through and through, yet

they live every day with the threat of deportation," he said in 2012.

"They grew up as Americans and pledge allegiance to our flag, and yet they live every day with the threat of

deportation," he said in 2011.

Some immigrants should not be deported, he said. Obama sup-

ports legislation that would help immigrants who graduate college in the U.S., especially those with advanced degrees, obtain legal status. Sending graduates home "doesn't make sense," he said on Tuesday. "It makes no sense," he said in 2011.

He seemed more hopeful in

2011 that such legislation could be passed. "I know that debate will be difficult. I know it will take time. But tonight, let's agree to make that effort," he said then.

"Let's stop expelling talented, responsible young people who could be helping our research labs or starting new businesses, who could be further enriching this nation."

This year, his expectations are


lower, as the pleading phrase "at least" was added to the request.

But if election-year politics keeps Congress from acting on a comprehensive plan, let's at least start telling expellable young people who want to staff our labs, start new busi-

nesses, and defend this country," he said.

In 2010, as a comparison, Obama mentioned immigration once in his speech, which was largely focused on health care reform.

"We should continue the work of fixing our broken immigration system — to secure our borders and enforce our laws, and ensure that everyone who plays by the rules can contribute to our economy and enrich our nation," he said in the January 2010 speech.



Clinton dice que Obama triunfará

El expresidente estadounidense Bill Clinton está convencido de que Barack Obama ganará las elecciones del próximo noviembre y seguirá al frente de la Casa Blanca un segundo mandato, ya que los votantes entenderán que es la persona ideal para sacar al país de la crisis aunque necesite más tiempo. "Creo que Barack Obama será el próximo presidente. Creo que ganará", asegura Clinton en una entrevista que la revista Esquire adelantó ayer en su web y en la que muestra su conveniencia de que, pese a que "el pueblo estadounidense hubiera preferido que (Obama) se convierta más rápido", respaldará al actual mandatario. mucho tiempo" para sacar al país "del tipo de dificultades económicas" que atraviesa y que es "más probable que la dirección y políticas (de Obama) saquen al país adelante que si le dan la Casa Blanca y el Congreso a un partido que les dará más de lo que ya han tenido". Clinton, que protagoniza la portada del próximo número de la revista dedicada a las cosas en que los estadounidenses están de acuerdo, explica que Obama se beneficiaría durante la campaña electoral del "rápido descenso de la popularidad de los gobernadores republicanos en lugares como Florida, Ohio y Wisconsin". El mandato de la actual secretaria de Estado de EEUU, Hillary Clinton, repite varias veces en la entrevista que Obama

seguirá al frente de la Presidencia y señala que el líder demócrata podrá mostrar a los votantes como credenciales, por ejemplo, "lo diferente que está la industria automotriz con respecto a cuando llegó al poder". Podrá hablar de muchos avances en ciertos sectores de la economía y podrá utilizar un muy sólido historial en materia de seguridad nacional. No será vulnerable en ese aspecto. De hecho, los republicanos pueden ser más vulnerables que él", explica Clinton. El exmandatario lamenta que Estados Unidos esté sumido "en un momento en el que los republicanos se han movido más y más hacia la derecha" y en el que "cada vez que el presidente adopta un plan por el que

alguna vez han apostado, lo abandonan y se dirigen más a la derecha". Sobre los candidatos a la reelección, Clinton arremete contra Newt Gingrich, de quien dice que "como ciudadano habla defendido ciertas reformas de la sanidad y creía en el cambio climático y que se debería actuar en su contra, y ahora es solo como (Mitt) Romney". "Ninguno de los dos pueden decir lo que creen de verdad y lograr la nominación. Romney todavía tratará de deslizar lo que hizo como gobernador de Massachusetts y atraer todavía esa dominante energía injuriosa", señala en la entrevista el que fue presidente de Estados Unidos entre 1993 y 2001.

