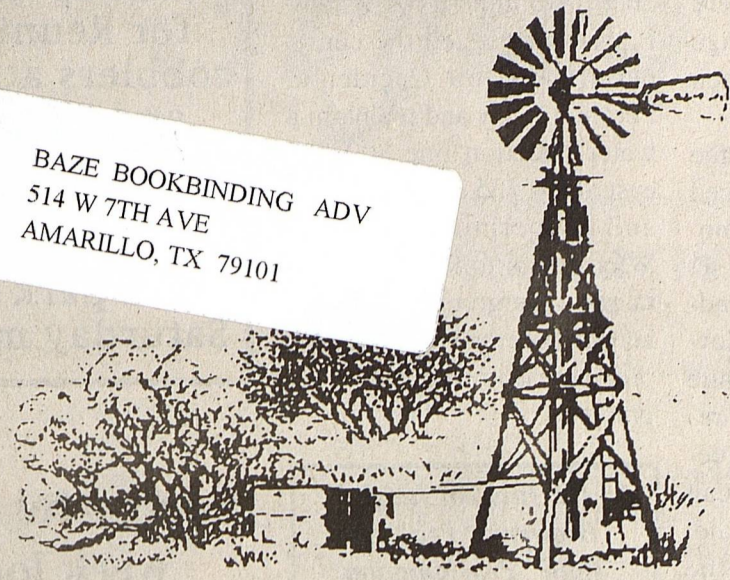

## Arlan Gentry receives National Distinguished Service Award



Arlan Gentry was recently recognized by the National Association of County Agricultural Agents at its 91st Annual Meeting and Professional Improvement Conference in Cincinnati by receiving the Association's Distinguished Service Award. The award is presented to the top two percent of the County Agents from each state with more than ten years service in the nation's Cooperative Extension Service.

The selection is made by County Agent peers in the state and endorsed by the State Extension Director. This year, eighty individuals from throughout the United States were presented the Distinguished Service Award.

The following citation statement was published in the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association program booklet:

"Arlan has served as County Extension Agent-Agriculture for 22 years. His work has been dedicated to serving the needs of local residents and producers. Arlan has provided educational programming and informational resources on cotton, peanuts, melons and other alternative crops to producers in Yoakum County. Assisting homeowners with horticulture, pest issues, bee infestations and other problems while maintaining the local 4-H program in two communities require much of his time and effort. His commitment extends to programs for all school age youth and county citizens and community service endeavors. Arlan holds degrees from Tarleton State University and Texas Tech University."

## DWI In County Court

One criminal case was heard in the July 26 issue of County Court. Dallas Brewer was presiding judge, and Criminal District Attorney Richard Clark represented the state.

Orville James Marriott pled guilty to a second DWI, blood test .19, Class A. A one year jail sentence was suspended and probated 24 months. He was fined \$750, must pay \$335 court costs, \$250 appointed attorney fees, and \$25 time payment fee. He will attend weekly AA meetings, surrender his driver license 90 days, serve 72 hours in jail with credit for one hour served, complete the DWI repeat offender program, and pay \$400 restitution to Ross Harrel. Warren New served as his attorney.

## County Mulls Rehiring Of Retirees

In the July 31 session of Commissioners Court, Health and Human Resource Directors Teresa Howard, County Hospital employees, and Freda Johnson, Yoakum County employees, addressed the court and expressed their concerns over possible serious problems with the rehiring of retired former county employees now drawing retirement benefits. They indicated current laws covering employment of retirees could signal a red flag to the Internal Revenue Service, and could have serious implications for the entire county retirement program. In prior occasions retired personnel have been rehired as full time employees, under current regulations disallowed by the IRS. Following considerable discussion by all court members, Commissioner Coston moved to accept Howard's suggested 6 month moratorium before any retiree could be considered for part time work; there could be no pre-existing agreement for future employment with a retiring employee, a retiree would have to prepare a formal letter to file indicating there was no agreement for their return to work for the county, and future part time employment would be limited to a 29 day period. Further discussion indicated the court's interest in

## Farm Bureau responds to WTO trade failures

After months of negotiations in the World Trade Organization's (WTO) Doha Round came to a close without resolution, Farm Bureau leaders stepped forward urging lawmakers to extend provisions of the current farm bill.

Texas Farm Bureau President Kenneth Dierschke and American Farm Bureau Federation Pres. Bob Stallman, both Texas producers, held telephone conferences July 27 to voice their support for a farm bill extension, saying failure to do so would result in the United States losing its bargaining power against other countries in later WTO talks.

