Three Negroes Graduate Here In Nursing



For twelve months the ladies in white (above) have worked hard to be a member of this congratulatory line. They are being congratulated by

many Lubbockites. There were 23 young ladies who received their diplomas from the Methodist Hospital Nursing School.

Three of the 23 ladies were Negroes. They are Minnie Mitchell, Flossie Davis, and Barbara Smith. Miss Mitchell and Davis

are graduates of Dunbar Jr-Sr High School, Lubbock, Texas. Miss Smith is a graduate of Blacksheare High School at Hearne, Texas.

Two City Negroes Added To Police Department

Two Negroes have been added to the Lubbock Police Department. They are J.W. Mayes of 3510 Yucca and William H. Britt of 2802 Juniper.

These men have been in training for one month prior to their assignment to the Police Department.

According to Assistant Chief of Police Blakney the police department has been looking for Negroes who are capable of becoming policeman. The door is still open to young men who desire to become policeman.

Country Club Employs Negro

The first Negro in Lubbock to receive a position at the Lubbock Country Club as a Matronia is Theodore T. Smith of Waco, Texas, son of Mrs. E. B. Henderson.

He is a graduate of the A.S. Moore High School, and a 1958 graduate of Paul Quinn College. After completing his under graduate work he played one year of pro-football with the Dallas Texans.

Smith is happily married to Mrs. E.J. Smith also of Waco. The Smiths reside at 1001 East 28th Street in Lubbock.

BISHOP COLLEGE APPOINTMENTS RISE

Alumni of Dallas' Bishop College have furnished three of the five Negroes appointed to State posts in Texas by Governor Connally since his incumbency, according to Dr. Milton K. Curry, Jr., President of Bishop.

From the Bishop class of 1944 is Reverend Marvin Griffin, Pastor of the New Hope Baptist Church in Waco, who was appointed by the Governor to the Board of Regents of Texas Southern University, replacing Mr. Mack Hannah, Jr., of Houston, who had served as chairman of the board for a full decade.

ABishopite now living in Ft. Worth, Reverend C. Adair Holliday, who is Pastor of St. James Baptist Church in that city, was named to the State Board of Corrections. Reverend Holliday is a Bishop graduate of 1948.

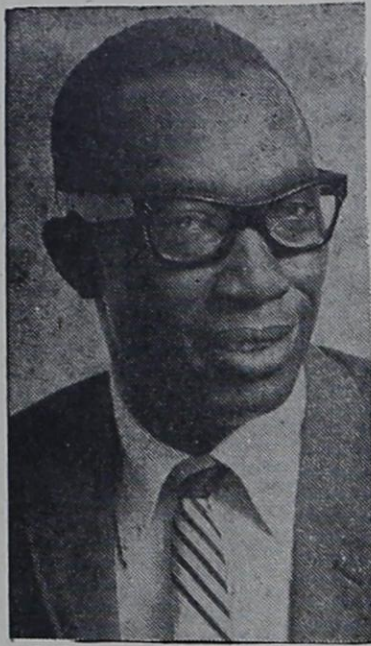
