A question asked by Assistant District Attorney Rebecca Baker during a recent trial has angered local Chicano leaders and some are asking for a public apology from DA Travis Ware.

The comment was made by Baker during direct examination of Ruben Cisneros, manager of The Palace. Cisneros was a State's witness in the murder trial of Vincent Balbuena.

Baker asked, "Is it customary and not unusual for Mexican American males to fight among each other, you know, whenever they have been drinking?"

"I think the comment is entirely out of line," said Steve Carrizales, president of the West Texas Mexican American Softball Association. "Sure some of us liked to have fun and drink, but we can't just make a blanket statement saying that if we drink we get into fights. I'd like to know where he got his information to make that statement. I'm sure it's

not in the Tech Law School library," said Carrizales.

County Commissioner Eliseo Solis show visible signs of anger when asked by El Editor what he thought about the comment. "Did they really ask that? How insensitive can they get? I think that our community deserves an immediate apology," stated Solis.

In a letter to the editor published in this edition, Solis said, "If the stereotypical statements are sanctioned by the official District Attorney office policy, the statements made against our community will only perpetuate the stigma of a non-caring and discriminatory Lubbock under which we have suffered for so long."

Local Chicano attorneys were also angered by the comments. Attorneys contacted by El Editor refused to give public statements but most expressed extreme displeasure and stated that the

comments brought back memories of public officials and administrators thinking that all chicanos were lazy and slept under a caustus.

Local attorneys also were upset over comments made by Ware to the Lubbock Avalanche Journal concerning the possibility of taking Attorney Albert Perez before the local grievance committee. Concerns were echoed by the local Criminal Bar Association. According to

sources, the Association has sent a letter to Ware complaining about his comments to the A-J. Sources has also told El Editor that a private apology was made by Ware to the Association.

Formal statements from various Chicano organizations are expected this coming week since many who were contacted by El Editor said that the comment made by the DA's office was scheduled to be discussed in this week's meetings.

EL ENCUENTRO DE DOS MUNDOS:

El Aniversario de El Descubrimiento de América

"Quingentésimo". Probablemente no se hallará la versión inglesa de esta palabra en el diccionario de Webster. Pero, para los hispano-americanos, es una palabra de significado especial. Designa el aniversario de los 500 años de la llegada de Cristóbal Colón, en 1492, al Nuevo Mundo.

Para los hispanos, el quingentésimo aniversario es más que la conmemoración de un viaje. Significa el nacimiento mismo de nuestra cultura.

A diferencia del Bicentenario de los Estados Unidos en 1976, este aniversario da a los hispanos una oportunidad única para examinar y celebrar el idioma, las costumbres y el legado histórico creados por la mezcla de las culturas hispana e indígena en las Américas.

Da a todos los residentes de los Estados Unidos, hispano o no, la oportunidad para descubrir los nexos que nos enlazan con la América Central, la del Sur y la comunidad del Caribe, así como a España.

Gran parte de los preparativos enormes que se refieren a las festividades del quingentésimo aniversario, a menos de seis años de distancia, están siendo compartidos por los Estados Unidos, España, Italia, México y otros países de la América Central, la del Sur y el Caribe.

Los grupos hispanos que planean festividades para el quingentésimo aniversario proporcionan un eslabón único para las gestiones internacionales. Si estos grupos, tales como la Asociación Hispana Nacional del Quingentésimo Aniversario, tienen éxito, los Estados Unidos ganarán también un conocimiento y respeto nuevos hacia los aportes de los hispanos a la historia norte-americana.

Dicha entidad (cuyas siglas en inglés son NHQA, por "National Hispanic Quincentenary Association", está formada por educadores, eruditos, organizaciones

comunitarios y comerciantes cuya meta es la de aumentar el conocimiento del quingentésimo aniversario del descubrimiento hecho por España del Nuevo Mundo, y brindar una perspectiva fresca al papel de los hispanos.

El grupo coordinador oficial estadounidense, creado por el Congreso en 1983, formada por 30 miembros, la Comisión del Quingentésimo Jubileo de Cristóbal Colón. Su presidente, John Goudie, el corredor de bienes inmuebles, es cubanoamericano, como también lo es miembro de la comisión el señor Tirso del Junco, cirujano de Los Angeles y anteriormente director del partido republicano de California. Dos puertorriqueños, estadista filántropo, Luis A. Ferré, que prestó servicio como gobernador de 1969-1972, y Jane García, presidenta del Museo del Bronx son los únicos otros miembros de la Comisión. Diez italo-americanos fueron escogidos pero ningún mexicanoamericano fue seleccionado.

"Nos preocupa mucho ese hecho," dice Raúl Yzaguirre, presidente de la NHQA, agregando que la comisión se enfoca sobre un sólo individuo, Cristóbal Colón, en vez de hacerlo sobre el efecto histórico del éxito del viaje de Colón en sí mismo, comisionado por la Reina Isabel de España, que abrió las puertas a los futuros exploradores españoles y a la creación de la cultura hispana en los Estados Unidos.

Yzaguirre y otros ven a las festividades como una forma de asegurar que se conmemore adecuadamente la llegada de la cultura hispana.

"Esperaría que hacia 1993, en todos los Estados Unidos, haya una mejor comprensión de la historia 'más temprana' de las Américas, antes de Jamestown, añade Magali Carrera, la coordinadora para investigación y planificación del quingentésimo.

