Last week a problem derived to the point where funds were needed to complete the burial of one of our Lubbock residents, Mrs. Willie Mae Herby.

It was an act of a "good fellow" for those who had the opportunity to contribute to such a needed benevolence. Mrs. Herby, mother of nine children, was killed several days ago.

People residing in the Manhattan Heights area and hundreds of friends, relations and associates in Lubbock are deeply saddened by the death of Mr. Robert E. Moore.

His death on Sunday morning, January 3, 1965, five miles north of Abernathy, Texas, about twenty miles from home is felt as a tragic loss by the many people who knew him.

Mr. Moore died immediately after the car he was driving ran into a curbing and overturned several times before falling to earth.

In his active lifetime, Mr. Moore worked zealously with the Lubbock District of Atlanta Life Insurance Company, where he has been employed for the last ten years. He served as a dedicated debit manager for several years, and last week he was promoted to the position of supervisor.

He worked earnestly in many ways showing people the necessity of having a good insurance program.

Services were held for Mr. Moore Wednesday, at Bethel A.M.E. Church with Reverend A.W. Wilson officiating.

Mr. Moore is survived by his wife, Mary Lois, and four children.

mor was cancerous. But a spokesman at Santa Monica Hospital pointed out "occasionally Cobalt is used for other than cancer."

A hospital spokesman said doctors believed Cole could leave the hospital in about ten days and return for treatment every other week. However, the velvet-voiced singer was advised to cancel all professional engagements for the next few months "to allow for full recuperation."

The hospital announcement said doctors hoped to reduce the size of the tumor through Cobalt treatments.

Cole, whose records sell more than seven million copies each year, collapsed during a Las Vegas, Nevada, nightclub appearance and he originally was suffering from exhaustion and a virus.

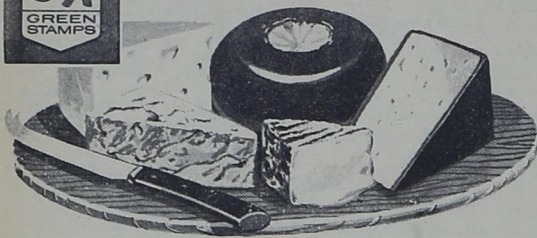