"With the suspension of the Doha Round of WTO talks on agriculture, Texas farmers and ranchers firmly believe Congress should extend the current

Farm Bill for at least another year," Dierschke said. "With minor adjustments to comply with recent WTO rulings, such a bill would give US producers a firm footing dealing with unfair trade practices in world markets."

Stallman explained any concessions the U.S. makes outside the negotiating room is fruitless at this point. If Congress chose to drop farm price supports in U.S. farm policy, it's not something the rest of the world would accept as a negotiating factor when they resume trade talks at a later date. "We simply wouldn't be credited for what we had already done," Stallman said.

"If the farm bill is changed now without concessions from

the Europeans and others, we will be at a severe disadvantage when negotiations resume," Dierschkie said. The TFB president said it's likely the U.S. will have to change the Farm Bill anyway when negotiations are complete.

In addition to extending the Farm Bill both leaders urged renewal of the Trade Promotion Authority Act, which is set to expire July 2007. "Extending this authority will allow President Bush to continue negotiating regional and regional bilateral trade agreements benefiting American agriculture," Dierschkie said. Such agreements allow the U.S. to broker trade deals with other nations along the Pacific Rim, strong buyers of ag goods. "Texas Farm Bureau encourages members of the House Ag Committee and both party leaders toward extension of our current farm law."

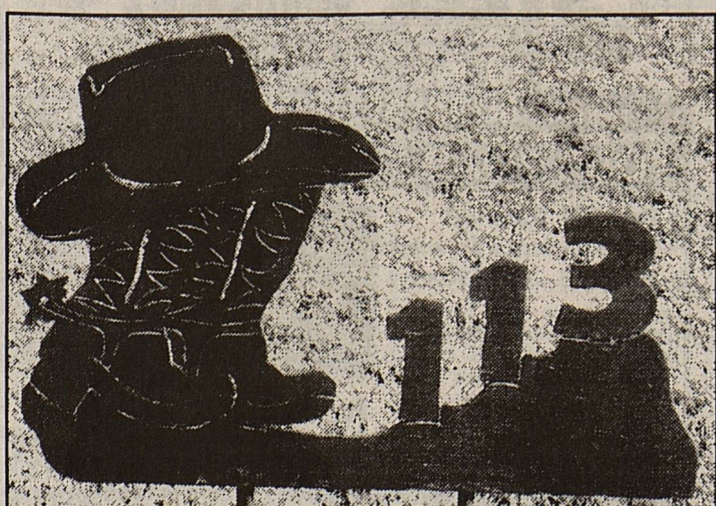
Pray for our country, our soldiers and the Middle East situation. All involved need our prayers and onky God can get us through this terrible situation.. And Pray For Rain!

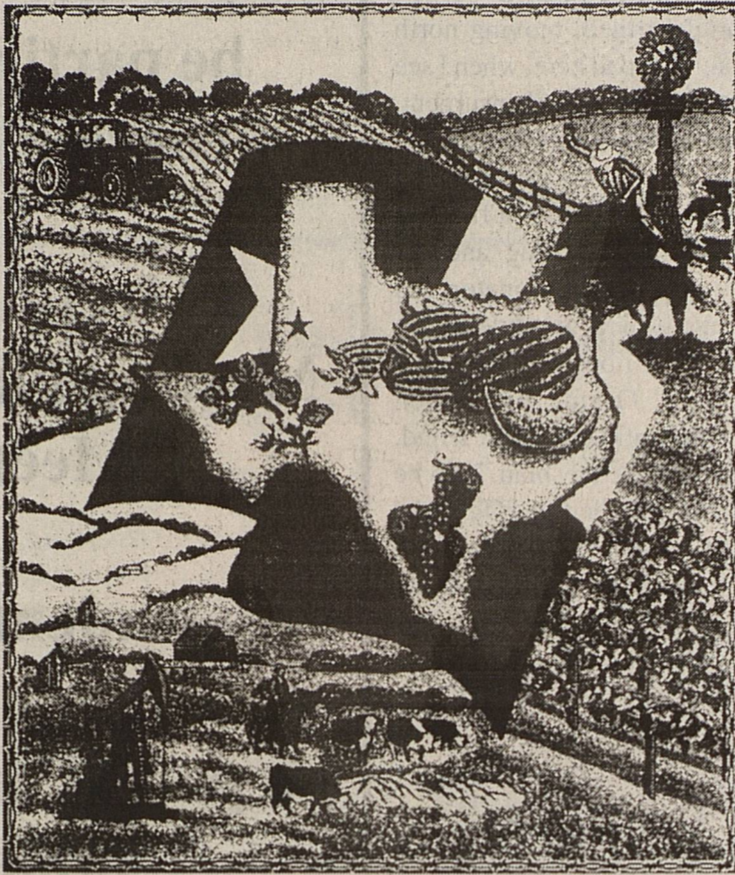

## Diabetes facts, figures

Diabetes is a serious illness, but the good news is, it doesn't have to be life threatening. Early diagnosis and treatment, and good management practices are keys to a long and healthy life for persons with diabetes.