HISPANIC AND THE QUINCENTENARY

Quincentennial. You won't find this word in Webster's unabridged dictionary. But for Hispanic Americans, it is one of special significance. It designates the 500th anniversary of Christopher Columbus' arrival in the New World in 1492.

For Hispanics in the New World today, the Quincentennial is more than the commemoration of a voyage. It signifies the very birth of our Indo-Hispanic culture.

Unlike the 1976 United States Bicentennial, this anniversary gives us a unique opportunity to examine and celebrate the language, customs and historical legacy created by the blending of Spanish and indigenous peoples in the Americas.

It gives all U.S. residents, Hispanic or not, a chance to discover the ties that bind us to Central and South America and the Caribbean community, as well as back to Spain.

The celebration is now less than six years away. The enormous preparation for it is being joined by the United States, Spain, Italy, Mexico and countries of the Caribbean and Latin America.

Providing a unique link for these international efforts are U.S. Hispanic groups such as the National Hispanic Quincentenary Association. This body, based in Washington, D.C., is composed of Latino scholars and business and organizational leaders.

The official U.S. coordinating group, created by Congress in 1983, is the 30-member Christopher Columbus Quincentenary Jubilee Commission. Its chairman, Miami realtor John Goudie, is Cuban American, as is member Tirso del Junto, a Los Angeles surgeon and former head of the California GOP. Two Puerto Ricans, state senator Luis Ferré, who served as the commonwealth's governor from 1969-1972, and Jane García, president of the Bronx Museum, are the only other Hispanic members. Ten Italian Americans, but no Mexican-Americans or Spanish Americans, were chosen.

Raúl Yzaguirre, who chairs the Hispanic quincentenary group, expresses his concern both about the shortage of Hispanics on the official body and on its focus on the individual, Christopher Columbus, instead of on the historical impact of the event itself.

Columbus' voyage, commissioned by Queen Isabella of Spain, opened the door for future Spanish explorers and the creation of Hispanic culture in the United States.

Yzaguirre, president of the National Council of La Raza, and other Latino leaders hope to make the 1992 celebration an event that

will build ethnic pride for Hispanics and educate others on the Hispanic role in the development of this country.

"I would hope," echoes Magali Carrera, coordinator of Quincentennial research and planning for the Smithsonian institution, "that by 1993 there is a better understanding of the earliest history of the Americas before Jamestown."

This early Spanish-American history is virtually ignored in schoolbooks which seem to jump from Columbus' discovery to the Pilgrims landing on Plymouth Rock.

Spaniards and their descendants were establishing cities and universities in North America long before the English began their journey to the New World.

Spanish was the first European language spoken in Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico and Texas. Much of the legal tradition in these states, such as community property laws and water rights, is a legacy of Spanish and Mexican law.

"Our ideal is to have the Hispanic world be more recognized in the United States," says Moraina de Semprun Donahue, president of the Academic Association for the Quincentenary, a body formed by a group of educators to create an awareness of Spain's contribution to the civilization and culture of the Americas.

Pedro de Mesones, executive director of the Foundation for the Advancement of Hispanic Americans, emphasizes the contribution of Hispanic to the early foundations of the New World and contributions to the effort of the United States Revolution.

Spaniard Jorge Farragut Mesquida was the father of the first United States admiral, David Glasgow Farragut, and Hispanics contributed manpower, weapons and money to the U.S. fight for independence, de Mesones points out.

Other groups are developing plans to produce television spots on Hispanic contributions, restore Spanish missions in the Southwest, create museum exhibitions, and produce innumerable celebrations highlighting Indo-Hispanic art and dance.

"The Quincentenary will give the United States a chance to rediscover itself," suggests Barbara Tenenbaum, of the NHQA board of directors.

Such universal knowledge hopefully will presage greater recognition and a greater role for this nation's growing Hispanic population in the approaching 21st century.

Dear Editor:

A couple weeks ago I read an article in the Avalanche-Journal about concerns of the local NAACP over the very low number of black employees working as tellers in some of our Lubbock banks. I suspect a quick look at all the banks in Lubbock would probably reveal there are very few, if any, minorities working as tellers, and even fewer employed as loan officers or serving in other management positions.

Maybe someone will send a letter to the local banks to inquire about this phenomena and, if true, request the banks immediately adopt a more enlightened hiring and promotion policy. Of course, those banks could wait until LULAC, NAACP, ACLU, Minority Law Student Association, National Lawyers Guild, Hispanic Association of Women, and other organizations investigate the facts and, if true, file a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

It certainly would be a shame to waste tax payers money on an investigation and litigation by EEOC to cure this Old South practice. If it is true, wouldn't it be cheaper and much more responsible to simply adopt an affirmative policy to cure the current problem and then try to identify those folks who have suffered and offer them reasonable restitution. Isn't that the way civilized folks should behave when they discover they have wronged someone? Isn't that better than years of litigation and outrageous legal fees?

Perhaps the editors of the A-J would be willing to visit with the bank presidents to try to convince them to correct the problem. After all, this isn't South Africa.

Austin - Recently the 70th Legislative session planned the half-way point, leaving less than 70 days for my colleagues and I to consider a number of difficult issues. attend one of the meetings. Your


comments and suggestions are
