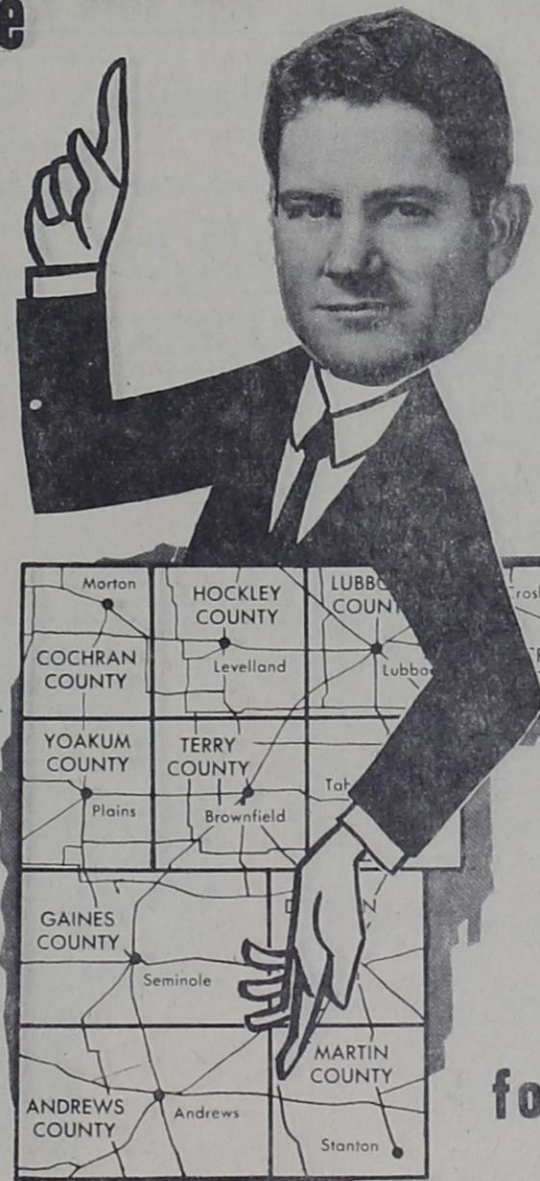

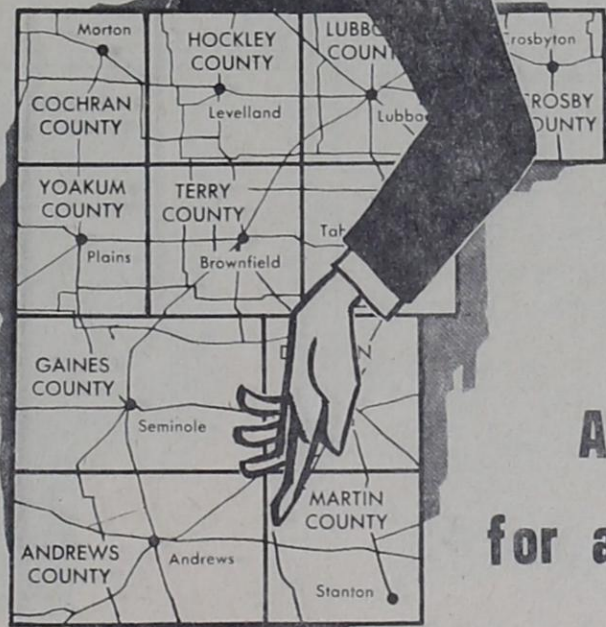

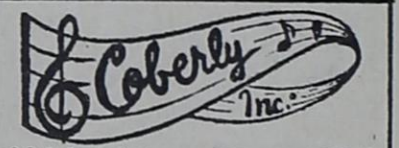


No. 1-Happy to discover the world

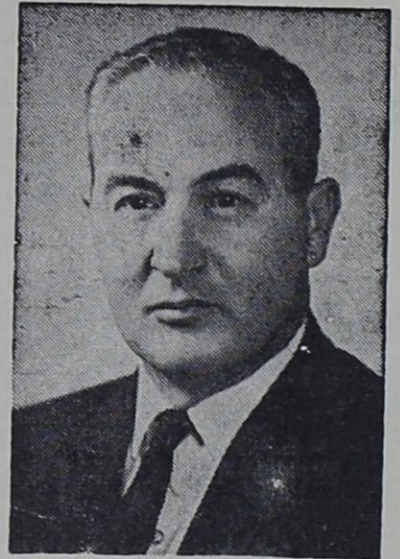

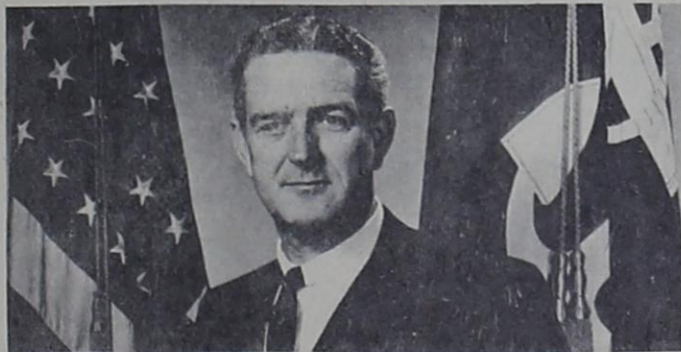