Las mismas promesas para los inmigrantes



El presidente Barack Obama prometió durante su discurso del Estado de la Nación que si el Congreso de Estados Unidos aprueba una ley que permite a los estudiantes indocumentados obtener una permanencia legal, y si se logra consenso en torno a una ley integral de inmigración, el firmaría ambas medidas. Jorge Mario Cabrera, representante de la Coalición de Derechos Humanos de Los Ángeles (CHIRLA), recordó que el presidente Obama ya ha hecho este tipo de promesas en el pasado, pero que no está a su alcance lograr estos cambios. CHIRLA reunió anoche a más de una docena de estudiantes y trabajadores de Los Ángeles en sus instalaciones, para ver y escuchar en vivo el discurso del presidente. "Me parece hasta deshonesto que proponga cambios migratorios cuando él tiene el poder para lograr estos cambios. Me parece también deshonesto que por un lado hable de oportunidades para los jóvenes inmigrantes, pero que por otro lado, sus padres sean criminalizados", dijo Cabrera. Para que se aplíque tanto una reforma migratoria como una ley que permita a los estudiantes indocumentados obtener un estatus legal, el Congreso de Estados Unidos tiene que ponerse de acuerdo y en este año electoral, no hay tipo de consenso, recordó Cabrera. "El presidente está instando a tener un futuro económico mejor, más brillante. Esto es importante, pero dentro de ese discurso se le olvida incluir a los inmigrantes que son parte importante de la economía", manifestó Cabrera. Era Suárez, estudiante de Cal State Long Beach, dijo que

This year, LULAC Council 263 will observe LULAC Week February 5-11 with various events and activities that celebrate 56 years of service that started in Lubbock in 1956 to increase educational opportunities and improve the quality of life of Hispanics on the South Plains.

Council President Robert Rodriguez said that the "local group not only helps better the life of Latinos but it also better the life of all Americans. Whenever we can improve education, everyone benefits from it." Rodriguez further noted that members of other councils in the South Plains and the Panhandle will attend other local events during the week.

The first activity will be a Council Members Devotional Mass at Our Lady of Grace Sunday February 5 at 9:00 a.m. Those attending will pay homage to those members who died in the past year.

The Council also annually honors Hispanics in business and professional fields. This year the Council will honor Secretaries and Non-teaching Staff of Lubbock Independent School District as "Unsung Heroes of the Lubbock School System." They will be honored at a Professional

and Membership Night Reception at the Council Hall located at 1304 Avenue O on Thursday, February 9th at 6:00 p.m. Those Secretaries and Non-Teaching Personnel attending will be recognized with Certificates of Appreciation. Snacks and refreshments will be provided. Individuals interested in joining LULAC can apply for membership at the week.

LULAC week festivities will close with the Council's largest fundraiser—which benefits the scholarships fund—on Saturday night February 11 at the Holiday Inn Hotel and Towers with a 6:00 p.m. Reception and 7:00 p.m. Dinner. CIUDAD DE MÉXICO – El antiguo rector de la Universidad Nacional Autónoma aquí, Juan Ramón de la Fuente, publicó una lista de las 30 preguntas que le haría a los candidatos a la presidencia de los tres partidos más importantes, quienes se presentan para las elecciones de esta noche a realizar en julio.

Publicadas originalmente en el Diario El Universal, las preguntas se convirtieron en el tópico de un programa popular de análisis de noticias con Curni Arregui el 9 de enero. Las preguntas de la Fuente pretenden revertir la tendencia hacia la ideología y los lenguajes partidistas, en los que los políticos inventan una problemática o simplemente la expresión de su manifiesto. Lo que se necesita en vez de esto, es saber qué van a hacer respecto a NUESTRAS preguntas, no las de ellos. A continuación están algunas de las preguntas que posa de la Fuente, abajo director de una asociación universitaria:

público no se hicieron con ningún orden ni prioridad en particular. Pretendían diferenciar a los partidos políticos y sus dirigentes.

- * El conocimiento, ¿cómo difundirlo?
- * Los océanos, ¿cómo resguardarlos?
- * La pobreza, ¿cómo erradicarla?
- * Los deportes, ¿cómo apoyarlos?

LULAC Reflects on President Obama's 2012 State of the Union Address

In President Obama's third State of the Union address, the President outlined specific policy priorities for his Administration in order to make "an economy that's built to last."

In last night's State of the Union Address, President Obama directly addressed the nation and put forth his plan for bolstering the middle class by reforming the code for the most affluent Americans, increasing educational opportunities, and maintaining the economic contributions with comprehensive immigration reform for millions of undocumented immigrants.