According to the American Diabetes Association, when a person has diabetes, his or her body doesn't produce insulin (type 1) or properly use insulin (type2), a hormone needed to convert some foods into energy. No one knows what causes diabetes, though genetics and lack of exercise and obesity may contribute. The ADA list about 17 million Americans with diabetes, with only 11.1 million diagnosed - nearly 6 million people don't know they have diabetes.

A simple blood test is required for a diagnosis of diabetes but being aware of the symptoms can lead to an earlier diagnosis. Some symptoms include frequent urination, excessive thirst and hunger, blurry vision, fatigue, and unexplained weight loss. With medical diagnosis, treatment and management can make a healthier life. 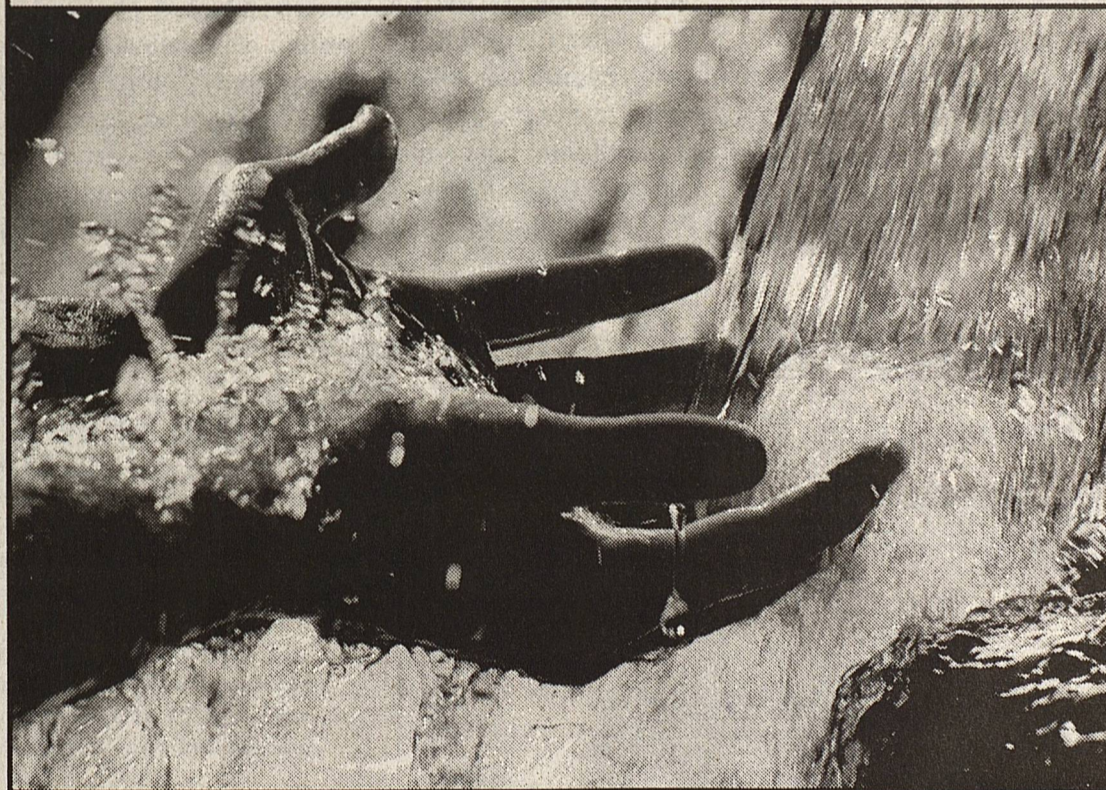

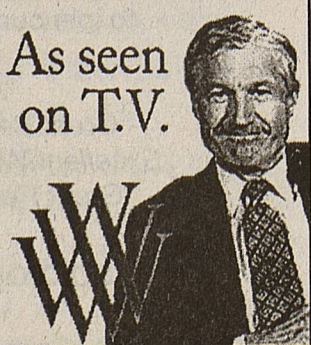

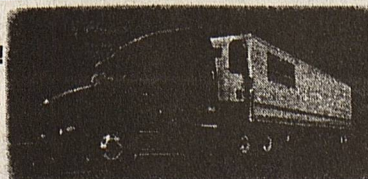