"We are pleased to hear that President Obama will lead the endeavor to keep jobs in the U.S., increase educational opportunities for people and make comprehensive immigration reform a priority in this coming year," said LULAC National President Margaret Moran. "Completely overhauling the existing immigration laws is imperative to the health of the nation, and will improve the very themes that the president addressed—jobs, education, and economic growth."

LULAC was pleased to hear President Obama urging Congress to work with him to improve the economy. In a request to Congress, President Obama called for a bill that would build upon the momentum created by the 3 million new jobs, by encouraging U.S. manufacturing. He called for Congress to work together and pass legislation that will extend tax breaks to businesses that are currently creating U.S. jobs and remove tax incentives to industries that send jobs overseas. Emphasizing that we all of our fair share to ensure the success of our economy, President Obama also called upon American citizens to pay their fair share.

LULAC supports the President's initiative to streamline training programs for the unemployed. Calling higher education the only economic and social equalizer, President Obama called for community colleges to work with industries to offer worker training programs in order to advance a person's higher education and provide the skills that industry need.

LULAC helped President Obama's call for comprehensive immigration reform. President Obama enumerated the reasons why comprehensive immigration reform would create employment opportunities. The DREAM Act would allow students, who have met the requirements, an opportunity to attend a college or university, which would give the country a more learned and highly-skilled workforce. Currently, only California benefits from a highly-educated workforce because of the ratification of the DREAM Act, which allows academic achievers to attend college and universities regardless of their legal status.

According to both the Immigration Policy Center and the Center for American Progress, should the United States adopt a comprehensive measure to put unauthorized immigrants on a path toward naturalization, the first three years would be marked by higher personal income which would stimulate increased consumer spending, enough to create 750,000-900,000 jobs in the United States, as well as increased tax revenues of at least \$4.5 billion.

"These facts undeniably establish that all Americans would benefit from comprehensive immigration reform, and we applaud President Obama for making this a priority and calling for Congress to act," said Brett Wilkes, LULAC National Executive Director.

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Newt Gingrich Gets a Grilling on Univision

Where was Jorge Ramos when John King and Juan Williams needed him?

Reporting on the candidates and voters in the Sunshine State.

Mr. Ramos, a journalist for the major Spanish-language television station Univision, subjected Newt Gingrich to one of his toughest interviews of the campaign, pressing him on nuances of his immigration policies, his former wife's accusation that he sought an open marriage and his attacks on the news media at debates in which he paled Mr. King, of CNN, and Mr. Williams, of Fox News, for their questions.

Mr. Gingrich is aggressively court ing Hispanic voters in Florida and he has scheduled several events before the primary on Jan. 31 focused on Hispanic issues, including a speech on Latin American policy.

But Mr. Ramos noted that in a poll released Wednesday by Univision, ABC News and Latino Decisions that matched Mr. Gingrich against President Obama, a vast majority of Hispanic voters chose Mr. Obama.

"You would lose the general election with me as your member," he warned.

Mr. Gingrich's policy proposals for the 11 million illegal immigrants in the country are a shade more moderate than those of some of his rivals.

Asked what he thought of Mitt Romney's idea that illegal immigrants would "self-deport" if they are denied jobs and services, Mr. Gingrich snorted, then answered, "I think you have to live in worlds of Swiss bank

accounts and Cayman Island accounts and automatic \$20 million a year income with no work to have some funny fact this far from reality."

He accused Mr. Romney of lacking "concern for the humanity of the people who are already here."

But when Mr. Ramos pressed him on why, if he were compassionate, he did not support the Dream Act, which would offer some illegal immigrants a path to citizenship as children a path to citizenship — President Obama called on Congress to pass the bill in his State of the Union address on Tuesday — Mr. Gingrich said, "because it's the Dream Act," giving citizenship to people who enlist in the army.

Mr. Ramos said that two million students were brought to the country as children by illegal-immigrant parents and that Mr. Gingrich favored policies "punishing" them.

"They can go to college," Mr. Gingrich demurred. "I wasn't suggesting we run around and try deport them. I have suggested that if they want to become citizens, they can join the military."

Mr. Ramos asked why Mr. Gingrich has attacked the news media for asking about his former wife's accusation that he asked her to tolerate an adulterous affair.

"Do I blame you for asking? No, let me explain," Mr. Gingrich said, and he went on to say he had been angry at ABC News for interviewing his former wife, Marianne Gingrich, while not interviewing people

Gingrich campaign suggested would rebut the account. His campaign fought with ABC for equal time "because it's a lie," he said. "It's not true."

Mr. Ramos then suggested that Mr. Gingrich had been hypocritical, as House speaker, to lead impeachment proceedings against President Clinton over the Monica Lewinsky affair at a time he himself was in an adulterous relationship. "At the same time you were doing exactly the same thing," Mr. Ramos said.

Mr. Gingrich pushed back, making the case that Mr. Clinton was impeached for lying under oath, a felony, not for extramarital affair.

"I understand," Mr. Ramos said, "but people think that's hypocritical to criticize President Clinton for doing the same thing that you were doing at the same time."

"OK, there is some place there where a normal synapse missing," Mr. Gingrich said. "I didn't do the same thing. I never lied under oath, I have never committed perjury, I have never been involved in a felony — he was."

In pursuit of Hispanic support, Mr. Gingrich started a Spanish news site, and he has taken Spanish lessons. Mr. Ramos began the interview, excerpts of which will be broadcast by Univision, one of the top five broadcast networks, by addressing him in Spanish.

"I speak pidgin Spanish," Mr. Gingrich said. The interview was conducted in English.

Sobre los candidatos a encabezar la candidatura demócrata, Clinton arremete contra Newt Gingrich, de quien dice que "como ciudadano había defendido ciertas reformas de la sanidad y creía en el cambio climático y que se debería actuar en su contra, y ahora es solo como (Mitt) Romney". "Ninguno de los dos pueden decir lo que creen de verdad y lograr la nominación. Romney todavía trae de desafío lo que hizo como gobernador de Massachusetts y atraer todavía esa dominante energía injuriosa", señala en la entrevista el que fuera presidente de Estados Unidos entre 1993 y 2001.

BAN LIFTED ON GENERATORS & OUTDOOR GRILLING IN CITY PARKS

The city of Lubbock's parks and recreation department is lifting the ban on the use of fuel-driven electrical generators and outdoor grilling in all city parks.

With recent fire concerns, the city of Lubbock parks and recreation department and the Lubbock fire department want you to be safe when using grills in our city parks. Here are some safety tips to remember when grilling:

- Grills — campfires are not allowed in any city park. Use only permanent grills located in the parks or a self-contained grill.

- Pick a safe area — place the grill on a flat surface in a well-ventilated area away from overhangs, park shelters, low hanging bushes, fences and shrubbery. Keep children and pets away from the grill when in use.

- Handle charcoal carefully — use only the amount of charcoal needed. Do not overfill. Never add lighter fluid directly to hot coals since flames could travel up the fluid stream and cause an explosion. Never use gasoline or kerosene to start a fire. Use proper utensils for safe handling of food and coals.

- Putting out the fire — make sure that all charcoal is completely cool to the touch before leaving a park grill. If possible, allow the coals to burn out completely before dousing with water. For portable, self-contained grills, also insure that coals are completely cooled before transporting grill in a vehicle. Dispose of cold ashes in an appropriate receptacle. Do not throw on the ground. Do not put hot coal into park trash cans.

Don't litter! — Take care of your parks! Please pick up all trash and place it into park trash cans before you leave the area.


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An Oscar Nomination For A Day Laborer Role in "A Better Life" Brings Awareness

A few months back, we shared the trailer of a movie called *A Better Life* which depicts the struggle of a day laborer residing in the U.S. undocumented but working in the landscaping business and trying to provide his teenage son with a better future. We shared the trailer because it reminded us of the cruel reality thousands of day laborers, many of them undocumented, live everyday. Well *A Better Life* just got more attention thanks to last night's best leading actor Oscar nomination for Mexican actor Demian Bichir who is competing for the prize against George Clooney and



Brad Pitt among others. Bichir's heart-wrenching performance is testimony of the unending extent to which parents would go in order to grant their children the opportunities they lacked.

Earlier today, in an e-mail that I received from Pablo Alvarado on behalf of the National Day

Laborer Organization Network, he states that the "movie transcends the scapegoating and shows a family struggling to make it, something we all can relate to."

A Better Life was directed by Chris Weitz (also director of the *Twilight* series) in an attempt to open up the dialogue and stop the hate. Although this film will quiet

down the anti-Latino/illegal immigration talk among politicians and some of their constituents, it at least portrays day laborers in a more positive light than usual. By talking about this topic, supporting the movie and bringing awareness we help fight the stereotypes. Pa'lante.

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Detectan signos tempranos de dislexia

La actividad cerebral de los niños con riesgo de padecer dislexia se ve diferente en las resonancias magnéticas, incluso antes de que comiencen a leer, según un estudio del Hospital Infantil de Boston difundido recientemente.

El estudio, publicado en la edición electrónica de la revista especializada "Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences" (PNAS), indica que la dislexia del desarrollo afecta a más del 5 por ciento de los niños. Además, uno de cada dos niños con historia familiar de dislexia tendrán problemas con la lectura, mala ortografía y dificultad para reconocer palabras con fluidez.

Los niños con dislexia tienen problemas para reconocer y trabajar con las estructuras

subyacentes de los sonidos de las palabras y tienen dificultad para convertir los sonidos orales en lenguaje escrito.

Aunque los problemas de aprendizaje ocurren en niños muy pequeños, suelen pasar desapercibidos hasta que el niño llega a la edad escolar; por eso es importante detectarlo cuanto antes para facilitar el desarrollo intelectual del niño.

Los investigadores señalan que la dislexia del desarrollo (la que no está causada por un trauma cerebral), responde a la

intervención temprana, así el diagnóstico temprano de los niños en situación de riesgo antes

traciones en la escuela.

Para realizar la investigación, dirigida por la doctora Nora

Raschle, de los Laboratorios de Neurociencia Cognitiva del Hospital Infantil de Boston,

realizaron la resonancia magnética a 36 niños de edad preescolar, mientras realizaban actividades en la que tenían que decidir entre dos palabras que iniciaban con el mismo sonido y pronunciadas.

Durante las tareas fonológicas, los niños con un historial fa-

miliar con dislexia redujeron la actividad metabólica en ciertas regiones del cerebro (como las uniones entre los lóbulos occipital y temporal y los lóbulos temporal y parietal en la parte posterior del cerebro).

"Ya sabíamos que los niños mayores y adultos con dislexia tienen una disfunción en las mismas regiones cerebrales", señaló, Nadine Gaab, una de las investigadoras principales "lo que este estudio nos dice es que la capacidad del cerebro para procesar los sonidos del lenguaje es deficiente, incluso antes de que los niños sepan leer".

Los expertos detectaron que los niños con una activación alta en esas áreas del cerebro tuvieron mejores habilidades de lectura con la rima, distinguieron mejor las letras y los sonidos, superaron cuando dos palabras comenzaron con el mismo sonido, y fueron capaces de separar sonidos dentro de una palabra.

Sin embargo, los niños en situación de riesgo de dislexia no mostraron ningún aumento en la activación de regiones frontales del cerebro, como se ha visto en niños mayores y adultos con dislexia, lo que sugiere que estas regiones se activan sólo cuando

se les empieza a enseñar a leer.

Estudios anteriores han demostrado que los niños con dislexia a menudo tienen experiencias negativas en la escuela, son calificados como perezosos o desmotivados y su frustración puede conducir a comportamientos agresivos, impulsivos y antisociales, lo que les lleva a tener más probabilidades de abandonar la secundaria.

"Esperemos que la identificación de los niños en situación de riesgo para la dislexia en edad preescolar o incluso antes, pueda ayudar a reducir las consecuencias negativas sociales y psicológicas que estos niños a menudo se enfrentan", dijo Raschle.

La doctora señaló que a veces, aunque las familias saben que su hijo tiene dislexia desde la edad preescolar, no reciben ayuda en su escuela, por eso "si podemos demostrar que podemos identificar a estos niños temprano, las escuelas pueden ser estimuladas a desarrollar los

programas".

El proyecto es continuar haciendo seguimiento a estos niños para ver si los patrones cerebrales que observaron se confirmaron posteriormente con un diagnóstico de dislexia.

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
